Garda H O'Leary in evidence said that he was driving a official car at the New Lane at 1.10 a.m. on February 23. It came against him which he failed to dip and he turned and followed it into Sexton Street. At the corner of the car which it was going left into the Street but a van was coming out of the street and the car had to stop.

Justice said he then got out of the Garda car and went towards the other car which the reversed and struck the van car in the street. He said that he approached the driver who admitted that he had been reversing as the car could not back because the rear window was fogged up.

Imposing that fine the District Justice said that in the past he had disallowed defendants for failing to dip but would not do so on this occasion.

Big Election Reverses For Government In Local And Euro Contests

County Council Elections

Dungarvan Area

The swing away from Fianna Fail reflected first in the Dungarvan Urban election was maintained in the County Council elections and in the Dungarvan area Deputy Austin Deasy (FG) held his poll-topping position with a whopping 2,117 votes against the highest overall first preference vote in the entire county.

The government party contrary to pre-election forecasts lost one seat here with the unexpected defeat of the outgoing Vice-Chairman of the Council Mr. Sean Whelan (Lab.) by the new councillor Mr. Gerry O'Brien (FG) the popular Kilmolash Cappoquin farmer.

A feature of the election in this area was the fine showing of the young University student Garry O'Halloran of Clashmore who polled 402 first preference votes for Fine Gael and remained in contention up to the 5th count when he was eliminated with 604 votes.

The bulk of the distribution of Deasy's surplus of 1,229 votes went to his Fine Gael colleagues but local Dungarvan men Kyne Goode and Wade also picked up considerable bundles of votes in the process as can be seen from the transfers which left the second count as follows: Condon (-7) 44 Curran (+38) 47 Goode (+134) 820 Hart (+300) 808 Kennelly (+390) 679, Kyne (+196) 603 O'Brien (+126) 807 O'Halloran (+176) 578 Wade (+126) 386 Whelan P (+47) 372 Whelan S (+49) 565 Condon was eliminated after this count and Whelan P went after the 3rd count Wade went out in the 4th count and O'Halloran in the 5th. With the transfers of the latter's 604 votes, Hart with 1,035 votes and O'Brien with 1,026 were both declared elected on the 6th count.

Hart's surplus was next distributed in the 7th count and O'Brien's in the 8th and thus saw Kyne elected with 906 votes and Curran elected with 901 votes.

This left three FF candidates for the remaining 2 seats: Goode at 773 Kennelly at 754 and Sean Whelan at 686.

The Returning Officer Mr. Brian McNulty then elected Whelan and declared Goode and Kennelly both elected without reaching the quota.

Lismore Area

A feature of the election in this area was the performance by Fine Gael candidate Willie McDonnell the well-known farmer and business man of Convent Street, Tallow, who showed his popularity by heading the poll with a huge vote of 923 votes, one of the highest ever recorded in the area.

There was jubilation among the Fine Gael supporters when McDonnell was declared elected in the first count with a surplus and when this was followed with the 4th count election of the second Fine Gael candidate James Aidan Walsh of Springfield Cappoquin there were shouts of 'they're paying for poor Norman now' a reference prompted by the memories of the bitter inter-labour feud which followed the decision of Fianna Fail to take the seat of the late Norman Walsh brother of James Aidan following Norman's lamented death early last year.

Fianna Fail suffered their greatest reverse within the county in this area when they lost two seats by the defeat of outgoing Councillors Jack Cullinane Glenribben Lismore and Declan Ahearn Ballyphilip Knockanore.

