## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

**REFERENDUM DAY**  
 To day, Thursday, July 5 is Referendum Day and truly people should take the time and make the effort to go to the polling stations to confirm their approval of the intention to approve of Bills which contain amendments of the Constitution in relation to the Adoption Act and the Election of members of Seanad Eireann by Institutions of Higher Education.

There has been none of the ballyhoos and canvassing which a part and parcel of ordinary elections attached to these referenda and people might think that it is not necessary for them to vote. Nothing could be farther from the truth.

The legislation pending from the result of the vote is most important and it is necessary that a good percentage of the electorate should come out and give their positive approval to it. So do not leave it to others and even though there will be no special activity to mark the occasion be a good citizen and go to your local polling station anytime between 9 am and 9 pm and mark your papers. By doing so you will be doing a good job.

**VILLIERSTOWN WILL CELEBRATE**  
 The welkin will surely ring in the little riverside, West Waterford village of Villierstown tomorrow (Friday) night where thousands will gather to take part in the official welcome home celebrations of Ireland's Cross Country King and World Champion John Treacy a native son of the village.

The celebration was postponed after John's epic repeat win in the World Cross Country Championship at Limerick last March because he had to return to the US to continue his studies and sit his examinations. However the local John Treacy Committee went into action then and commenced their plans which will be climaxed in Villierstown tomorrow night.

John himself, returned from the US last week but within 48 hours he was on his way again with the Irish team to take part in the European Cup Athletics semi-finals, and indeed his presence there saved the Irish team from a complete wash-out as in a thrilling 5,000 metres after being the front-runner for most of the race, he was narrowly beaten into second place.

Now he's back in Villierstown where he will be spending the remainder of the summer with his parents and the other members of his family.

I understand that the celebration committee have lined up five bands for to-morrow night's monster parade which will start from the outskirts of the village to a platform in the village centre where Michael Keating on behalf of the committee will present John with a full size action portrait showing him triumphantly crossing the finishing line in a terrific and heroic performance in Limerick. The portrait is the work of the Cork Examiner Art Editor Frank Sanquest.

Centrally Villierstown will be the place to be to-morrow night and despite the weather, it will be a historic occasion as the people pay their tribute to John Treacy the most unassailable world champion the world has known.

**NO BONUS MARKS**  
 No bonus marks to the Road Authority that resurfaced some of the streets in Dungarvan last week by spreading small stones on beds of tar and then displaying notices which referred to the stones as "loose chippings". Loose indeed they were but certainly not chippings. Had any of these so-called chippings been sent flying from under the wheels of passing cars and struck a pedestrian they would have proved as lethal as a bullet from a rifle.

And no bonus marks either to the motorists who ignored the notices cautioning a speed limit of 20 mph over the "loose chippings" thereby increasing the hazards as they sped over the stones at speeds far in excess of that.

### WHAT CYPLAS IS ALL ABOUT

Last week Minister of State in the Department of Industry, Commerce and Energy Mr Raphael Burke visited Cappoquin where he performed the official opening of the new Cyplas International factory located at the Industrial Estate there.

Cyplas International is a branch of Cyplas Industries Ltd, based in Auckland New Zealand with a further branch, Cyplas Europe based in Eindhoven, Netherlands. The Cyplas Organisation was established to manufacture weather shields used in the side windows of motor cars.

The weather shield was the invention of an Australian Paul Walcott about 30 years ago. Walcott founded Cyplas and after 10 years expanded his operation to New Zealand. There about 7 years ago he met the present chief executive of Cyplas, Keith Miller, and in the ensuing expansion which resulted up to 70% of all cars in Australia and New Zealand now use the Cyplas weather shield.

The organisation extended its activities to the European scene about 3 or 4 years ago when Keith Miller met a Dutchman Paul Van Camp and the weather shield was introduced and widely accepted by major car manufacturers such as Peugeot, Citroen, Renault and Volvo. Because of the tremendous success of Cyplas Europe the organisation has now come to Ireland and it has been Cappoquin's good luck that, with the assistance of the I.D.A. they have located their factory there where it will prove a great boon in the continuing industrial development of the West Waterford area.

