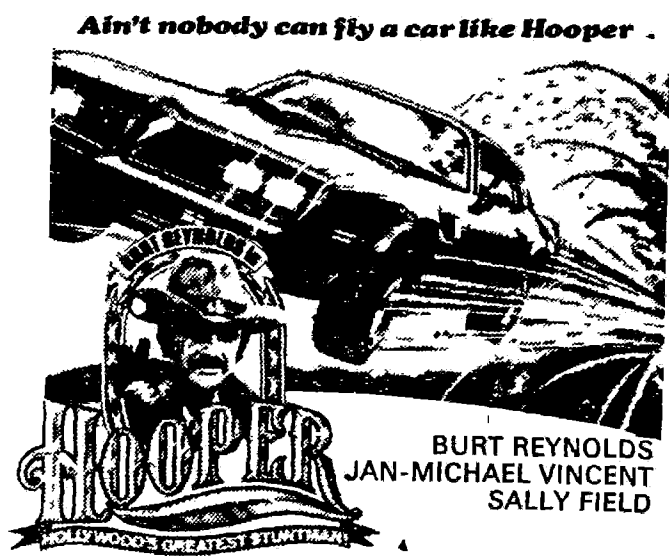

NEW PRE-INTENSIVE BRUCellosis ERADICATION SCHEME. As from 20th August 1979 the following further controls in relation to the eradication of brucellosis in cattle will apply in counties Carlow, Kildare, Kilkenny, Laois, Limerick, Offaly (South of the Brosna river), Tipperary, Waterford, Wexford and Wicklow. Eligible animals (female cattle aged 12 months and over and bulls aged 9 months and over) must have passed a 30 day pre-movement test for brucellosis before moving into or out of a herd unless going for immediate slaughter. All herds not subject to bulk milk testing will be listed for blood testing to herdowners' veterinary surgeons. Where a reactor is disclosed at any brucellosis test in these counties, no female animal aged 6 weeks and over or bulls aged 9 months and over may be moved into or out of the herd, except under permit. All non-reacting female animals in infected herds must be vaccinated with 45/20 vaccine. Anyone who infringes the controls is liable to prosecution and a heavy fine. 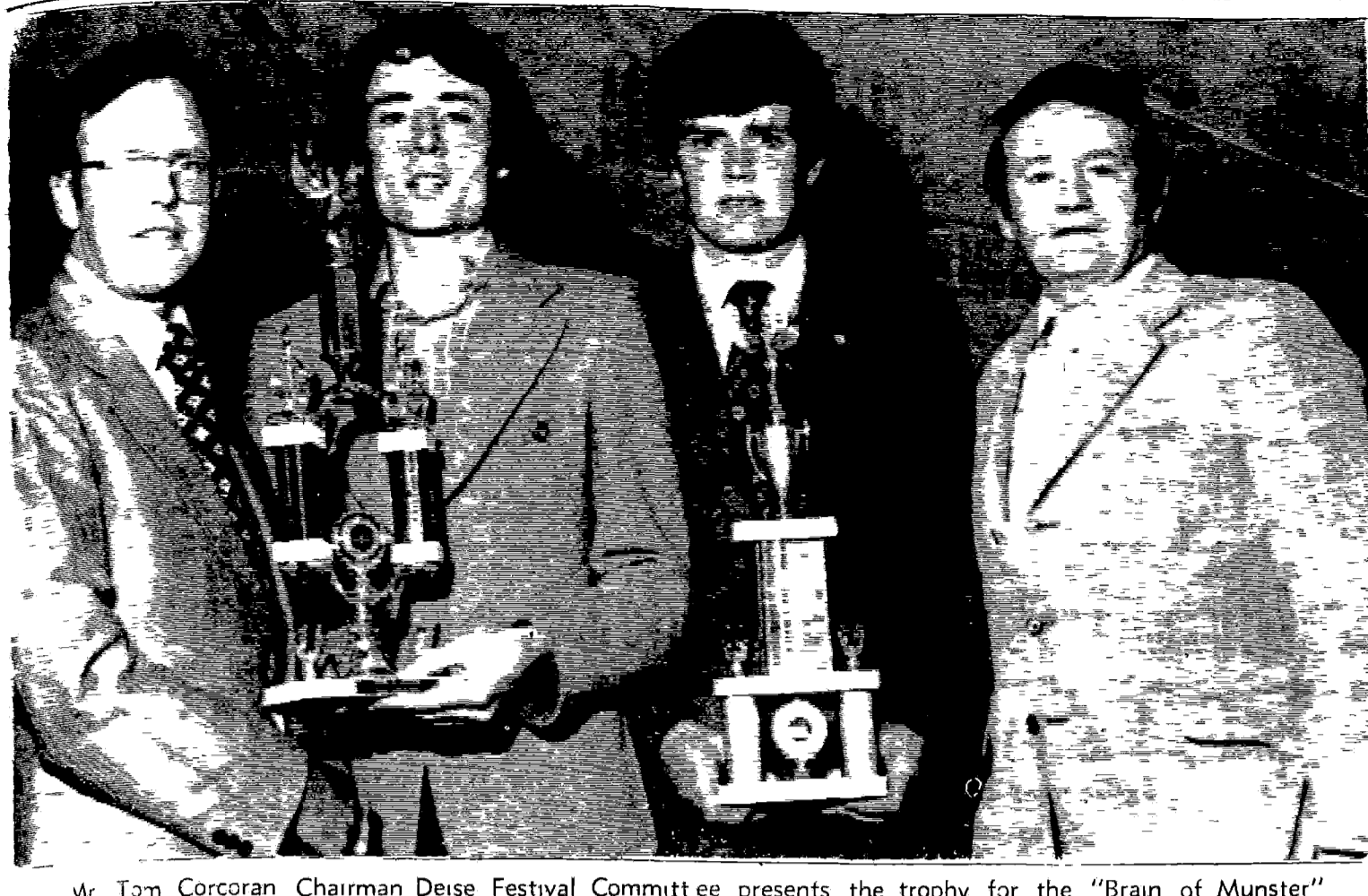
