## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### FARM CHIEF RECOGNISES ROLE OF PROVINCIAL PAPERS

Only those who live in a rural community can understand and appreciate the tremendous role that the provincial newspapers play in the life of the countryside, and from an agricultural viewpoint the provincial paper is 'devoured' from page to page by the local readership.

That statement came from the President of the IFA, Paddy O'Connell, on the occasion of a meeting with provincial newspaper owners and management at a study conference held some time back in Limerick.

Not alone is the provincial paper read by the household but large numbers are sent to relatives in other parts of the country and abroad.

Having paid that tribute to the in depth type of readership which the provincial newspaper enjoys, he went on to say that they have played a dominant role in the political history of the life of the country.

They have also played a leading role in the life of the farming community. For the agriculturalist it is his prime paper. It is his local paper and there is not a house in the countryside that does not buy a local paper. He also said that many farmers will not be concerned about missing a daily newspaper but they will certainly never miss their local paper.

What is his own experience? When I returned from Brussels, Dublin or elsewhere one of my greatest pleasures at the weekend is to read my local paper. He says "for it will keep me up to date about every single aspect of local life and this is a matter of vital importance to a community—to know what is going on in your own community. This is where we differentiate between the national and the local."

I feel sure that the views expressed by Mr. Lane are commonly shared not only by all members of the farming community but by the members of all the urban communities as well because in the end it is the same things that concern us all at local level.

It can be said that all the comments made by Mr. Lane can be said without saying and that the majority of people realise the important role which the local paper fills but the sense and indeed heartening for those of us involved in the realms of the provincial press to hear such V.I.P.s as Mr. O'Connell speak his mind only on the matter?

**TAR AND CHIPS**

Our commens last week about the tar and chip method of resurfacing some of the streets of Dungarvan recently

were reiterated at the County Council meeting held last Monday when several members agreed that the general comment of the townspeople was that it was not a good job and certainly was not good enough for a town the size of Dungarvan. At the same time it was correctly stated that there were no complaints about the efficiency of the job as it had been done but only about the type of operation that was involved.

The County Engineer made no bones about the fact that it was not what he wanted either and said that he would much prefer to do a macadam job right through the town but it was a question of the money he was allowed for these jobs. According to the figures he gave a macadam job would cost seven or eight times as much as an ordinary tar and chips job.

Obviously the spending restriction in this regard is imposed by the Department of the Environment but I do think that they would want to have another look at their priorities even though the differential in prices is high. If the Department can see fit to tar macadam miles and miles of the arterial highways through the countryside surely they could divert the few extra thousand involved to resurface the streets of principal towns rather than rough surfacing them with chips (sic) and tar which create a hazard for motorists and pedestrians in the periods immediately after such operations.

### DUNGARVAN LIONS CLUB

The Dungarvan Lions Club which was founded in 1978 held its annual meeting last week when the chain of office passed from the outgoing President Mr. Derry Twomey, Clonkerdon House, Cappagh to the incoming President, Dr. Pat O'Connell, Inchera, Abbeyside, Dungarvan.

The financial statement of the affairs of the club covering the 14 months period up to July 1979 showed that the functions organised realised an income of £11,238 all of which barring a small surplus of £357 was donated to various charities in the town and district.

Without doubt the Dungarvan Lions Club in its first year has done an enormous amount of good work and has aided many of the charitable organisations and societies in the town. The aim of the new President is to continue this good work in the coming year.

## Dungarvan loop road in 8 to 10 years

The method used in the recent road resurfacing of some of the streets of Dungarvan and the ever growing traffic problem in the town were discussed at a meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday.

The matter was raised by Cllr D. Goode who referred to the manner in which the resurfacing was carried out by spreading chips on tar which he said left Mary Street and the Square in a very bad condition.

Deputy Jackie Fahey agreed and said that the job was not a good one and that this was the general comment about it by the town.

Mr. J. D. Hally County Engineer said that as far as he was concerned he would prefer to do a macadam job right through the town but it was a question of money. A question that was becoming difficult under the rating system in force.

Deputy Deasy said that the general feeling of the people of the town was that the "square and the adjoining streets should be tar macadam instead of having chips spread on tar.

Deputy Fahey said that no one was complaining about the efficiency of the job as it was done but people felt that this was not good enough for a town the size of Dungarvan.

Cllr P. Kennedy then referred to the traffic chaos in the town and said that the Urban Council would have to face up to their obligations as a position was now reached. He said that he knew many people had given up coming into Dungarvan altogether because the streets were always blocked and they could not drive through them.

To a question by Cllr Pat Coffey the County Engineer said that the differential in prices between tar and chips and macadam was roughly £4 or £5 thousand as against £30 or £40 thousand.

Mr. Hally went on to say that the traffic problem was caused by heavy vehicles blocking up the centre of the town and the only solution to this was to build a road around the town which would direct the heavy traffic away from the town centre. He said that he had been in the Department in Dublin about this recently and the proposed loop road for Dungarvan was scheduled in the Department's list for 1988-89. He asked that the proposal be brought forward as they were ready to go ahead with it now.

