National Understanding for Economic and Social Development

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE MINISTER FOR HEALTH

To meet the Government's undertaking under the National Understanding, the Minister for Health has introduced an interim Scheme to compensate persons in the £5,500 to £7,000 income range, for certain medical expenses. The Scheme will apply to the period 25th IULY 1979 to 5th APRIL 1980 and it will be operated by the Voluntary Health Insurance Board on behalf of the Minister.

ENTITLED PERSONS

Persons whose income for the year ended 5th April 1979 was £5,500 or more but less than £7,000 Those who have entitlement to health services by virtue of being voluntary contributors under the Social Welfare Acts, are not eligible under this interim Scheme Where both spouses have independant incomes, the eligibility of each is determined separately. The children (under 16 years) of such persons are regarded as being the dependants of the spouse with the greater income