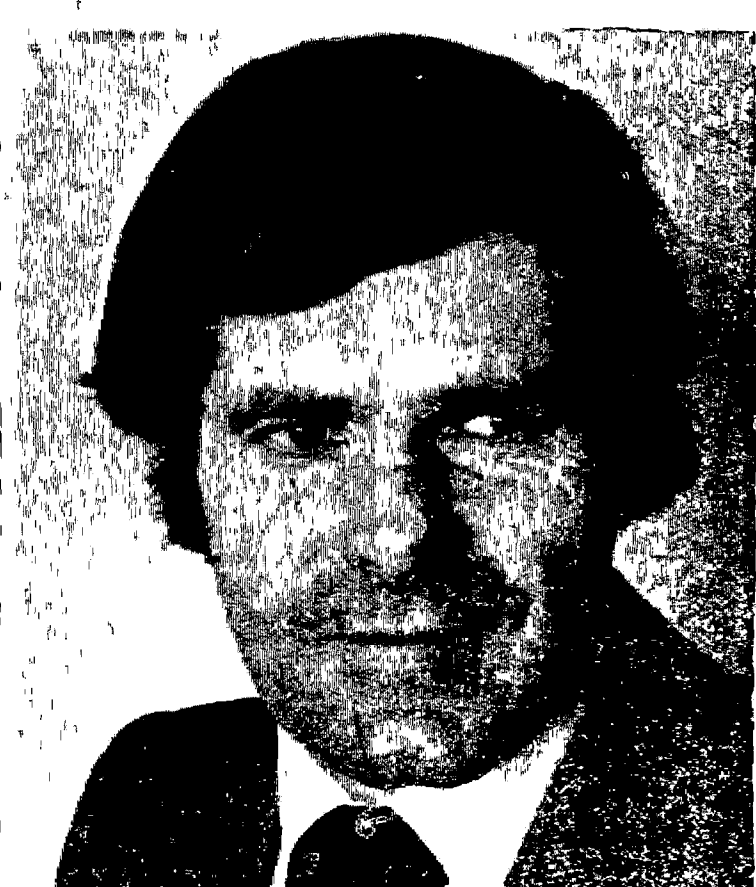

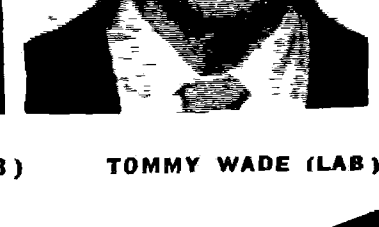
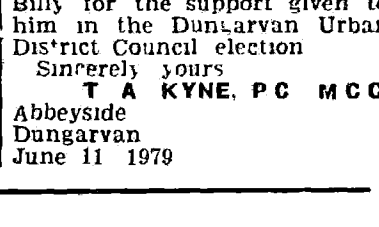
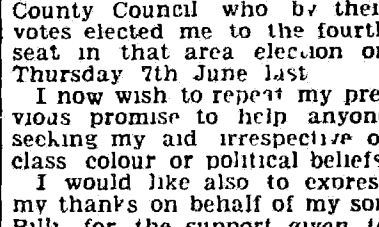
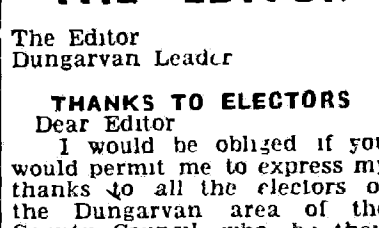
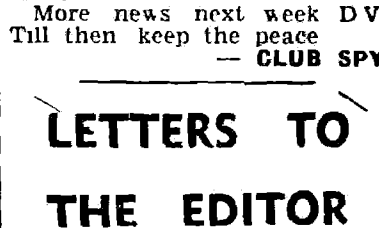
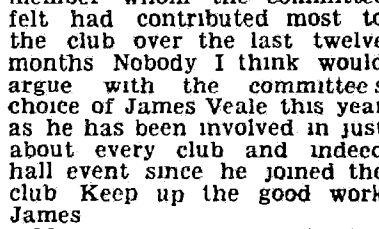
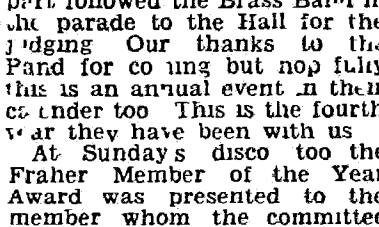
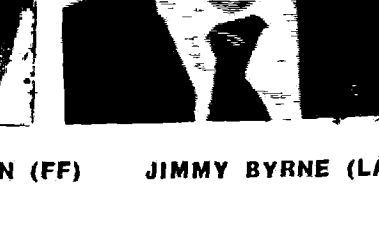
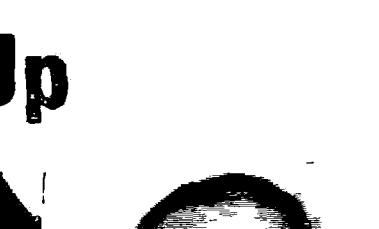
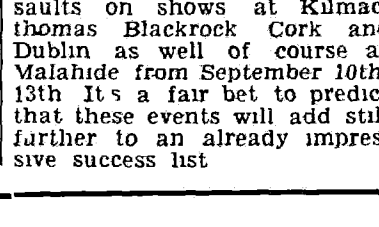
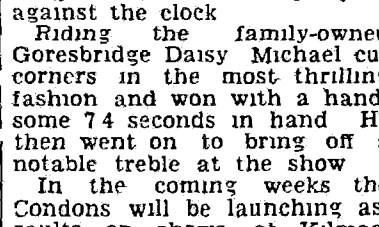
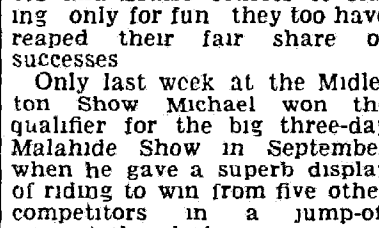
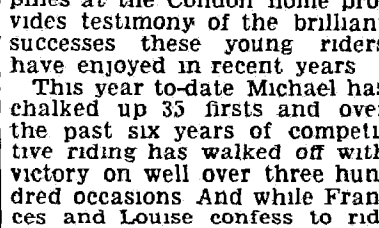
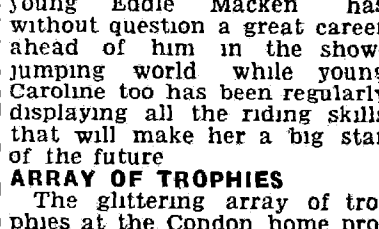
