COURT SEQUEL TO SERIOUS ACCIDENT

After one car had crashed into a wall and careered across the road and struck a ditch one of its seven occupants was subsequently swept off the road by another car and very seriously injured. District Justice W F O'Connell was told at Dungarvan Court.

Before the court were the drivers of both vehicles Thomas Fitzgerald Ballinroad Dungarvan and Michael Ryan Ballynagadon Granze Youghal who pladed not guilty to the charge of dangerous driving at Kilmish Dungarvan in the early hours of July 28 last.

Miss Christina Crotty Congress Villas Dungarvan told the court she was one of six passengers in the estate car driven by Fitzgerald and they were returning from Bohadoun Festival. The car struck a wall or ditch and she passed out.

Another passenger in Fitzgerald's car Joseph Crotty said the vehicle crashed into the ditch on one side of the road turned around twice and struck the ditch on the other side of the road. After the accident another of their passengers Miss Rosarie Crotty was standing beside the crashed car when another vehicle came along and swept her off the road.

Fitzgerald in evidence said his car swayed on him and mounted the footpath before colliding with the wall. At that stage he had lost control of it which was only doing about 45 miles an hour at the time. Replying to Supt M English witness said it was a 1970 car and had over 120,000 on the clock. It was in reasonably good order.

CHRISTMAS JOY OR HORROR

December last year was the worst single month in the history of the State for deaths on the road. During the 1978 season of peace and goodwill 76 people were killed on Irish roads. Everybody wants the carnage to stop but unless we do something about it how ever it will be like faith with out good works—it will profit us nothing so what can be done?

If we break down the figures for December 1978 we get a good idea of exactly what can be done. Of the total of 76 killed 54 were killed after dark, 33 were pedestrians and 32 were in cars. The age groups which suffered most were 15-24 years—22 killed mostly in cars, 65 years and over—21 killed mostly pedestrians.

DRIVERS Driving after dark is where the main danger lies especially for young people and drink is a big factor in night-time accidents. Parties at this time of the year be they from the office factory or house parties are common. Festive drinking won't kill you but the trip home might. The simple answer is to make arrangements beforehand so that you don't have to drive home and don't take a lift from a driver who has been drinking.

And don't forget the Breathalyser! By the end of the year 9,000 drivers will have been charged under the new breathalyser law and remember that whatever other penalties those convicted may receive and they can be severe they must lose their licences.

PEDESTRIANS The figures clearly show that walking on the road at night is the main danger especially for the older pedestrian. Many older people wear dark clothing and of course this makes them doubly difficult for drivers to see especially on unlit roads in the country. They should wear a light coloured coat and more importantly a reflective armband and where there is no footpath walk on the right-hand side of the road facing the traffic. Drink is also a big factor in pedestrian deaths at night.

SAFETY BELTS From the figures quoted above it is obvious that the level of danger on the road at this time of the year is extremely high. You don't have to be the cause of an accident to be involved in it. Take the precaution of wearing your safety belt every time you drive or travel in the front seat of a car, but especially at night. Not just because it's the law but because safety belts reduce the danger of death or serious injury by half in the event of a crash.

POSITIVE ACTION These then are the three areas where positive action on the part of everyone could substantially reduce the level of road deaths and injury on our roads this Christmas. Don't drink and drive. If you walk at night walk on the right and wear a reflective armband. Wear your safety belt on all trips long or short and especially at night. Make this a Christmas to remember—for the right reasons.

Suspended Sentence Of Three Months Detention

The ease with which a 19 year old Dungarvan youth was able to obtain valuable stereo equipment for a down payment of \$57 was commented upon at Dungarvan Court when John Havens Childers Estate Dungarvan pleaded guilty to two largely charges.

Havens pleaded guilty to the larceny of one 3-in-one stereo valued \$379 the property of Edw. O'Connell The Bridge Dungarvan on November 13th 1978 and also to the larceny of another 3-in-one stereo valued \$279 the property of Declan O'Shea at North Main Street, Youghal on the same occasion.

