Forms P35 and supporting documentation have been in the hands of registered employers for some time. Therefore employers should by now have completed and returned these documents to the Collector-General.

If you have not then you have committed an offence and you are liable to be prosecuted and brought before the courts. If you are convicted, the court can impose a penalty of £20, together with a continuing penalty of £20 for every day on which the return remains outstanding. Once these legal proceedings are started, they will not be withdrawn. It is in your interest to lodge the P35 return without delay.

If you did not receive the necessary forms,
