IS THERE A SIGNIFICANCE?

Last week-end the Fianna Fail Party held two social functions in Dungarvan—one on Friday night and the other on Saturday night.

The Friday night function was from what I could see mostly the gathering of the Comhairle Dail Ceantair while that on Saturday night was in the nature of a celebration by supporters of the newly-appointed Minister of State Jackie Fahey.

For some time past there has been a divergence between the officers of the Comhairle Ceantair and the fact that this divergence still exists was quite evident over the week-end as members who were present at the function on Friday night were conspicuous by their absence from Saturday night's celebration and vice-versa. Is there a significance or not in the situation?

IT WAS IN SEPTEMBER 1899

In recent weeks we have been writing about the holding of the first Races held in Dungarvan at the close of the last century. Our comments arose from a minute book passed to us by Mr John Cartwright which recorded the first meetings of the newly-formed committee held in 1899. I was unable to find among the recorded minutes the actual date on which the races were held but now thanks to Mr Mickey Landers the popular publican whose licensed premises at the Square is the centre where sporting topics are generally discussed the problem has been solved.

Last week Mickey passed me a copy of the "Waterford Star" dated September 23 1899 which, among other things, carried an advertisement for Dungarvan Flat and Hurdle Races (under I.R.A. Rules) to be held at Killosera, within half-mile of Dungarvan on Monday 25th September 1899.

The advertisement went on to give full details of the Committee and the various races and the conditions under which they were to be run.

It read as follows: "Judge—J F Williams Esq Handicapper—V J R Dunbar, Esq, Bachelors Walk, Dublin, Sta ter—John Wall, Esq, Clerks of the Scales—Messrs Michael Power UDC and Patrick Tully, Clerk of Course—James Hayes Esq J.P.C.C. and CUD Co, Hon Secretaries—Patrick Evans and J J Morrissey, Treasurer—Munster and Leinster Bank—Stewards—Thomas Power, Esq J.P.C.C. and UDC James Hayes, Esq, J.P.C.C. and CUD Co, P F Morrissey Esq, M.D, John R Decker Esq, W C Crean Esq, M.D C J Curran, Esq J.P. Major Maunsell J.P. and W E Cartwright, Esq Committee—Michael Power, UDC, Patrick Landers, Patrick Tully, John Sheehan J O'Neill, Thomas Barry, James Wall Editor and Mansfield Michael F Casey and Denis Ryan."

Details of the Card for the meeting then were given with the first race starting at 1 o'clock. The Traders Plate of 11 sovs, second horse 1 sov out of the plate. A weight for age hurdle race with penalties and allowances. Distance about two and a half miles. 3 years old 9st 7lbs, 4 years old 10st-7lbs 5 years old 11st 6 years old and aged 11st 10lbs Entrance 6 Penalties—winner of a race value for £10 from the 1st March 1899 to the 1st September 1899 to carry 7 lbs extra of two races 14 lbs, of three or more 21 lbs Allowances—all maiden horses and fillies allowed 7 lbs.

The second race timed for 1.30 was the Dungarvan Plate of 20 sovs with the second horse receiving 2 sovs out of the plate. It was an open handicap hurdle race of about

Council Calls For Withdrawal Of Charges Against Drift Net Fishermen

On a day when three more Irish fishing trawlers were arrested off the South-East coast by the Navy's "Crest" vessels in what drift net fishermen regard as an official stepping up of the herring ban war against them, politics were cast aside on Monday by the members of Waterford County Council who were of one voice in calling on the Government to withdraw all charges now pending against the country's drift net fishermen.

In fact the whole constitutionality of the EEC ban on herring fishing in the Celtic Sea has been called into question by the council several of whose members at Monday's meeting accused the Government of callously depriving hundreds of genuine small time drift net fishermen of the right to earn a living.

THE WAXIES DARGLE WRONG AND UNJUST

The action of the Government in depriving these drift net fishermen from earning a living is wrong and unjust and indeed in pursuing the present policy the Government and the EEC Commission may well be acting outside the Constitution. Deputy Collins said on the one hand the fishermen were being denied the right to earn a legitimate living while on the other hand they were not being offered anything by way of financial compensation.

Deputy Collins said he was now calling on the Government to suspend its present approach to the drift net fishermen to declare its intention to withdraw all charges currently pending against them in relation to herring fishing and that some scheme of financial compensation be devised in the event of fishermen being unable to discontinue present policy.

Seconding the proposal Mr A Deasy TD Fine Gael's former Fisheries spokesman said the whole premise under which the Government and the EEC was acting or this issue was highly questionable and his real information was that herring stocks in the Celtic Sea were being depleted by drift net fishing on the scale presently being carried out by Irish fishermen.