Supt M English told the court that Havens went to the firm of Foley and O'Connell in Dungarvan on that date gave an incorrect name of address and on making a down payment of \$57 was given the stereo worth almost £400. He went to Youghal and repeated the performance and subsequently sold both stereos for a total of £120.

Mr M Hanrahan Solicitor defending said Havens wanted the money to go to Jesev to take up employment but returned shortly afterwards and admitted everything. He had no previous convictions.

District Justice O'Connell said the case with which the defendant got these two very valuable stereos deserved some comment and to some degree one felt that if the credentials of the defendant were checked he might not be now before the court.

Imposing a sentence of three months detention, the Justice suspended it on Havens being of good behaviour for 12 months and he also fined him £10 on each charge.

Transfer Of Pub Licence Granted

District Justice W F O'Connell at Dungarvan Court granted an application made by Mr E P King Solr on behalf of Mr Terence Creagh-Percy Devonshire Arms Hotel Dungarvan for an ad interim transfer of the licence in respect of the licensed premises formerly owned by Laurence Condon Sexton Street Abbeville.

Co-op Movement Urges Government Action On Farmer Confidence

The movement of 16,000 farmers out of dairying, a loss of £1,000 million in exports in the next five years and job opportunity losses of 3,000 in agriculture are forecast in a report published by the Irish Co-operative Organisation Society.

The report which has been sent to the Government details the likely effect on farmers decisions of current taxation proposals the price/cost squeeze in milk production lack of milk relief services and animal disease problems.

However the ICOS emphasises in its report that action by the Government and the Co-operatives can have the effect of continuing growth in milk production which has the major impact on the growth rate of agricultural output.

The ICOS points out that dairying accounts for over £500 million worth of output and that dairy cows are almost the sole source of calves to the beef industry. These two sectors represent 70% agriculture output—the report says.

The average rate of growth in milk output is 6.8% which is maintained since Ireland joined the EEC. The ICOS report states and an annual growth rate of 8% was possible over the next five years given the right conditions.

The multiplier effect of this level of growth would raise the annual level of agricultural output above the recent years and make the most important contribution to the country's balance of payments the report says.

RECOMMENDATIONS The recommendations which the ICOS report makes for action by the Government are based on surveys of nine co-operative society areas which reveal that intensive and developing dairy farmers have plans for cutting back milk production to the extent that no growth in total milk output can be expected.

The report recommends that the Government amend its current taxation proposals by— 1 Removing the restriction on depreciation allowances 2 Removing the tax on recent years' other non-income related taxes, present or proposed not taken into account as tax paid on accounts 3 Introducing a free depreciation allowance for breeding stock and for stock increases 4 Directing the Revenue Commissioners and the Farming Organisations to produce a set of standards for Farm Tax Returns in the next few years.

The ICOS also recommends that the growth in milk output be maintained the Government should— Assist co-operatives in the co-ordination and provision of services to relieve the demands of the dairy farmer on social and family circumstances. Assist in the training of specialist dairy operators and other farm contract specialists. Protect in Dairy Farmers through its own efforts and its negotiations in Brussels from the continuing erosion of margins implicit in high inflation and a policy of price increases.

Increase the cost effectiveness eliminate the disruption and increase the efficiency of the Disease Eradication programme. TAX IMPACT WILL REDUCE GROWTH Mr T J Maher President of the ICOS commenting on the survey and the ICOS recommendations to the Government said that the Co-operatives had invested massively in the adaptation and re-organisation of the dairy industry over the last five years to gear it to compete in European markets. It was now undertaking an investment programme exceeding £30 million per annum he said.

A special 'Fire Fund Committee' was set up at the Ormonde Hotel Dungarvan last week under the chairmanship of Mr Billy Kyne, U.D.C. to raise badly needed funds to help out the young Dungarvan family left homeless after fire recently gutted their comfortable home and destroyed all its contents.

