IT COULD HAPPEN ON FRIDAY

Three cheers for old Ireland! The Banks may re-open on Friday but the ESB may shut down again. What a country we live in. A handful of ESB employees can cause blackouts whenever they choose to pull the plug at the power stations and the Banks have now joined in a similar irresponsible exercise by closing whenever a row brews between staff and management. One is as much a public service as the other and as vital to the welfare of the economy and whenever one or other ceases to operate it is the economy and the general public that suffer.

To the public the image projected by the ESB is one of complete irresponsibility and it is well for the banks and bank staffs to realise that in light of what has happened over the past ten years with three major shut-downs, their image is not much better.

In the ESB the public suffer because of a wrangle as to who does what between the unions, in the Banks the public suffer as the staffs seek to get a bigger slice of the enormous profits which the associated banks in the country have been making in recent years.

I don't believe that the situation which we have here in this country where these and other public services are concerned would be allowed to happen anywhere else or indeed tolerated.

AN APPEAL FROM THE NORTH

An appeal for financial assistance reached me last week, not from Cambodia or Peru or any such far away place, but from Fr Seamus Shields, Parish Priest of Greenacastle Omagh, Co Tyrone.

Fr Shields in his letter tells me that Greenacastle is a small rural parish of 940 people situated in a very rocky, hilly countryside similar to parts of Connemara or Donegal. It is faced with a massive debt to pay off the local contribution for a new school built to replace four old schools built at the beginning of the century and now closed at the insistence of the Ministry for Education.

In addition he says that the churches in the parish are in a very bad state of repair and are deteriorating further each winter.

Fr Shields goes on to say that further borrowing at the high interest rates charged would be a crippling burden and that they could never solve their problems without massive outside help.

Recalling the old nursery rhyme that Christmas is coming the geese are getting fat, please put a penny in the poor man's hat, he says it sums up in a light hearted yet serious manner the tone of his urgent appeal.

Fr Shields' letter adds "I know that you are probably plagued with such requests but perhaps some of your readers might be sympathetic in a practical way if their circumstances permit. I am humbly asking for their help."

FOR BRIDGE FANS

Jack Williams on behalf of the P.O. NO BONUS MARKS FOR IRISH

No additional marks are being awarded for proficiency in Irish in competitions for medical posts at present being held by the Local Appointments Commissioner according to a report in the "Irish Medical Times."

This follows the High Court judgment in the summer which questioned the LAC's power to prescribe Irish as a desirable qualification when filling a post.

The LAC appealed this to the Supreme Court which heard the appeal earlier this month but has not yet issued its reserved judgment.

Pending this judgment the LAC has decided not to award any additional marks for Irish in competitions.

HOW IT LOOKED ALMOST 100 YEARS AGO

Recently, thanks to Mr Mickey Langers, Dungarvan got a look at an extremely well preserved copy of "Egan's Waterford Guide" which was published in the 1890's. We have had extracts from other copies of the same publication in the past and the one we are going to give now deals with a trip down the river Blackwater from Cappoquin as it struck the eye of the traveller who passed along that way almost 100 years ago.

The "Guide" description goes as follows:

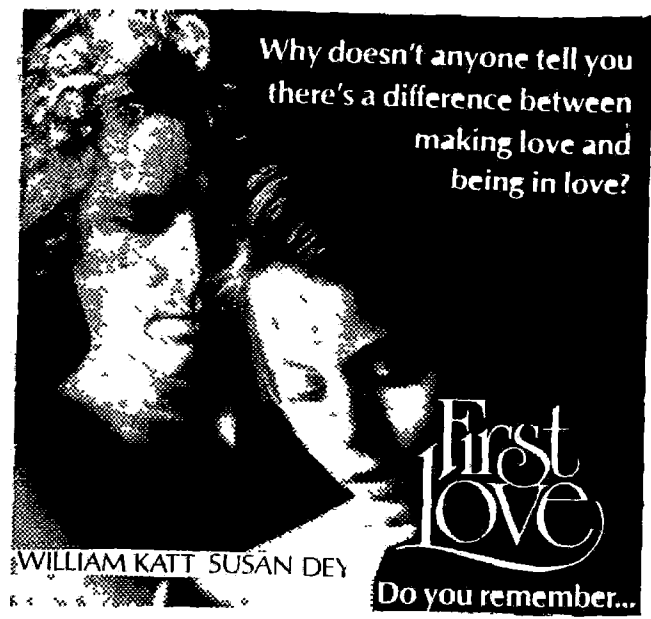
