Rate Restriction Will Cause Job Losses

Mr C A. O'Connor, County Manager told members of Wa-terford County Council at their monthly meeting in Dungarvan last Monday that the decision of the Minister for the Environ ment to limit to 10 per cent the amount by which this year's rate can be increased over last year would create a serious cash shortfall which would result in job losses among the 390 strong Council workforce He added that these losses would not be confined to any one section but would be 'right across the board'

There had been no response from the Department to the Council's previous request for an additional financial subvention and the actual position will not be revealed until the Council's estimates meeting is held to-day (Thursday) when the County Manager will make an official announcement


