Textile Recession Forces Seafield Gentex To Close Three Plants

Seafield Gentex Limited the Ycaghall Lased Textile Manufacturing Group is to close three of its operating Companies - Westport Textiles Limited, Westport Co Mayo Beechblaw Knitting Mills Walkinstown Co Dublin and Seafield Fabrics Limited, Youghall Co Cork.

The closure of the three plants has been taken against a background of accumulating losses and deteriorating market prospects for the producers from these mills since the opening of the recession. The situation has been further aggravated by increasing costs particularly labour, energy and interest charges. The closure will involve 400 redundancies. The appropriate Government Agencies have been informed with a view to attempting to secure alternative employment for these areas.

The market for the products of these Companies has been seriously eroded by the heavy dumping of large quantities of American man-made fibres into Europe made possible by cheap energy sources in the US. The American imports into Europe enjoy a price advantage of up to 30%.

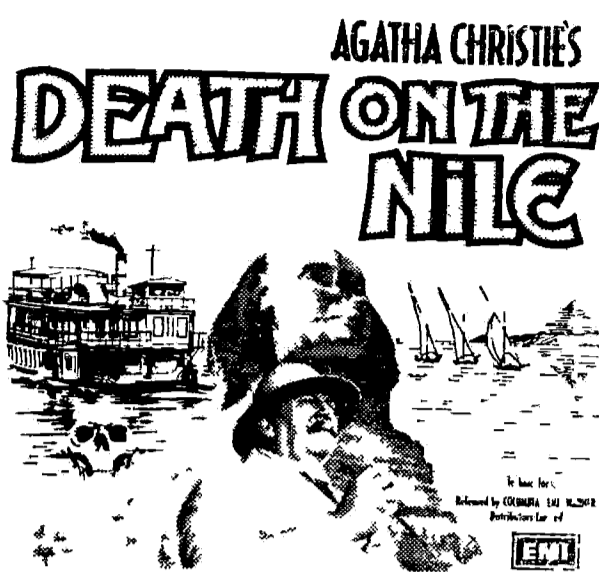

Remember to catch a fish with a fly on one's own tying adds immensely to the pleasure of angling. Anyone who has the use of his hands and time to do this in a short space of time. As one becomes an expert after fumbling with silks and feather it is known that some anglers actually can tie the fly they require in a few minutes at the riverside. The equipment required is not that expensive — a supply of tweezers a small vice some gold and silver wire silks threads tying threads some wax varnish feathers such as the fisherman's darling the wings of the starling blackbirds wings dark partridge wing feathers brown partridge tail feathers brown mottled hen rouse teal small and medium a supply of cork and hen feathers red and furcace etc. Generally speaking trout are in condition from mid April to the middle of September. It depends upon the nature of the river and the season. Trout are

in condition until they are in a state of insect food. The fly tying class at the Central Technical is well supported and it is a real live of industry and all young and older anglers are encouraged to bring their own flies of their particular fancy. Mr John Deegan, who is a great angler himself is in charge and there is no doubt he knows all about fly tying. This is the second year of this class's existence. The price of beet will be calculated on the basis of the following formula — 1 EEC basic beet price for Ireland 2 Pulp element 3 Sugar sharing element The Company guarantees this formula will yield a minimum of — £27/tonne at 16% sugar content £24.94/tonne at 15% sugar content £22.88/tonne at 14% sugar content The average sugar content in the past season was 14.75%. It is hoped that the formula will yield in excess of the above amounts following the finalisation of the Spring Farm Price Review and any adjustments that may take place in the Irish representative rate during the year. Agreement will be reached between the Company and the growers representatives in early September 1980 regarding the actual price of sugar beet to be paid during the campaign and also the selling price of pulp. For the 1979/80 sugar beet crop the formula was expected to yield £26 per tonne for beet at 16% sugar content. A review of the beet price formula is due to take place in August next and it is expected that a further 50p/tonne will be paid under the sugar sharing element.

EARLY DELIVERY ALLOWANCE The Early Delivery Allowance will be increased by the percentage increase agreed at the farm price review and will be applicable in the following periods — (1) For beet delivered up to and including 27th September, 1980. (2) For beet delivered from 28th September 1980 to and including 4th October 1980.

STORAGE PREMIUM The Company have agreed to continue the payment of a storage premium. This payment will be at the rate of 6p/tonne net paid beet delivered day for each day on and from 1st January 1981.

CONTRACT CONDITIONS Agreement was also reached on detailed changes with regard to sampling taring and sugar determination of the crop for payment purposes. It is expected that contracts will be available shortly and details regarding signing will be notified to growers. Further details can be had from your local B.V.A. or Sugar Company personnel.
