With reference to the recent killing of three people on a train in the North, please allow me some of your space to comment I was very dismayed at the outcome of the funeral of Kevin Delaney who was carrying the bomb when it exploded pre-maturely In this age of recon-ciliation Christian unity forgiveness, etc., for which our church leaders repeatedly call. I was most surprised to see that three different Catholic priests refused Kevin Delaney a Christian burial. I wondered whether this was official church policy, and on reading this morning s interview in the "Irish Press by T P O'Mahoney with 'a theologian," unfortunately it seems to me to be so

This policy would not seem so bad really - not unless the Catholic Church so hypocritically applied double standards in respect of this My point is this shortly before Kevin Delaney's funeral a Catholic UDR mans body was allowed into a Catholic Church with a Union Jack over his coffin I do not think that any honest person needs to be toid of the torture, brutality and carrying out of Britain's "shoot to kill ' orders carried out daily by members of the U.D.R., RUC and British Army in the North It is on record that they have been given 'shoot to kill" orders and there is an endless list of victims of these orders of which we will never perhaps hear Yet any of the members of these forces who die, just because it was a State order to them to kill — they will be allowed a Christian burial in a Catholic Church if they so wish This ambivalence would seem to be strengthened by what this nameless theologian speaking in the 'Irish Press" has to say (and I quote)

Many people reading this will have personal memories of the excommunication of republicans by the Catholic Church during the 20 s etc and who have since become heroes Don t forget the church s view that hell was not hot en ough nor eternity long enough for the Fenians in their day Kevin Delaney, the priests

argued offended the law of God and for this reason was denied a church burial Could anyone te'l me how many people are buried without at some time having offended God s law ' Who is perfect? Did St Joan of Arc who allowed herself to be burn-ed at the stake for her religion She died for the cause of her religion Kevin Delaney died for the cause of his country's free-

As the republicans who were condemned through the ages by the Catholic Church are now seen as heroes so the day is coming fast when the likes of Kevin Delaney will be recognised as unselfish patriots and Dr Philbin and those three Belfast priests will be seen as having merely done the work of the

In conclusion let me say that it is morally wrong for church leaders to stand by the British in their occupation of the North In doing so as Father Des Wil son recently said they are in directly responsible for many deaths which will continue to take place until the Brits leave As a Catholic I find it regrettable that Kevin Delaney's widow (along with her 10 month old son, Sean Paul) has found she must leave the Catholic Church More regrettable still to