Following the official opening of the factory on Thursday afternoon of last week a reception was held at Whitechurch House Hotel at which the Minister of State was the guest of honour. It is usual on such occasions, to make presentations to Ministers who visit to perform such functions as official openings and it has been traditional for many years for such presentations, especially here in Waterford the home of Waterford Glass to take the form of a piece of Waterford Glass. However on this occasion there was a deviation from this procedure, a most welcome one I am sure, but nonetheless redundant of the locality when the presentation to the Minister incidentally made by Norm Reardon took the form of a beautiful 15 lbs salmon fresh caught in the River Blackwater that morning.

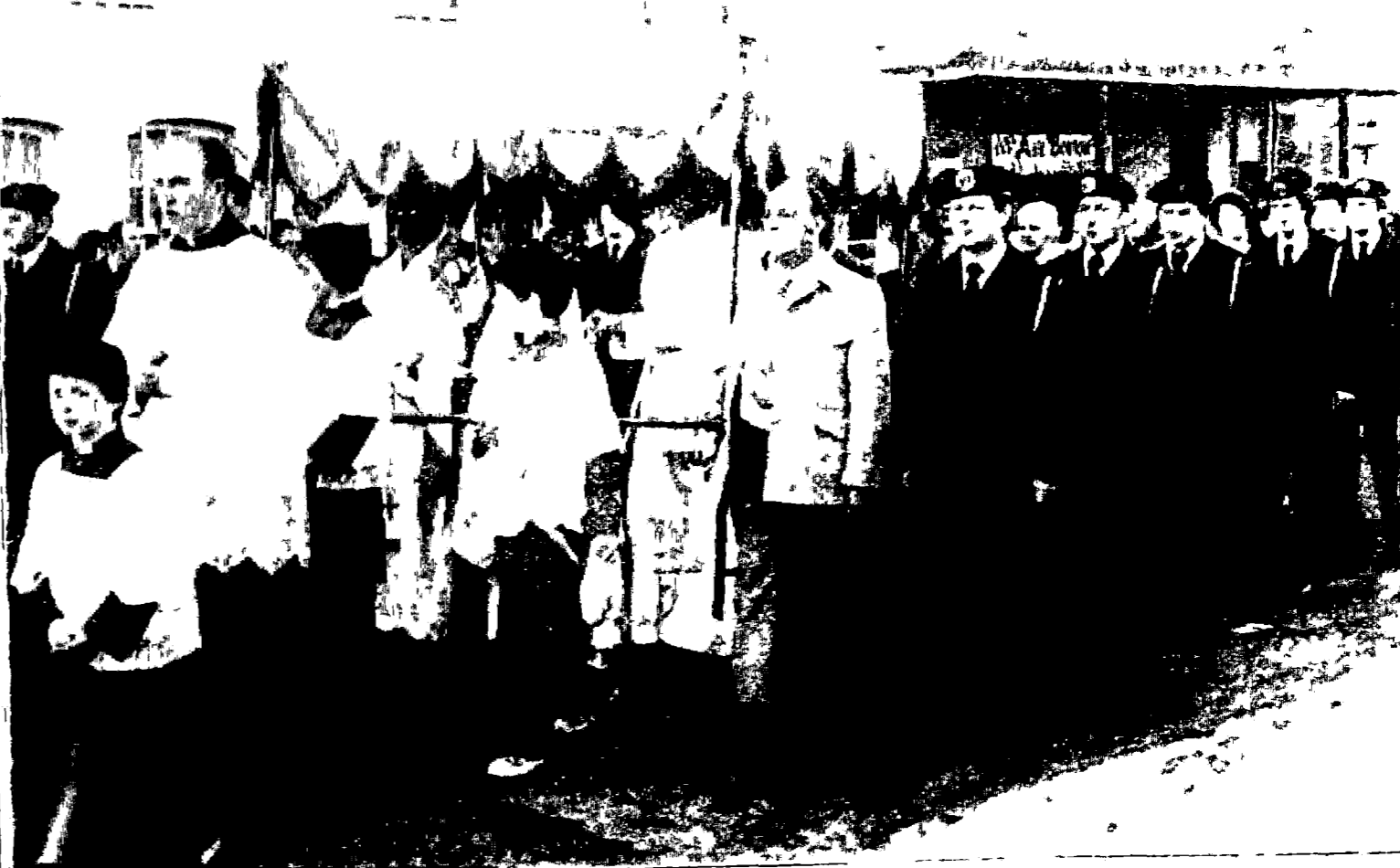

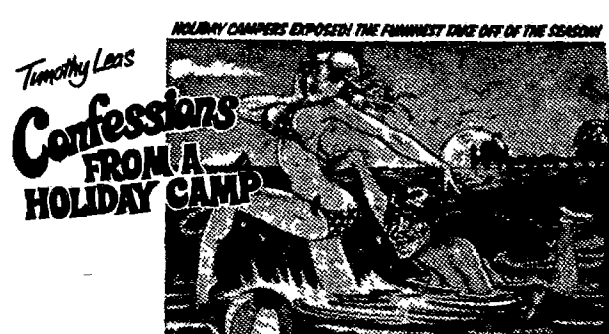

**DEFENDANT HAD NO RATIONAL EXPLANATION FOR OFFENCE**

A 24 year old married Dungarvan man who pleaded guilty at Dungarvan Court to charges of causing malicious damage to a tool kit and the attempted larceny of tools valued at £500 at Shandon Dungarvan in the early hours of March 25 last was stated by his solicitor to have no rational explanation for committing the offences.

He was Anthony Monahan, 54 Childers Estate and Supt M English who prosecuted told the Court that Monahan was at a building site at the Waterford Creamery at 11.5 a.m. on March 25 and got on to a scaffolding and attempted to open a tool box left there while he was at the site. He was accused by a workman and ran away. He was later apprehended by the Gardaí but left the jurisdiction and went to England.

Solicitor who defended said that Monahan had been working with the building contractors on the site for 3 months previous to the offence. He said that Monahan could give him no rational explanation for what he had done beyond that he was drinking from 7 p.m. that evening and was apparently under the influence of drink at the time. He said that after committing the offence Monahan had panicked and left the country and went to England but he then came back of his own accord to face the charges.

Mr Hanrahan pleaded for leniency for the defendant on account of his wife and young family.

Imposing a fine of £10 on the malicious damage charge with £25 witness's expenses District Justice O'Connell said that he would adjourn the question of further penalty to October 10.

**COURT SEQUEL TO CAMPING WEEK-END**

Four 18 year old Clonsilla youths who came to Dungarvan for a camping holiday on the week-end appeared at Dungarvan Court on charges of the larceny of a car on the road to Doile, 8 Pearse Park, brother Gerard and Columa Lenane 8 110 Elm Park.

