





Imposition of Excise Duty LIVE CATTLE AND FRESH MILK to operate from 1st May, 1979

An excise duty at a rate of 2% of the value of the produce operates on and from 1st May, 1979 until 31st December, 1979 on —

- (a) Cattle slaughtered or exported
- (b) Fresh milk received or exported

The Revenue Commissioners have made Regulations to provide for securing and collecting the duty

SCOPE OF DUTY.

CATTLE The duty is chargeable on all cattle slaughtered in or exported live from the State. The duty is not chargeable on reactors or cattle shown to have been in the State for less than 14 days

MILK The duty is chargeable on all fresh milk received at any premises for processing there or for transmission to another premises for processing or exported from the State. The duty is not chargeable on the first 5 000 gallons of fresh milk received or exported from any farm holding which has been produced at that farm holding

Duty is payable to the Revenue Commissioners by the proprietor of any premises at which cattle are slaughtered or fresh milk is received for processing or for transmission for processing or by the exporter However, the proprietor is entitled to withhold from the amount to be paid by him to the seller of the cattle or fresh mlk a sum equal to the amount of the duty Where the proprietor is not purchasing the cattle or the fresh milk, but is rendering a service which causes payment of duty, he is entitled to recover from the owner a sum equal to the amount of duty. The exporter is likewise entitled to deduct an amount equal to the duty payable

LICENSING OF PREMISES

Every proprietor carrying on the business of slaughtering cattle or receiving fresh milk for processing or for transmission for processing at any premises must hold a licence issued by the Revenue Commissioners

The cattle or fresh milk must be entered on Form Cu 29A and the value and duty chargeable must be declared on that form. The duty must be paid or secured before exportation INFORMATION.