Mr and Mrs Bob Shead and their two young children Marie (8) and John (3) saw the home they had carried out so many improvements to at 28 Congress Villas left a charred ruin in the blaze leaving them with only the clothes on their backs after 16 hours.

Now members of the general public have come together to set up a committee through which it is hoped sufficient funds will be raised to reconstruct and refurbish the Shead home.

Prison Sentence For Man With Several Brushes With The Law

A Waterford city man who has had what District Justice W F O'Connell termed 'several brushes' with the law, was given two concurrent six month prison sentences when he appeared before him at Dungarvan Court.

Christopher Thornberry (40) of Castle Street, Waterford pleaded guilty to (1) between June 23 and 25 entering Coffey's Garage Melleray Cappoquin and stealing car accessories and tools valued £500 and (2) between June 3 and 23 at Dromore entering the lock-up garage of Oliver O'Hare and stealing property also to the value of £500.

Supt M English said the defendant was employed in the Villierstown area at the time and used his employers vehicle in the commission of the crimes. He had a number of previous convictions.

When Mr J P Gordon Solr pleaded to have the sentence suspended District Justice O'Connell refused and said he was considering making the two six month terms run consecutively instead of concurrently.

He has had several brushes with the law and must have known the consequences if caught for these crimes' the District Justice said. He also refused a defence application to defer the signing of the warrant for seven days to enable Thornberry to get his affairs in order but fixed recognisances in the event of an appeal. Supt M English prosecuted.

Building On Two Extensions At Ardkeen To Start After Christmas

Building on £140,000 extensions to the ENT and Ophthalmic units at Ardkeen Hospital Waterford, is expected to commence immediately after Christmas.

A tender for the combined contract is in the course of acceptance by the South Eastern Health Board. The extension to the ENT unit will be an overall 2,412 square feet which will give the unit an increase of eight beds. There will also be three new treatment cubicles and a minor operations room and a small theatre area extension.

One sound proof room will be provided for examination purposes and the extension will include increased space for the out patients waiting area. There will also be three consultants' offices in anticipation of the arrival of a third ENT consultant who has been approved for appointment.

WAITING AREAS The area of the extension to the ophthalmic unit will be mainly an extension of the outpatients waiting area—an expansion of over a thousand square feet. The overall bed increase will be two and there will be an increase in consultants' offices from one to three. There are presently two consultants working in the ophthalmic unit at Ardkeen and an application for a third is waiting approval.

The extension will also involve some internal re-arrangements' a hospital spokesman said and it is anticipated that there will also be some increase in equipment when the extension is completed.

# Waterford Make It Five-In-A-Row As John Treacy Dominates In Gluepot Conditions

John Treacy had little to prove when the 22-year-old Waterford runner home on a short track from Providence College quickly established his superiority and retained his individual title at the Inter-County Cross-Country Championships over a gluepot like course in Fermoy last Sunday. However the victory set many thinking happily about Paris in the Spring and the Irishman's prospects of taking the world title for a record third successive year.

It was an occasion for extra satisfaction among Waterford athletic followers as they witnessed their county score a record fifth successive team triumph with Gerry Deegan also showing his great consistency in making it yet another 1-2 in the individual event. Indeed it might well have been a Waterford 1-2-3 but for a gritty and determined Cork man John Hartnett who gave further evidence of his return to full competitive health by taking third place ahead of John's elder brother Ray Treacy with Kingsston Mills of Dublin having his finest race ever to take sixth ahead of Donal Walsh.

**WEXFORD JUNIOR**  
There was something to shout about too by Wexford followers as they saw Andy Ronan become the first winner of the junior title in impressive style but only after tragedy hit the favourite Brian O'Keefe of Dublin who dropped out soon after the start. He was taken to hospital by ambulance suffering from what appeared to be severe stomach cramps. However the big crowd of approximately 2,500 came to see the world champion and they were not disappointed. Many of them seemed to run almost as far as the senior 7 1/2 miles in order to get better views of the champion as he cut his way through the twisting 'W' shaped course which demanded great strength and stamina as it had been turned into near quagmire through recent heavy rain.