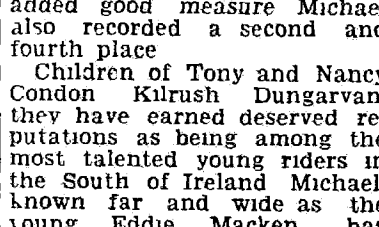
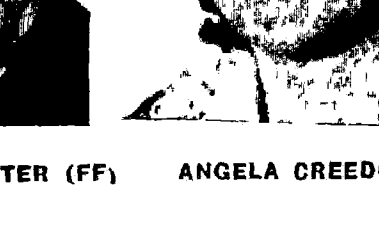
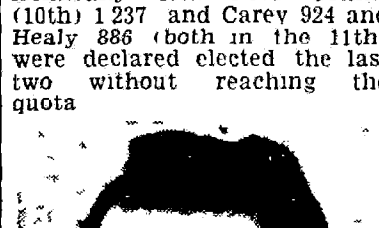
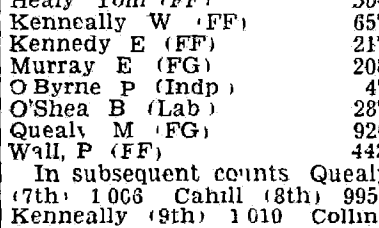
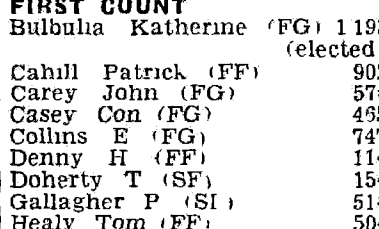
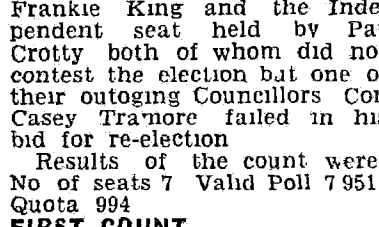
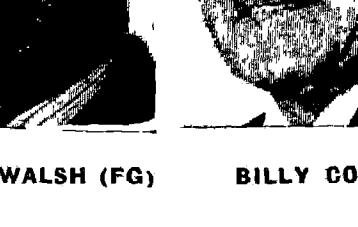
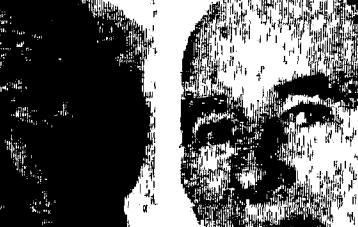
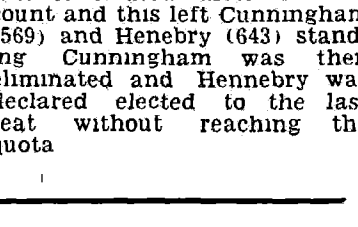
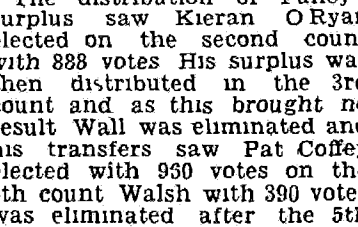
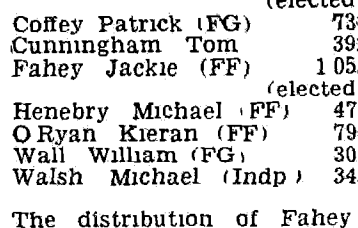
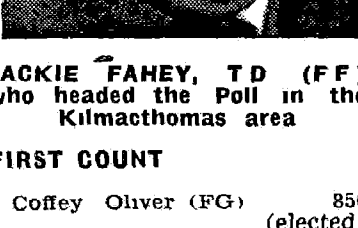
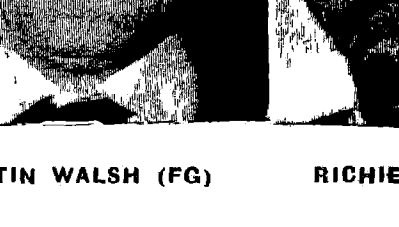
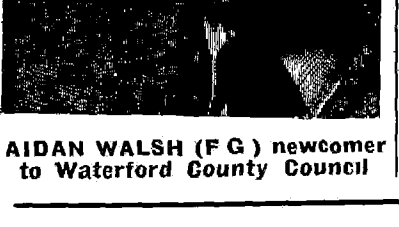
