MORE CHAOS This week the country has yet again been reduced to a situation of near chaos as the postal workers took strike action which resulted in the closure of post offices all over the republic.

The strike is one which affects everyone in, private and in business as it has disrupted the entire system of communication so essential to the normal pattern of life.

There can be no doubt but that we seem to be intent on giving ourselves the kiss of death and it is difficult to understand how, having improved our general standards of living so much that we still have found no solution to these labour disputes which injure everyone so enormously.

As in all cases where strikes throw essential public services out of gear the current situation is one which is causing suffering and loss to everyone.

COULDN'T AFFORD HEATED POOL The pipe dreams of members of Dungarvan Urban Council to build a heated swimming pool in the town have faded in the light of the knowledge that it would literally, take a crock of gold not only to build but to maintain such a facility.

When the idea was first thought up some years ago in conjunction with a plan to develop an all purpose sports complex at the Council's site at Quann's—estimated to cost several hundred thousand pounds—it appeared to be the real thing.

There was a certain amount of euphoria at the time and some Councilors thought that all that was required to secure the necessary support was a public meeting at which it was thought people would be tripping over one another with their contributions.

It was during this time and even before it that the old swimming pool was allowed to take a dive. Very little was done to maintain it as visions were bright then that the heated pool in the new complex would render

and out of fashion. As the years passed its condition became worse and worse and the last official report on it stated that it was "in an advanced stage of structural decay" and unfit to be repaired.

Perhaps if the same attitude had been adopted towards the old swimming pool it would not now be in the advanced stage of structural decay which it is declared to be.

The Council members hung on to the idea of a heated pool until very recently—last month, in fact when they dropped it like a hot potato because of the costs involved.

On the basis that a heated pool in Dungarvan would cost £200,000 (in accordance with figures from the other urban areas) and that a grant of £160,000 would be available against a local contribution of £40,000 the estimated running costs and receipts showed that an annual running loss of £15,000 could be expected.

Incidentally in his report to the Council at their estimates meeting last month, the County Manager stated "A sum of £1,572 has been included (in the estimates) for the continuation of the repair of the swimming pool and employment of a caretaker during the summer season. This shows a decrease of £2,342 to coincide with the Council's wishes of spending the minimum amount of money on repairs."

The huge amounts to be levied from the County rates to pay for claims awarded by the Courts under the Malicious Injury Act were referred to at the annual estimates meeting of the County Council held recently.

SPONGE DIPPED IN VINEGAR

Mr Pierce Casey Chairman, Waterford County Executive I.F.A. at the opening of a course for Farm Relief Operators or agricultural sector sponsored by the County Committee of Agriculture at the County Agricultural Offices in Dungarvan last Monday said that since Ireland became a member of the E.E.C. agriculture has had an opportunity to develop, with which it was never previously presented. Not surprisingly it had responded to this opportunity in a very positive manner. In accepting the responsibility placed on them farmers had worked to the benefit of the whole community. There was an atmosphere of enterprise and development in agriculture which offered more prospects for development than any other sector of the economy was a major contributor to the job creation and unemployment of our young population.

'Against this background' said Mr Casey the government has decided to introduce a levy on all agricultural produce in order to finance a very unique initiative that it requires that people without a taxable income should pay tax. Development in agriculture is what is needed but if this levy is implemented it will be a very regressive tax which will put a total halt to further farm development. At a time when the country is depending so much on agriculture the agricultural sector has been handed a sponge dipped in vinegar.

Mr Casey added that agriculture would not fail to contribute its fair share towards the nation's development. It was better ways of doing this than by means of a badly thought out sales tax. 'The government must meet with the farming organizations in February and work out once and for all a fair and just system of taxation and at the same time show that it recognises the important role agriculture has to play in the future of the economy.'

Two More Councillors For Foreign Conferences

Hot on the heels of the decision of Waterford County Council to send a delegation to a planning conference to be held in Gothenburg Sweden from May 14 to 20 came a similar decision by Dungarvan Urban Council. At its last Monday night they decided to send one member to the same conference.

The matter was not on the agenda but it was introduced by County Manager Mr C O'Connor who said that while the invitation to attend the conference had been sent only to Co Councillors he did not think that the Council should be excluded from sending delegates if they wished to do so. He said that the County Council had approved the sending of 3 members at a cost of £228 per member.

Mr D Goode at once proposed that the Vice-Chairman Mr John A. Murphy be selected to attend and this was seconded by Mr Wade and approved with Mr T. Kyne dissenting.

At this point the Town Clerk Mr B. White said that an invitation had also been received from the Urban Council for the trip to Europe 3-day conference on Pollution in Aachen (West Germany) in April.

Deputy A. Deasy proposed that Mr Wade be sent to this conference and this was seconded by Clr R. Walsh.

Mr Goode then proposed that the Chairman Mr P. Whelan be their choice to attend but Mr Wade at once moved a motion to point out that the South East Regional Development Organisation (SERDO) of which he was a member had recommended that Mr Whelan should attend the Urban Council for the trip. The Council can send as many members as they wish said Mr Wade 'but in view of the recommendation from SERDO I feel I should be one of them.'

Mr J. A. Murphy said that as far as the Council was concerned such a recommendation carried no weight and it was a matter for their own decision.

Mr Whelan then said that he would have to withdraw his name as he would not have the time to attend and Mr Wade's appointment was then approved with Mr Kyne again dissenting on the grounds that as at the County Council meeting he opposed sending delegates to such conferences at the expense of the local ratepayers.

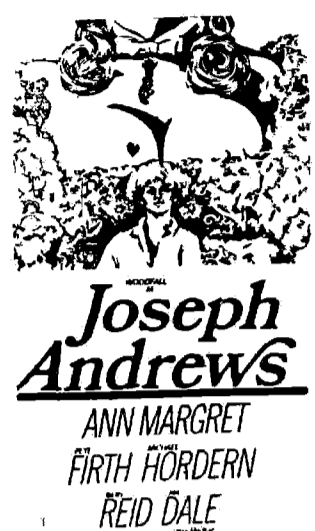
