ELECTION WEEK

This coming week is the last before the Local and European elections which are due to take place on Thursday of next week, June 7. By and large there has been no great activity evident among the political parties apart from the canvassing campaign and media advertising being carried on by each group and even here the parties do not appear to be working as teams as there are several cases of what has come to be known as one upman-ship where canvassing is concerned. This, to one extent or another has always been part of the political game, but in recent elections candidates who have moved as part of a party panel have found to their cost in the end that they have been left somewhat behind. It is the candidate who goes out after every single vote who will be among the winners in the final count.

Politics, even at local level, is a tough game to play and to be a success one has to play tough, have loads of stamina and of course a good turn of phrase to convince the electorate that he or she is that little better for the job than the others in the race. Where the local elections are concerned the voters have no great problems in reaching the choices they will make. Party affiliations are of course the major deciding factor but local personality appeal also plays a big part. It is quite common for voters to cross party lines when marking their ballot papers because of the latter reason. It has happened regularly in the past and will happen again in next week's election.

As I say voters have no great problems when it comes to voting for the local Councils County Urban or Town Commissioners. They know exactly what these things are all about. However the position in regard to the European Parliament election is a vastly different kettle of fish. Very few people know what the game at this level is all about and consequently they have shown general apathy to it. Apart from the candidates and the political parties there has been very little interest shown in this election and it is difficult to blame the general public for this attitude.

The administration of the European Economic Community is a most complex business and even those of us who have had a cursory glance at first hand of what goes on in Brussels and Luxembourg have been more confused than enlightened by what we have seen. To all intents and purposes the European Parliament is merely a house of talk with no powers. The power rests with the Commission and it is in this area that all the decisions are made. But as the Kerryman said when he was asked what he knew about the Euro Parliament or the Euro elections I haven't a clue. And that about sums up the situation generally. For that reason I can only see the voters who vote in this election next Thursday following traditional party lines in the hope that in doing so they are doing the correct thing.

The simultaneous holding of the two elections on next Thursday is also bound to cause a great deal of confusion as in some areas such as where Urban and Commissioner elections are going on side by side with the County and Euro elections voters will have to handle the marking of three different ballot papers.

However such elections as these are the exercises which mark democratic administration and people should be conscious of this fact and for that reason they should come out on Thursday next and cast their votes. It is the only way in which they can have a say and to show whether they are satisfied or otherwise with the way things are being run.

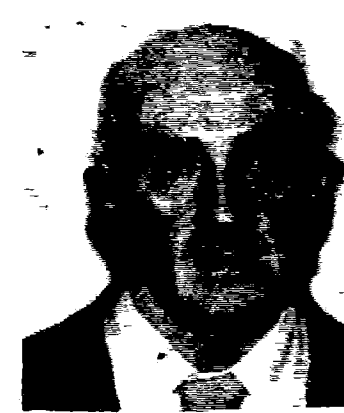

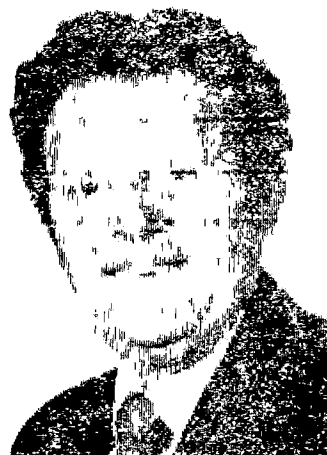

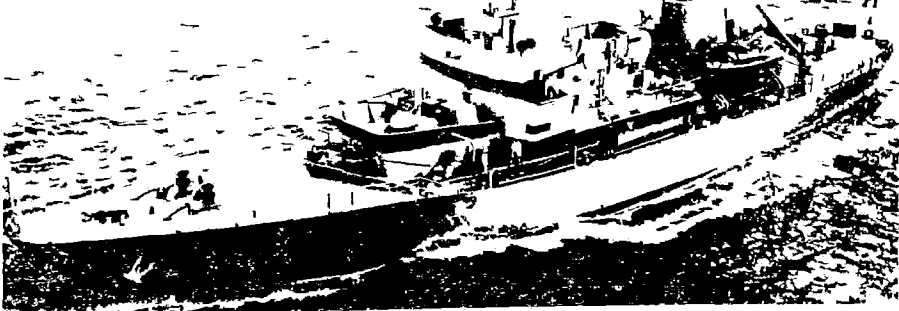