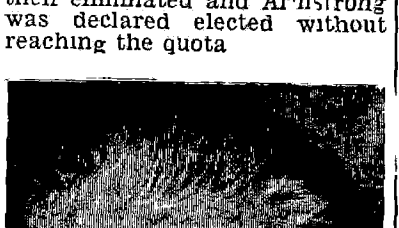
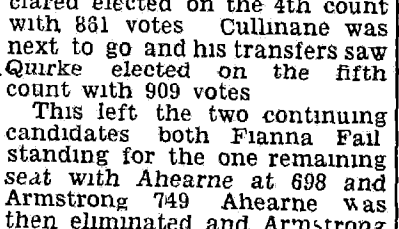
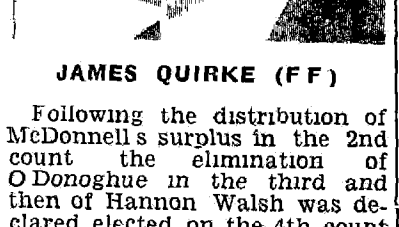
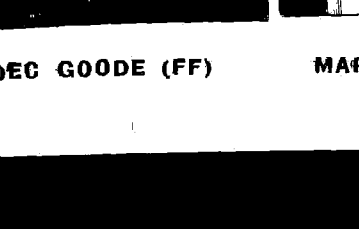
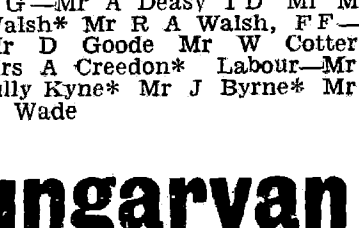
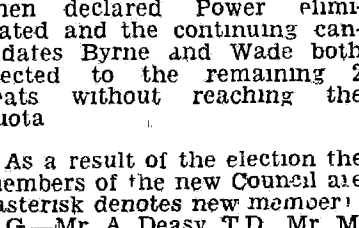
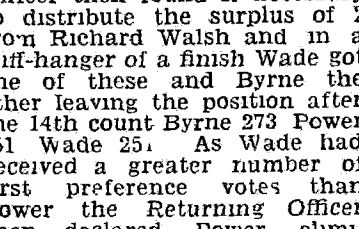
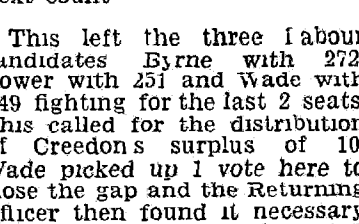
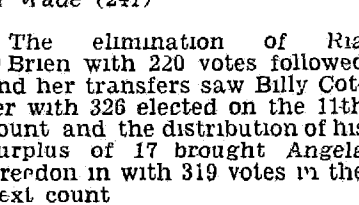
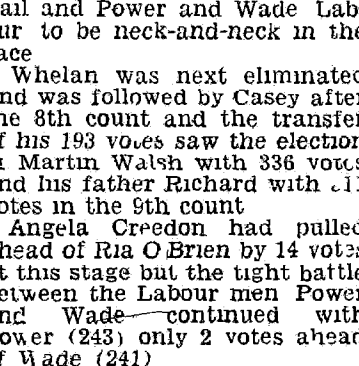
Whelan was next eliminated and was followed by Casey after the 8th count and the transfer of his 193 votes saw the election of Martin Walsh with 336 votes and his father Richard with 111 votes in the 9th count.