He said that the road would run from the petrol station at the Younghall Road (Foley & Murphy Ltd.) and down via Fr

Tommy's Road across Springmount and on to the old railway station in Shandon and then via a new bridge across the Collis estuary to Strandside North Abbeyside and on out to Coolclogh Road at the back of Croft's Corner to rejoin the main Waterford road.

Mr. Hally told the Council that if they could manage to get the first portion of the road done it would mean that a lot of the heavy traffic going into the Creamery at present would be taken away from the town centre as it could be taken in to Shandon where the Creamery had plans to put their main entrance.

**LAND BY CPO**

In reply to a question by the Chairman Cllr T. Kyne the County Engineer said that they were ready to get the land required for Compulsory Purchase Order and once this Order was confirmed he felt it would commit the Department to provide the money to build the bridge over the Collihan estuary.

In reply to a question by Mr. Deasy for the information of the other members he pointed out that Waterford County Council was the Road Authority for the Urban area of Dungarvan and traffic problems would have to be dealt with by them.

"At the same time," said Deputy Deasy, "I feel the Urban Council was remiss in not appointing Traffic Wardens as was done in other provincial towns of the same size."

In reply to a question by Mr. Deasy the County Engineer said that if the first portion of the proposed loop road was started next year it would take 8 to 10 years to complete.

Mr. Hally said that he would continue to press the Department on the matter.

#### ABORTIVE IF TIE

This was a much bigger surprise than the eagerly awaited meeting between Shamrocks and Ballinacourty at Lismore on Sunday evening failed to materialise when both teams refused to play because the pitch was not mowed and no flags had been put down for the game.

#### MINOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

The loss of young Pat Curran is a big blow to the hopes of Cappoquin who will oppose Ballyduff at Lismore on Sunday afternoon. The result can either see the winners into the county semi-final so neither side will spare themselves in an effort to win.  
Ballyduff's greatest display so far was their brilliant performance against Tallow at Lismore last month and on this form it would be very difficult to oppose them. They were followed up with a fine but not quite as impressive display against a good St. Mollerans side two weeks ago and must now be considered to be strong contenders for a county title.  
Mossy Walsh outstandingly the best hurler in the county at this moment must again be expected to control the midfield. If Mossy plays well his best Ballyduff could be in a bit of trouble as they depend so much on his leadership. He is certainly at his best, they can play very well indeed. This does not mean to reduce the value or

worth of the contributions of players like the great Seamus Canning, Richie and Michael Walsh Mack Sheedy, Dave Feehan, Seamus Daly Michael and Cene Guiry and company, but an in-form Mossy Walsh does mean something special (he scored 12 of the sides 23 points against St. Mollerans).  
Cappoquin still do not know if the eye that they received into the quarter final is an advantage. They availed of the long wait by playing tournaments and senior league matches and in these they have had mixed luck. Probably a more even team than Ballyduff, Cappoquin play more as a team and very seldom play a poor game. Trained under the strict supervision of one of their former stars, Ger. Mason, the team are in the peak of fitness and might prove more than a handful for Ballyduff.

### CALL TO MINISTER TO MEET DRIFT NET FISHERMEN

All they want is that they had in the past said Cllr A. Deasy, TD at a meeting of Dungarvan County Council on Monday when he proposed that the Council request the Minister for Fisheries Mr Brian Lenihan to meet the deputations of drift net fishermen from the Ardmore and Youghal areas to discuss their problems.

Deputy Deasy said that in these fishing seasons and the shortening of the fishing time from 5 to 4 days together with the restriction on mesh depths had given rise to great concern and a number of incidents which involved the naval service and fishery protection service. He said that it was most unfortunate that these fishermen who had always been fishing now found themselves in conflict with the authorities as a result.

Because of these new restrictions Deputy Deasy said the fishermen concerned are no longer able to make a livelihood and they are protesting against that as they feel they are entitled to do so. All they want is what they had in the past.

Deputy Deasy went on to say that the drift net fishermen in the Ardmore and Youghal were being restricted because of the illegal fishing that went on along the Western coast from Donegal to Kerry. The fishery protection vessels should be up there he added and not in the Ardmore where the fishermen have always been law-abiding.

### Blood Spattered Walls After Flat Row

When Gardaí arrived at a flat in Youghal on the night of December 17 they found the walls and floor spattered with blood and one man lying badly injured in the room waiting to be taken to hospital by ambulance.

District Justice W. F. O'Connell was told at Youghal Court when James Catto Tallow Street Youghal appeared on a charge of assaulting John Hogan Tinnabina Youghal thereby occasioning him actual bodily harm.

Sergeant Padraig Hyde told of going to Catto's flat where he saw Hogan lying on a stretcher ready to go into an ambulance. There was blood spattered all over the floor and walls. Catto claimed that Hogan had tripped on the step. Hogan had the way to the Garda station. Catto said that he took on the wrong man. I should have killed him. I should have given him the boot.

