



Fishing For Salmon

The Minister for Fisheries and Forestry Mr Patrick Power TD has made a bye-law en titled Salmon and Trout Conservation (Amendment) Bye-law No 612 1980 The effect of the bre-law combined with the statutory weekly close time prohibits commercial fishing for salmon and trout during the Friday and ending 6 am on the following Monday The period of closure replaces the threeday period from 600 am on Saturday to 600 am on Tuesday as existed since January

The purpose of the amendment is that while the same level of conservation is being maintained the more efficient marketing of salmon will be facilitated

Apart from this amendment the periods during which salmon fishing may be carried on are unchanged from those which were in operation in 1979
