A NEW SYSTEM of fully pay-related social insurance contributions will commence on 6 April, 1979. The new contributions will be known as Pay-Related **Social Insurance Contributions** (PRSI contributions) and will consist of a single payment of contributions in respect of:

Social Insurance

Occupational Injuries

Redundancy

WHAT ELSE IS NEW?

Men and women will pay the same rate

Agricultural and domestic workers will pay the ordinary rate of contribution Employees will not have to pay the Redundancy portion of the contribution.

Where there is more than one employment at a time, PRSI contributions will be deducted separately from the amounts earned in each employment If there is an overpayment of contributions, a refund will be made to the employee at the end of the year Special arrangements apply to persons employed in a permanent and pensionable capacity in the public sector who have more than one employment. Employers will keep a record of each , employee's weeks of insurable

PAYE taxpayers who are not insurable for social welfare purposes but who are liable for the Health contribution, will pay that contribution through the PAYE system.

Higher limit for benefits. In future, pay-related benefit will be calculated on weekly earnings between £14 and £110.

RATES OF CONTRIBUTION

Health

Most people in industrial, agricultural, domestic, commercial and service type employments will pay the ordinary rate This will be known as the Class A rate and will be broken down into the following sections

(where the Health portion of the contribution is payable by the employee) Employer Employee Total 13.15%

INFORMATION ON ALL CLASSES AND THE RATES PAYABLE WILL BE ANNOUNCED SHORTLY.

HOW IS IT COLLECTED?

Contributions will be collected through the PAYE system, whether or not income tax is deductible from the employees' earnings, except in a small number of categories (see below)

Information on collection arrangements may be obtained from the Revenue Commissioners, P 35 Section, Teach Earlsfort, Hatch Street, Dublin 2. (Telephone 783499, exts 442 and 443).

SPECIAL CATEGORIES

Payment of contributions for employees who fall within the following categories will be made direct to the Department of Social Welfare with the exception of the Health portion Where this is payable it will be collected by the Revenue Commissioners

- 1. Insurable employees of accredited foreign embassies and diplomatic
- 2. Those paid from outside the State whose employer does not operate the Irish PAYE system.
- 3. Certain Ministers of Religion.
- 4. Persons whose liability to income tax is dealt with otherwise than through · PAYE and whose employer holds an exclusion certificate from the Revenue Commissioners 5. Persons seconded to employment

outside the State but still insured under the Social Welfare Acts

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTORS

Voluntary contributors will be included in the new system and will be advised individually on the rate of contribution and method of collection

PRSI contributions will be payable at the appropriate percentage rates (see below) on the amount of earnings up to a ceiling of £5,500 in respect of employments insurable for Social Welfare purposes. The earnings are those assessable to income tax i.e. gross earnings less allowable superannuation contributions. The new system will replace the existing:

flat-rate insurance stamps

3% pay-related contribution

Wet-time stamping is not affected by the new arrangements.

SAME TAX NUMBER-BRAND NEW NAME

Your existing income tax serial number will be used for the new PRSI contributions It will be re-named the Revenue and Social Insurance Number (RSI No)

Be sure your employer knows your RSI number before April 6

TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENT

Where any earnings are paid to an employee on or after 6 April 1979 for a period of employment before that date, the new PRSI contribution must be paid on the amount of those earnings in a situation of this nature an insurance card should not be stamped in respect of the period of employment in question unless the employee was previously paid other earnings prior to 6 April for the same period, in which case the insurance card should have been stamped in the normal

If the insurance card should not be stamped for the period of employment prior to 6 April (as explained above), the relevant spaces on the insurance card should be marked with the letter "E" and endorsed with the Company stamp or with the employer's initials or signature