Corroborative evidence was given by Garda P. Kecker who said that Hogan while lying in a pool of blood on the floor in the flat said "Catto did this to me".

Murray stated that he and some friends went back to Catto's flat that night and brought drink with them. Words passed between Catto and Hogan after the latter had insulted a woman. He saw Catto strike Hogan while sitting on a chair and when Hogan fell to the ground Catto kicked him.

Hogan told the court that he was so drunk he remembered very little of the night stating that he woke up in hospital he agreed that his quarrel with the defendant went back seven years.

Hogan said he was giving a warning party that night. Hogan twice tried to strike him but missed.

Convicting defendant the Justice said Hogan could justify or excuse the savagery of this attack. Fining Catto £10 with £77 expenses he commented that the defendant was provoked by a man of violent disposition.

Supt M. P. Byrne prosecuted. Mr John Brosnan solicitor defended.

Referenda Results

Although there was as expected a very low poll in last Thursday's Referenda it was as low as 22% in some areas. The result was massively in favour of the proposal to change the Constitution on adoption. Significantly though the proposal on the Senate representation met with greater opposition.

In County Waterford the total electorate was 35,468. There was a total poll of 11,779 on the adoption issue. There were 349 spoiled votes leaving a valid poll of 11,430 and of these 11,321 voted yes and 109 voted no. On the Senate issue the total poll was 11,761 and with 549 spoiled votes there was a valid poll of 11,212 with 10,441 voting 'yes' and 771 voting 'no'.

### INTERRUPTIONS MARK DAIL QUESTION ON COMPENSATION FOR SALMON FISHERMEN

### New Committee's Protest Against Farm Levies

Stating that farmers were not only being burdened with the 2% levy but with two or three other levies each year, which would be equalled at the first meeting of the County Committee of Agriculture held in Dungarvan last week proposed a resolution calling on the Minister for Agriculture to cancel the levy. The Minister for Finance against all the levies that had now been imposed on farmers. He said that these levies would act as a big brake on the development of agriculture in general and the Minister should be asked to remove them.  
Mr Gerry O'Halloran seconded the resolution which was supported by Mr C Curran who pointed out that the County Executive of Fianna Fail was the first body in the county to vote in opposition to the 2% levy when it was introduced and called for a more equitable alternative form of taxation.  
Referring to the many strikes which had taken place Mr Curran said that it was not the people who were producing all the wealth of the country the farmers and the industrial workers in the factories who had gone on strike but rather the non-productive workers in secure jobs.  
If the farmers and industrial workers ceased working as some of these others had done said Mr Curran the whole economy of the country would be brought to a standstill.  
The resolution of protest was passed unanimously.

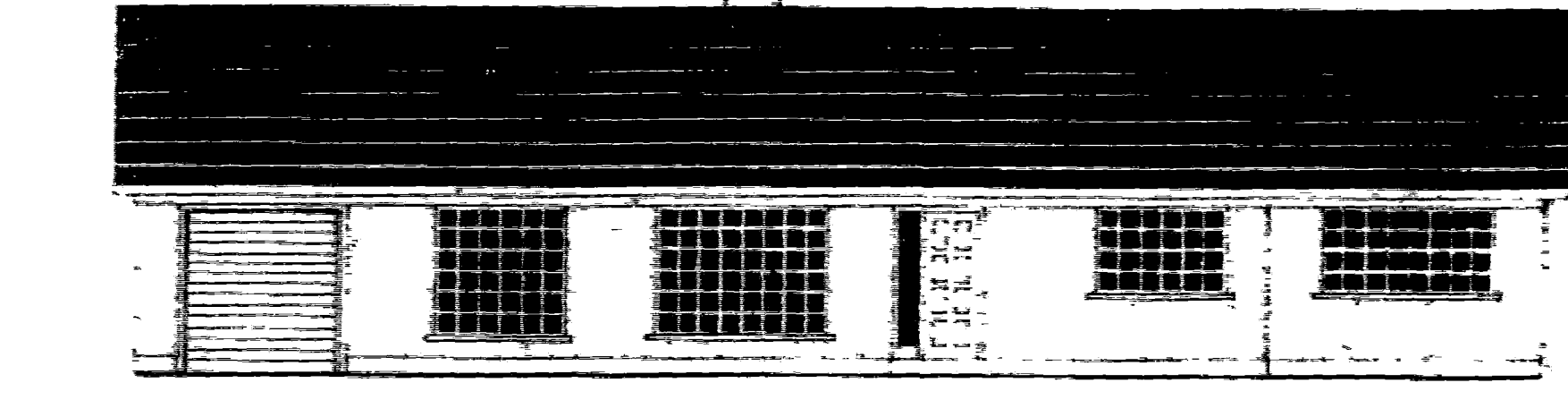
