## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

A MIXTURE OF JOY AND SADNESS

The past ten days in this County have been days of joy and tragic sadness for most of our people. The deaths of three of our young soldiers with the U.N. Peace Keeping Force in Lebanon have caused widespread grief and a great sense of outrage in the manner in which they lost their lives. The situation in the Lebanon has created a dilemma which unless the U.N. as a whole take a firm stand the safety of other members of the Irish UNIFIL Battalion remains in jeopardy. Our membership of the U.N. the E.E.C. and the other international organisations to which we belong demands that we give as well as take and in spite of the grief of so many families over the last week or so there appears to be no option but to go on. But our troops should not be allowed to remain sitting ducks for the trigger-happy militia men who now appear to treat them as enemies rather than peace-keepers and the government must maintain all the pressure it can command at international level to ensure this.

The second great tragedy of the week-end saw an entire family practically wiped out by fire which swept through their house in Fenit Co. Kerry and in which a father and five of his young family died.

But as always life must go on with the usual mixture of sadness and joy. The joy for Ireland came in the winning of the Eurovision Song Contest on Saturday night and for those of us nearer home here in Waterford, the winning of the F.A.I. Cup Final by Waterford on Sunday after a lapse of 43 years.

And so while our sympathy goes out to those who grieve our congratulations are extended to those who have won the trophies. As ever this world of ours continues to be a complex place to live in for while some are up others are very much down.

### COULD HE WEAR TWO HATS

After several attempts to fix an agreed date it now seems that Waterford County Council and Corporation will meet in joint session on Friday, May 2, to consider a proposal for joint Management for the County and City by one Manager.

Since the County and City Management Act came into force, the city had its own Manager while for a period in the beginning, Waterford and Kilkenny were jointly managed, but for a long time now each County has had its own Manager.

The latest proposal to amalgamate the posts of City and County Manager in Waterford arises from the retirement of Mr. C. A. O'Connor who has been our County Manager for almost fourteen years.

From what I can gather the majority of the City Council in Waterford would be opposed to the two posts being amalgamated and I believe the same view is also held by the majority of the members of the County Council. Nevertheless the joint meeting is now going to be held with both bodies to be represented by their full Councils.

With such an apparent divergence between the two authorities on the proposed merger it is difficult to understand why there should be any need for a meeting but there are a few members on both Councils who believe that the future administration of the County and City would be best served under a single Manager.

But despite whatever may be said in favour of such a proposal I believe that I am voting in the view of most people in the County in opposing the concept as I believe that the task of wearing

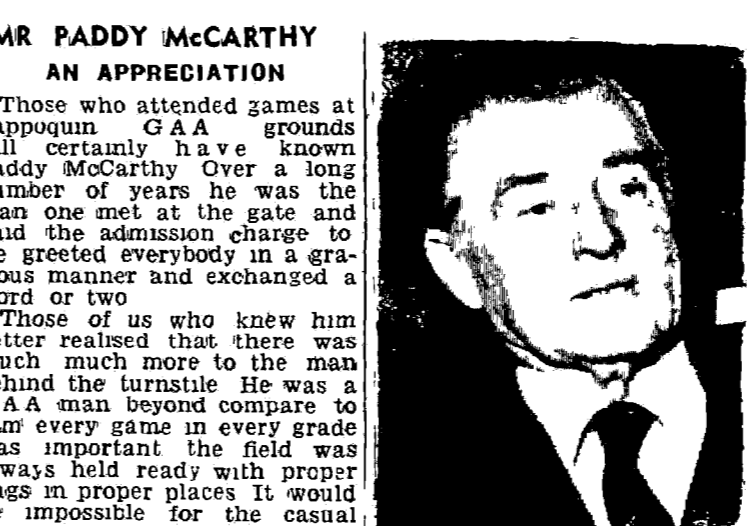

### JUST OVER 80 YEARS AGO

The first meeting of Waterford County Council was held in the Courthouse, Waterford on April 22, 1899 just 81 years ago last Tuesday and a very fine photograph in perfect condition, showing the members and officials who attended that historic gathering was recently shown to me. The photographer was a Mr. Poole with an address at 84, The Mall, Waterford.

The list going with the photo gives the names as follows seated (front row)—T. Harty, P. F. Walshe, Jas. Hayes, T. Power (Chairman), E. Nugent, J. V. O'Brien, Capt. Coughlan, W. Kiely, J. Duffin (Co. Surveyor) Standing (back row)—J. Morrissey, Charles Curran, W. Kearney, E. O'Shea, Matthias Walsh, J. Queally, J. Lawlor, T. Murphy (Press Reporter), P. O'Gorman, J. Kennedy, J. Flavin, T. Sullivan, R. J. V. Usher, Mark Smith, B. Wyse, M. Drohan, Major Stuart, J. McCarthy, J. Flahavan, Jas. O'Brien, A. McCoy (Solicitor).

There are no addresses given which would indicate the areas from which the listed members came or represented but consisted of 27 members at that time compared to the present 23 as comprised at present.

It is doubtful whether anyone might be in a position to give us more information about the membership of the first Council at this stage more than 81 years later, but it would be interesting if we could learn a little more about the men who formed the first parent administrative body in the County in 1899.

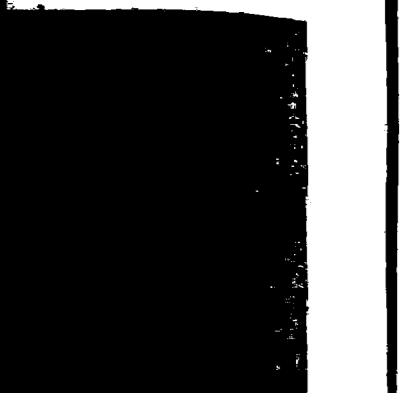

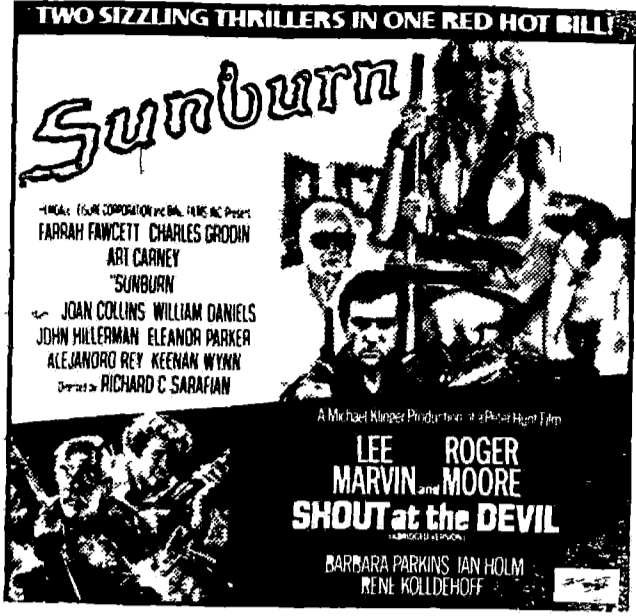