But Treacy has shown in the past that he can take these conditions pretty much in his stride and the race had no sooner gone the opening half mile when John had already begun to open up a lead at the front. That advantage grew to 45 seconds at the end. Afterwards Treacy said he did not feel absolutely in top form during the race. I felt a little sluggish and was bothered so to speak by the wind. It was colder too than I thought but

I think the race has done me a lot of good. However at no stage during the race did Treacy give any indication that he was exactly punishing himself any more than he had to and indeed seemed to ease off over the last of the five 1 1/2 mile circuits. Behind him the battle for the minor placings was always interesting until Deegan sorted out the silver medal at half way and Hartnett won a tremendous victory over Ray Treacy and Donal Walsh to grab the bronze.

**EARLY LEADER**  
It was young Paul Moloney of Limerick who led in the early stages but at two miles Treacy had opened up a 12-second gap on Deegan who was closely tracked by Hartnett. Robert Costello Ray Treacy Jerry Kierman (Kerry) Walsh, Mills, Moloney and three Limerick men Neil Cusack Pat O'Callaghan and Mick O'Shea.

A circuit later Treacy's advantage had grown to 18 seconds with Deegan now running on strongly in second spot. Ray Treacy was having a private battle against Hartnett and Kierman but Costello could never quite get into a striking position for the medals. Already Waterford had established a 12 points lead over Limerick with Brendan Quinn having a fine run and equally that of young Derek Grant and Tom Aspell back from Arkansas.

**LOCAL RUNNER**  
Hartnett looked like having to be content with fourth place midway along the final lap as Ray Treacy had opened up a gap of about 15 yards. However the local runner responded to the encouragement of his many admirers and he battled on to get on terms. Then he raced away from the Providence College student to take third and put himself right in line for a return to the Irish team for next year's World Championships. That was only the second race I have finished since June of 1976 and really I felt much better than when I won the Cork Championship recently said an obviously pleased Hartnett. Waterford really carved up

the opposition in the end and they defeated Limerick most comprehensively by 32 pts (96-64) with Cork taking third. Kerry having their best performance in many years by taking fourth place and in the process defeating Dublin for the first time ever.

As in the previous three years Waterford supplied the first two men home country cross-country champion John Treacy leading his great rival Gerry Deegan over the line with 31 seconds to spare after a gruelling 7 1/2 miles on a rain-soaked course. And it was nearly being a Waterford 1-2-3 as with just under a mile to go Ray Treacy was in third position but was beaten in the run-in by John Hartnett of Cork and had to be content with fourth place. The next Waterford athlete home was Brendan Quinn who secured his best ever position in this race by coming in 11th and then came the baby of the team Derek Grant only just out of junior ranks for a fantastic run to finish 20th. Our final scoring athlete was Tom Aspell who ran very well all through to take 25th position.

When the skippers were originally charged at the October Court each elected to go on trial by Judge and Jury at the Circuit Court and the State Solicitor then stated that the books of evidence would then have to be prepared

On Wednesday week last when the cases were again called Mr E P King Solicitor who appeared for all the defendants stated that he had just received the books of evidence and had not had an opportunity to study them He requested that by agreement with the State Solicitor that the cases be adjourned to the next court to be held on January 9 District Justice O'Connell granting the adjournment said that he would then decide whether prima facie cases against the defendants had been established

### Joint Committee To Probe Sports Complex Possibility

The possibility of establishing a sports complex and other sporting facilities in Waterford City and County are to be explored by a joint committee to be set up as a result of a decision taken at the monthly meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan last week

The decision followed a proposal made by Cllr T Healy a member of the National Sports Council to arrange a joint meeting with Waterford Corporation and the City and County Vocational Education Committees to discuss the matter

Cllr Healy suggested that the County Council nominate three members to the Committee and that the Corporation and the two Vocational Education Committees be asked to nominate three each The Committee would probe the possibilities of establishing a sports complex in the county and indoor sporting facilities in Waterford City and in Dungarvan