Supt M. English said that on Saturday June 2 Miss Donnelly of the Causeway Abbeyside at 9.40 p.m. and when she returned at 11.35 p.m. it was gone. She received that a car had been taken into the back of a stationery and had done untold damage to 4 youths were seen leaving the car and ran away. Gerard investigated the matter and later picked up the four defendants within 8 or 9 miles of Clonsilla. He said that the youths had planned a week-end camping holiday in Dungarvan but on Saturday night they decided to go home and took the car.

Mr J P Gordon Solr, for the defendants said that the car had amounted to £1000 and had that money in his pocket to it by borrowing the amount involved.

Justice O'Connell sentenced Doyle as the driver of the car to one month's imprisonment suspended if he was of good behaviour for 12 months and distinguished him from the others by 6 months and a concurrent sentence for driving without insurance. In addition he fined him £10 for dangerous driving 5.5 for driving without a licence and £10 for failing to report an accident.

He sentenced each of the other 3 defendants to 14 days in prison suspended if they were of good behaviour for 12 months and fined each £10 for allowing themselves to be driven in a stolen car.

**CRASHED IN STOLEN CAR**

When he came out after the pictures the car was gone. Investigations showed that O'Mahony had taken it and drove it to Shan don where he was involved in a crash with a car driven by Mr John O'Flynn. He said that after the collision O'Mahony got out of the car and took off but was later accosted by the Gardaí in Abbeyside.

Mr K. Solr, who defended said that O'Mahony had never been in trouble before. On the night in question he was wandering around near the cinema and saw what he took to be a banger with the keys in it. He took the car and drove off and was involved in a collision with another car at Shan don. He got out after the collision but was later accosted in Abbeyside where he admitted the offence to the Gardaí.

Mr King added that the defendant had gone to the Bank and raised money to pay for the damage caused to both cars in the collision.

District Justice O'Connell contended the defendant on all charges and was later accosted taking a car without the owner's consent £10 for interfering with the mechanism of a car £10 for dangerous driving with an endorsement and £10 for having no insurance and an endorsement.

A fine of £20 was imposed on Galvan with an endorsement for having a car uninsured on the occasion.
