

Man he wrote is the animal most cauable of suffer ing and he had to invent laughter to preserve his sanity Of course there are other views of humour It has been regarded as sinister aggressive subversive and de grading as well as uplifting. Through the centuries such writers as Chaucer Rabelaus Shakespeare Swift Cervantes and Shaw have used humour to poke ridicule and fun at excess and pomposity
But ethnic jokes while often

humorous owe more to the tradition of the wisecrack that usually exaggerated witticism often insulting that overstates something about a particular person or thing According to Wilde the following loke told around Southern California exemplifies the true substance of ethnicity in humour for it encompasses no less than four races and three religious groups