We owe it to the young people of these areas to do this he said and if we don't make a move now we will never get it

Cllr W Kenneally TD seconded the motion

Mr C A O'Connor Co Manager pointed out that in the past Dungarvan Urban Council had taken a very keen interest in this and he felt they should be included in such a committee

It was agreed to also request Dungarvan Urban Council to nominate three members to the Committee

Members of the County Council nominated to the Committee were Cllr T Kyne Cllr T Healy and Cllr J Casey

### The Ethnic Joke As A Means Of Preserving Self-Confidence

BY Dr Anthony Clare in "The Irish Medical Times"

The fascination of ethnic jokes has been brought home to us Irish in a somewhat painful and id occasionally offensive fashion during the past few years

Speculation concerning the rise of the Irish joke in England tends to concentrate on the British reaction to the violence in Northern Ireland and the British need to distance deny and reduce the sense of threat they feel from Irish people and Irish affairs

Yet the ethnic joke is older than our relative troubles Passing through Dulles Airport in Washington recently I spotted "The Complete Book of Ethnic Humour" written by one of America's most persilious and compey humourists Larry Wilde a book which through its remarkable collection of ethnic and racial jokes do so much to clarify the appeal and the function of the genre

LAUGHTER IS THE OIL

Ethnic humour is very much part and parcel of the American culture. Wilde endorses the notion of ethnic humour "When we laugh we cannot kill, maim or commit crimes If love is what makes the world go around laughter is the oil which keeps it from groaning or squeaking Nietzsche put it slightly differently however

"Man he wrote is the animal most capable of suffering and he had to invent laughter to preserve his sanity Of course there are other views of humour It has been regarded as sinister aggressive subversive and degrading as well as uplifting

throughout the centuries such writers as Chaucer Rabelais Shakespeare Swift Cervantes and Shaw have used humour to poke ridicule and fun at excess and company

But ethnic jokes while often humorous owe more to the tradition of the wisecrack that usually exaggerates without anything about a particular person or thing According to Wilde the following joke told around Southern California, exemplifies the true substance of humour in that it encompasses no less than four races and three religious groups

Why is Sunday morning the best time to be on the Los Angeles Freeway? Because the Catholics are in church. The Protestants are still asleep.

The Jews are in Palm Springs. The Indians are restricted to the reservation. The Chinese are stuffing for tunc cookies.

The Blacks are stealing hot cars. And the Mexicans can't get their cars started

THE PUT DOWN JOKE

The most popular kind of joke is the put-down joke with its characteristic traits of a particular group. The person telling the joke wants you to believe that these traits are true. In the joke you hear certain recognizable ethnic characteristics are conjured up. Though these traits are not true they are familiar and we laugh even though we know that the "barked rest" has no basis in truth

But what about the fact that the ethnic joke reinforces and solidifies stereotypes about races and cultures which are untrue and which are actually damaging to the self-esteem of Irishman the mean Scotsman the lecherous Frenchman the megalomaniac German?

Will it return to that very question later, but the moment I contact myself with noting that in the United States the very gags that poke fun at Poles (Did you hear about the Polish who got drunk and she had a little moron?) He went back nine months later and she had a little moron?) are also told about the Irish Blacks Puerto Ricans and Gypsies Swedes Finns Arabs and Indians

Indeed stupidity is an ingredient of jokes which appear to have a truly international repertoire. Did you hear about the Italian who stayed up all night studying for his urine test? As Wilde points out it often us' depends on where you live Around San Francisco Polish jokes are called Portuguese jokes In Canada they refer to the residents of Newfoundland in South Dakota they are Norwegians jokes In Britain, such jokes are told about the Irish In Ireland they are told about Kerry men

IN SELF-DEFENCE

One is always on the lookout for a good English joke as a sort of weapon with which to equip oneself in self-defence Wilde interestingly enough does not have many There are few English jokes that do indeed focus on that aspect of Englishness which it is difficult to remove from the stereotype You English are just too fat served" said the American "Nonsense" said the English man "Why I rowed for Cambridge some years ago and I knew all the other fellows very well-except one he was away on the bow

