

FOURMILEWATER GAIN REVENGE IN I.H. FINAL

FOURMILEWATER 3-9, ST. MARYS 1-8
Fourmilewater recorded what must have been one of the most satisfying victories in the history of the club at rainsoaked Fraher Field Dungarvan on Sunday last when they came out to defeat neighbours St. Marys Touraneena in a thrilling county intermediate hurling final.

Not even the rain or the mud could dampen the verve and enthusiasm of two gallant sides in a blistering game in which quarter was neither given or asked for. But on this occasion the Fourmilewater side under the careful guidance of coach Ned Power Tallow won through to exact sweet revenge for their defeat at the hands of St. Marys in the Western semi-final in the same grade some time previously.

It was obvious from the start that Fourmilewater had put the poor form of that Western final far behind them. The momentum of the defeat still ranked them also noticeable as they dived into the fray from the throw in. It was the spur which goaded them to the peak of fitness in the interim and the momentum was borne out as they lashed the pace on the heavy sod far better than their near neighbours.

Veteran Jim Wall set them on the road to a long overdue win in the final when he cracked home a goal after only thirty seconds. Declan Fitzpatrick pointed a free for St. Marys a few minutes later but before the score could be recorded Paddy Joe Ryan had the ball in the St. Marys net again at the other end.

Three minutes later Jim Wall blasted Touraneena's hopes when he had his second goal and Fourmilewater's third for although the losers improved considerably after this they were always fighting a losing battle. Declan Fitzpatrick moved from midfield to centre back and the switch steadied the St. Marys defence considerably. The steady up in this sector successfully cut off Fourmilewater's route to goal but unfortunately for St. Marys the damage had been done and Fourmilewater were well poised for victory at the half way stage when they led 3-3 to 0-4.

SWITCHED POSITIONS
Fitzpatrick and John Dalton switched positions again at the commencement of the second half. The losers showed considerable improvement in the third quarter during which they cut the deficit to five points (3-4 to 0-7). Fourmilewater however were in no mood to be beaten and two points from John Morgan and one from P. J. Ryan consolidated their position again at the 50th minute.

St. Marys threw everything they had into game following Lar Whelan's goal from a free but in a fiery and tempestuous final ten minutes Fourmilewater proved best and two points from P. J. Ryan set the seal on a victory, which was well merited. Exchanges became rather hectic in the second half and there was a general flare up near the end as players from both sides became involved. Richie Ormond Lismore however shot a strong under control and the game finished in an orderly fashion. Tom Moore was again in brilliant form in goal for the winners while Mick Connolly Phil Burke and John Dalton were outstanding in defence.

INTERMEDIATE TITLE FOR BALLINAMEELA

BALLINAMEELA 1-14, GAULTIER 1-3
Ballinameela's rise to senior status has been remarkable yet then one considers the talents that the side possesses one can easily understand their meteoric rise through the grades to the premier championship.

Last year they won the junior football championship. At the time they vowed they would win the intermediate title at their first attempt. It was not an idle boast because last Sunday at Dungarvan's Fraher Field they made good their promise when they annexed the intermediate county title in a manner befitting great champions.

They literally annihilated the Eastern challengers Gaultier in a disappointing final marked to some extent by the elements and the fact that the issue was never in any great doubt from an early stage. It was feared that the day would not suit their type of football. Yet despite the physical stature of some of their smaller players, they came through the hour with flying colours.

They overcame the heavy conditions remarkably well and produced a brand of football which must have satisfied the most discerning followers in the surprisingly large attendance.

Not alone that they also took the smooth with the rough went through bone shattering tackles from heavier opposition and in the end proved that good football is the ingredient for success.

After the game, when County Board Chairman Kieran O'Ryan was presenting the cup to team captain, John Walsh one of the jubilant onlookers remarked that next year they would take the Conway Cup. Who knows? At the rate they are progressing it's certainly not beyond the bounds of belief. They power-housed their way to an 0-6 to nil lead in the twenty minutes of last Sunday's final. They withstood tremendous pressure for a period after this when Gaultier offered their strongest challenge.

In this period the Eastern champions showed a terrible degree of inaccuracy in attack when some fine chances were sent wide. They subsequently paid the penalty or even though Brian Power broke through for a goal in the 26th minute having pointed a few minutes earlier. Ballinameela struck back with a vengeance and John Walsh's point in the 28th minute and his crucial goal two minutes later left them in a very commanding position at the interval when they led 1-7 to 1-1.

Gaultier goaled shortly after the resumption but for some reason the score was misallow.

Coast Erosion "A Frightening Experience To See" Says Co. Councillor He was obliged to the Council for seeing what he did in the recent 'works in progress' tour which they had through the county.

Mr J D Hall Co Engineer said that five years ago they had carried out a detailed survey of the work to be done and the estimated cost then was £3 million. Now he said this would have risen to almost £5 million.