Council Accepts Engineer's Recommendations For Dungarvan Bridge

The parapet walls of Dungarvan's historic Causeway bridge which links the town with Abbeyside will have to be demolished if cantilever footpaths are to be provided for pedestrians. County Engineer Mr D J Hally told this week's meeting of Waterford County Council when the meeting voted acceptance of Mr Hally's recommendations in the matter.

Mr Hally said that with the demolition of the parapets of the existing bridge it would be extended out by cantilevers at either side providing six or eight feet wide footpaths for pedestrians. He was satisfied they could come up with something that would not take from the attractiveness of the existing bridge which was presently a great danger as far as pedestrians were concerned.

The County Engineer said he hoped to proceed with the work by year end. There would be a 100% grant contingent of course on getting the money. He also proposed to provide traffic islands outside the courthouse and also at the Strandside South junction in the interests of greater pedestrian and traffic safety.



Residents Association Picket Council Meeting

Uniformed gardai were on duty outside Dungarvan Court-house on Monday afternoon as placard carrying protesters picketed a meeting of Waterford County Council, which inside the Council's Planning Department was accused of granting full planning permission for a quarry development near Tramore in "unprecedented haste"

The meeting was peacefully picketed by members of the Ballyknock Residents Association, drawn from forty-five households in four townlands in the area of the proposed quarry development. Planning permission for which has been granted amid a wave of public protests to South Eastern Enterprises Ltd. Kill, Co. Waterford

The protesters spent more than two hours parading up and down the footpath outside the courthouse entrance. All carried placards some of which declared "Who Has Pull in Waterford County Council" and "Homes Before Quarries"

At the Council meeting the decision to grant planning permission for the quarry development came under concerted fire from all quarters. Three members of the Residents Association addressed the meeting and the Council's legal adviser Mr M. M. Halley Solr was also in attendance

The Chairman of the Residents Association Mr. John O'Connor referred to the swiftness of the decision to grant planning permission for what he termed "this massive quarry development" which had been decided in a matter of ten days and the residents felt the decision to grant full planning permission for this monstrous development was taken in total disregard for the residents of the area and also for nearby Tramore as a tourist resort

TOTAL OPPOSITION
Mrs Kay Flavin informed the meeting that there was total opposition among all 45 householders in the immediate area to the proposed development, not alone to the nuisance caused by the quarry development which would include blasting operations and drilling but also it would seriously devalue their property

A third speaker, Mr Jim O'Brien spoke of the traffic hazard the development would create and it would add to the dangers that already exists on this "death trap" road. He was calling on the Manager to seek a High Court injunction to prevent the company from proceeding with the development of the quarry in contravention of the Planning Act

Cllr P. Cahill who introduced the deputation said all the residents were now in very angry mood and it was very difficult to blame them. In the past people had been refused planning permission to build bungalows on this road and now the go-ahead had been given for massive quarry development. It just didn't add up he said

Mr W. Kennedy T.D. said in his 15 years on the Council it was the first time he had known a planning application to be dealt with and granted in ten days. "There was unprecedented haste in dealing with this application. Deputy Kennedy said and he wasn't at all happy about it

When several other councillors also expressed their dissatisfaction with the way things had been handled County Manager Mr C. A. O'Connor, said it was true to say that the application was dealt with in ten days having been received on December 14th. Permission being granted on December 21st. The Manager went on to say however that for almost two years before that the company had been having discussions with the County Engineer when it was made quite clear that permission would not be granted for the development with an access at Ballyknock. Finally planning permission was granted in accordance with the maps presented and giving planning permission they had taken cognisance of the fact that in olden days a quarry operated in this area and already that there were similar operations in other parts of the county

APPEAL LODGED
Mr O'Connor said the Council operated a quarry at Woodstown which was about 265 yards from the nearest house and the old quarry at Carroll's Cross was approximately 300 yards from the nearest house. The proposed quarry at Ballyknock was some 600 yards from the nearest house. It was now understood that a planning appeal had been lodged with An Bord Pleanála and they must now await a decision by that body

The Manager assured the members that any recommendation of work at the quarry by the company pending the outcome of that appeal would result in the Council issuing prosecutions. He denied that the particular application had been dealt with in unprecedented haste pointing out that the planning permission for the proposed airstrip had been granted on 13 days. "I didn't hear any criticism of that," Mr O'Connor said

Deputy Kennedy said there was no point in comparing planning permission for an airstrip and for a quarry development that would involve blasting operations

Finally however the chairperson Cllr T. A. Kyne said they could only await the outcome of the planning appeal at this particular point in time