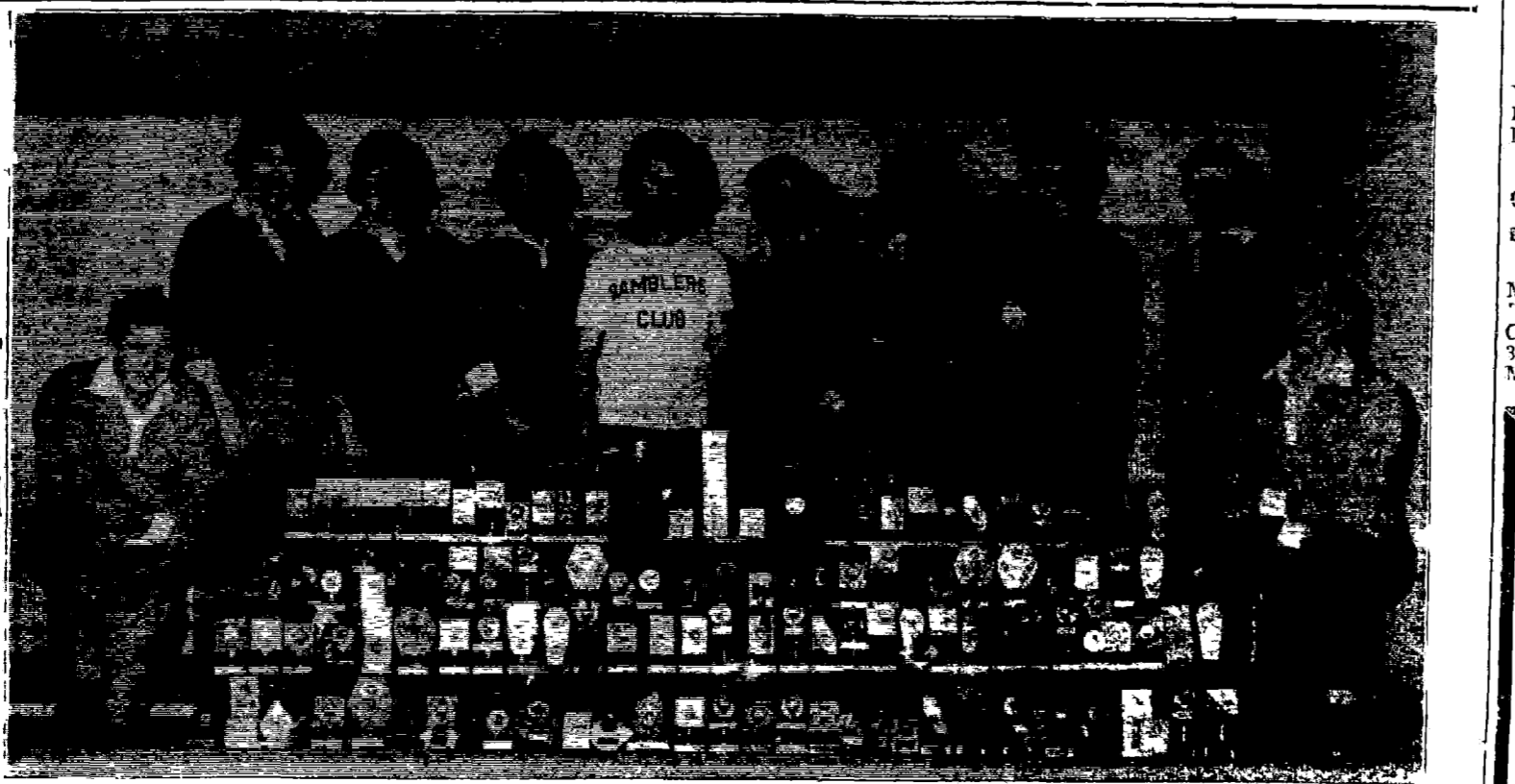
