PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

YOU CAN'T WIN 'EM ALL

The euphoria of the previous week on the prospects of John Treacy winning the World Cross Country title for the third time in succession in Paris was flattened by a pan-cake last Sunday afternoon as the Villierstown lad failed to live up to the expectations of the huge Irish following which made the trip to the French capital with high hopes of seeing him repeat on the Longchamps course what he achieved in Glasgow in 1978 and in Limerick in 1979. In the run-up to last Sunday's event most of the sportswriters and commentators of the Irish daily papers displayed a rather hysterical approach, the type of sensationalism which, unfortunately is now all too common where most of the major sporting fixtures are concerned. So high you go so far you fall and because of this hysteria the deflation of those in the Irish camp was all the greater when John Treacy and indeed the other members of the Irish team failed to turn in the performances expected from them.

Now it's all over but for me the outstanding memory of the 1980 championship will be the composure and courage which John Treacy displayed following his defeat. He made no excuses nor indeed did he accept any even though the words to do so were practically put into his mouth. He admitted that conditions were good but added simply that it just was not his day and that you just can't win 'em all. How typical of this most promising young man whose name at the early age of 22 has already won world wide acclaim.

In my own experience of sport I have often heard it said that a champion is only as good as his last win and in this respect fans and followers can be quite cruel without obviously meaning to be. John Treacy slipped quietly out of Paris on Monday last to prepare for an inquest which must have lasted through the week into the reasons for his emphatic defeat on Sunday. In the cruel fashion of sport and particularly of international sport, as I have said above the manner of his going contrasted starkly with the excitement of his arrival in Paris on the previous Friday. But John was no less dignified in defeat than in his hours of glory in Glasgow and Limerick and remained impressively composed.

Defeat never comes easily when you are defending a title and to that extent Sunday's race was a pretty shattering experience" was what he told newsmen but with a mature philosophy for one saying he added "But sport is as much about losing as winning and when the initial disappointment has subsided I will analyse the race and hopefully, take away some useful lessons from it. The Olympic Games have always been my main objective for 1980 and I now hope to be able myself to the task of preparing mentally as well as physically for Moscow.

At 22 John is still only maturing as a cross country athlete and in that context last Sunday's defeat can only prove a temporary setback in a career which I am sure is destined to provide many more golden hours.

County Rate Struck At £12.92

At their third attempt on Friday last in Dungarvan Waterford County Council unanimously adopted a rate of £12.92 in the £ for 1980. This is an increase of £1.17 over last year's figure and is within the 10% limitation allowed by the Minister for the Environment.

At the outset the Co Manager Mr C A O'Connor told the Council that although they had received nothing in writing he had been informed by telephone from the Department that the Road Grants structure would show an increase of 15.14% for 1980. This information indicated that they would receive a total grant of £1,084,000 which was an increase of £136,000 over last year.

Mr O'Connor then suggested that the Council adopt the rate of £12.92 as submitted and when the County Engineer received official notification they would again come to the Council who would then decide as to what was to be done. He said that the increase in the grants as notified would be said ease the problem in regard to probable unemployment among the Council's workforce as originally feared.

The Manager added that on-going discussions had taken place with the main union (AT & G WU) involved and were continuing and he acknowledged the constructive manner in which the Union had approached the discussions.

It is said Mr O'Connor a matter for the Council to consider and determine the allocation of the finance available to the various services but it should however be stressed that this power of the Council is subject to constraint and that the discretionary area is limited by legislation and past decisions.

Deputy Austin Deasy said that they all welcomed the increase in the Road Grants and he hoped that it would eliminate the possibility of any lay-offs of Council staff. Does it solve the problem of this was the question asked the Co Manager.

Mr O'Connor replied that they could not determine how the money would be spent as that was a matter for the Council. It could mean that some works which the Council members may want to have done would have to be cut but their aim would be to carry out such works that would avoid any unemployment.

COST ANALYSIS

Deputy Eddie Collins said that it was unfortunate to have to increase the rate this year by even 10%, as it mostly hit farmers who had already been hard hit by the budget taxation. He asked whether there were any cash surpluses from last year which could be used towards works which may now be proposed to be eliminated such as the amenity schemes. He thought that they should carry out a cost benefit analysis of the whole workings of the Council to ensure that there was no waste of the Council's resources from the bottom right up to the Co Managers Dept at the top. Asked by Cllr J A Walsh whether it would be possible to reduce the rate in existing circumstances the County Manager said that the estimates had been prepared in accordance

Pointing out that there was a grave shortage of money at present Cllr Goode said that they had been informed by the Co Engineer that he could do more work on repairing footpaths in the town if he only had the money. We could give him more for that work," he said but now we want to send delegates to Coventry and Brighton.

Cllr R A Walsh said that he would favour the sending of one representative rather than a crowd and he was supported by Cllr J Byrne who thought that it was worth spending money to send somebody to those conferences. "You can always learn something at these things" he said.

It was agreed with Cllr Goode assenting to send a delegate to the Coventry Conference and in accordance with an agreement among the political parties on the Council where these trips abroad are concerned that they should rotate as they came up this was the turn of the Labour party who will now toss among its three members on the Council as to who will make the trip.

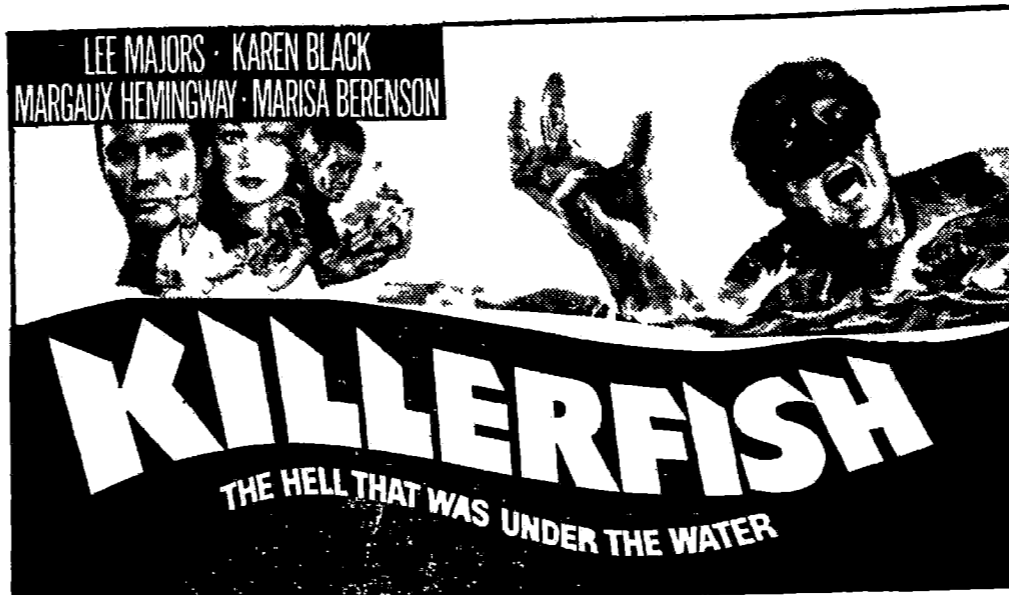
