



Circuit Judge Rules On Sale Of Cottage

The purported sale of a cot tage and an accompanying half acre of ground by an elderly County Waterford man to young married couple who had returned from England in search of a home was the subject matter of a two-hour hearing before Judge T N Desmond at Dungarvan Circuit Court re-

Plaintiff in the action was Michael F Dee Ballycoe Dun-garvan and he sought the specrfic performance of a contract entered into by the defendant Thomas Cowney, Tinalyra, Ballinamult whereby he agreed to sell a cottage and a half acre plot at Tinalyra to the plaintiff for an agreed sum of £5 400 The defence was a denial that

there was agreement for the sale of half an acre with the cottage and that the plot to was considerably

Robert Keane auctioneer and valuer O Connell Street Dungarvan told the court that he had received instructions from the defendant around January last to sell the cottage and half acre plot and he advertised it in a number of newspapers The asking price was £6 000 and he had turned down an offer of £5 000 before the plaintiff entered into it

Mr Keane said Dees first offer was £5 200 which Cowney accepted but intimated that a smaller plot would go with the cottage The plaintiff insisted that he was only interested n the cottage if there was the half acre going with it and finally a price of £5500 less £100 luck money was agreed

Cross-examined by Mr Declar Budd BL (instructed by E A Ryan and Co Solrs) for the defendant witness agreed that he had advertised the cottage without putting Cowneys name to it and also the advertisement wrongly claimed the cottage was situated at Sleady He was merely complying however with the defendants instructions in that regard He denied that he had placed the advertisements in the newspapers without in structions from the defendant Mrs M Dee wife of the plain tiff gave evidence of an agree ment being reached on a selling price of £5 400 for the cottage and the half acre She subse quently signed the contract in the offices of the defendants solicitor and the contract specifically stated the cottage and

The plaintiff Michael F Dee said he would not have purchased the cottage unless there was the half acre going with it Mr J P Gordon Solr for the corroborated Mrs Dees evidence about the contract being signed specifically providing for the sale of half an acre The defendant was not present at the signing of the contract but he subsequently

DIDN'T KNOW WHAT HE

Cowney however told the court that he really didn t know what he was signing when he put his signature to the contract He thought it had something got to do with arranging a County Council loan. He showed the exact plot that was going with the cottage to the Dees and it amounted to in or around one rood"

Witness said that if he was to sell half an acre with the ccttage it would mean he could not get machinery in or out of his own property nearby He denied ever giving Mr Keane instructions to advertise the sale of the cottage and plot Instead he had told him (Mr Keane) he was selling it himself but that if he (Mr Keane) had a client he could send him

Mr M J Lavan Solr for the defendant said Mr Keane had telephoned him to tell him that the plaintiff had bought the cottage and a plot of land for £5400 Witness asked Mr Keane the acreage of the plot and he replied I'm not quite proximately two roods."

Witness said he drew up the contract containing the words two roods but put 'approximately" after them He did inform his client that the contract provided for approximately fendant) was signing it

Judge Desmond said it was case that presented some difficulty However he was satisfied that the defendant agreed to sell and actually sold the cottage and half an acre Accordingly he must order that the defendant now complete the specific performance of the contract and he also awarded the costs of the action to the plaintiff