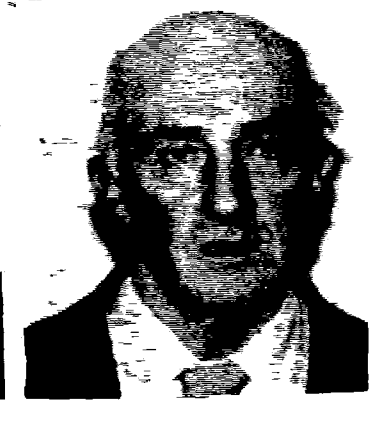

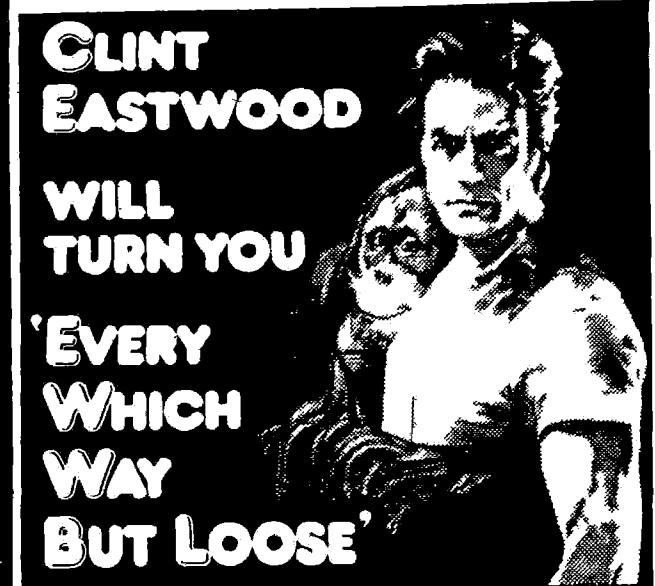

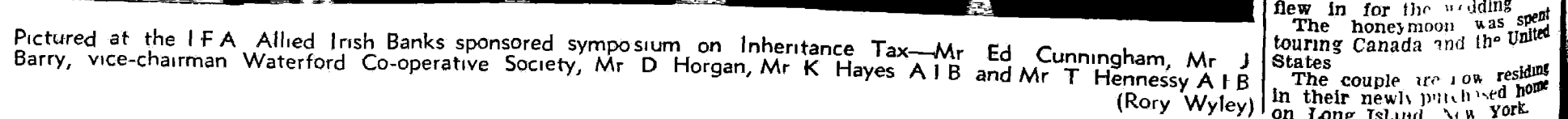
