PAYE 1979/80 PRSI

THE NEW PAYE/PRSI SYSTEM COMES INTO OPERATION ON FRIDAY 6 APRIL



1 IMPORTANT NOTICE to Employers who have not received the usual documents required for the operation of PAYE/PRSI deductions for the year commencing on 6 April, 1979.

The Revenue Commissioners regret the inconvenience caused through inability in the present circumstances to deliver these documents. Pending delivery the procedures to be followed are set out below

TAX-FREE ALLOWANCES
For persons in continuing employment on 6 April, 1979, employers who use tax deduction cards should operate PAYE on the basis of the tax-free allowances set out on the most recently issued tax deduction card for the year 1978/79 and where such a tax deduction card is not held, the emergency procedure should be operated. Employers who use an approved alternative system to tax deduction cards should operate PAYE on the basis of the most recently issued tax-free allowance certificate for the year 1978/79 and where such a certificate is not held, the emergency procedure should be operated

Information regarding the emergency procedure was set out in the notice to employers (emergency basis of tax deduction) issued in January, 1979.

For persons who commence or resume employment on or after 6 April, 1979, all employers should operate PAYE on the basis of the employee's form P45 or certificate of tax-free allowances. Otherwise, the emergency procedure should be operated.

So that they may be in a position to complete 1979/80 tax deduction cards when these become available, employers who use tax deduction cards should keep a record for each employee with effect from 6 April, 1979 onwards on the basis of the sample copy of the new tax deduction card which was issued to them with an explanatory notice at the end of January, 1979. The essential details to be recorded are reproduced at the foot of this notice.

Employers in the building industry in Dublin and Cork should, if necessary, refer to their PAYE tax districts for instructions

TAX TABLES
The appropriate tax tables at present in use—Table A (1978/79), Table B (1977/78) and Table C (1977/78)—should continue to be used until the new tax tables for 1979/80 have been received by employers.

PAY-RELATED SOCIAL INSURANCE (PRSI)
The vast majority of employees—men and women—are insurable at standard class rate, called Class A1. These include persons in industrial, commercial and service-type employment, male and female agricultural workers; domestics, whole-time share fishermen whether employed under a contract of service or not, out-worker male weavers employed under a contract of service, seamen who are EEC nationals employed aboard ships flying the Irish flag and engaged on home trade.
Class A1 rate is 13.15% (employee's portion 4.4% and employer's portion 8.75%).
Details of all contribution classes and rates were published recently in the daily newspapers by the Department of Social Welfare
Employers who use tax deduction cards should, pending receipt of the cards for 1979/80, record the essential details of PRSI contributions in the same manner as PAYE—see the foot of this notice.

2 IMPORTANT NOTICE to Employees
The Revenue Commissioners regret the inconvenience caused to employees by the delay in present circumstances in issuing to them notices and certificates of tax-free allowances for the year 1979/80. When these are issued in due course, employers will make any necessary PAYE adjustments

PRISONER'S WIFE'S ALLOWANCES
This allowance at present finishes as soon as a prisoner is
released from prison In future it will continue to be paid for four
weeks after release as a help towards reducing financial strain
on the family during that period

MEANS TEST CHANGES
The MEANS TEST is being modified
The amount of income from certain sources which is disregarded
when assessing a person's means is being increased

MATERNITY ALLOWANCE
This allowance will in future be paid for a minimum of 12 weeks,
thus ensuring that the early birth of a child cannot reduce the amount
to be paid.

FREE TELEPHONE RENTAL ALLOWANCE
Free telephone rental will be available to social welfare pensioners
over age 66 where the only other person residing in the household
is permanently incapacitated At present this scheme applies only to
pensioners over age 66 who live alone.

EXTENSION OF FREE TRAVEL SCHEME
Free travel, which at present is available to blind persons over 21,
is being extended to blind persons aged between 18 and 21 who are
attending a special workshop or training

NEW UPPER AGE LIMIT ABOLISHED
The upper age limit of 66 years for non-contributory
Widow's Pension, Deserted Wife's Allowance, Prisoner's Wife's
Allowance and Unmarried Mother's Allowance is being abolished

Due to interruption of postal services, payment of the
increases may, in certain cases, be delayed Any balance due
will be paid retrospectively as soon as normal services
are restored
