Deputy's Representations On Coast Erosion
 Mr F. A. Collins T.D. has received the following letter from Mr Tom McEllistrim Minister of State Department of Finance.
 Dear Deputy
 I refer to your representations regarding coastal erosion at Ballyvoile and Whiting Bay in Co. Waterford.
 The Commissioners of Public Works advise that they have received proposals under the Protection Act 1953 from the Waterford County Council for coast protection works at various locations in the county including Ballyvoile and Whiting Bay.
 The preparation of a coast protection scheme for Ballyvoile under Section 6 of the Act has been sanctioned and the design work is in hand at present. A copy of the scheme will be sent to the County Council for their approval later this year. As the Whiting Bay proposal does not fully comply with the requirements of Section 3(1) of the Act the County Council have been asked to furnish a report setting out (a) the location and extent of the relevant encroachment of the sea (b) the extent of the land and other property being damaged or endangered (c) the works which may be practicable and desirable to prevent the continuance of the encroachment and (d) the estimated cost of the works. On receipt of this information the application will be listed for examination in due course. However due to existing conditions it would be some considerable time before such proposals could be reached for examination.

CRUELTY ALLEGATION UNTRUE SAYS CLOVER MEATS CHIEF EXECUTIVE

Allegations that animals had been treated cruelly at the Clover Meats Factory in Waterford during the recent work stoppage at the factory caused by industrial action taken by a section of the employees made at the April meeting of the Co. Waterford Committee of Agriculture were replied to at the Committee's May monthly meeting held in Dungarvan last Monday.

In the course of a letter to the Chief Agricultural Officer Mr. George T. Frost, the General Manager of Clover Meats Ltd. Mr. D. McDermott gave an assurance that no such cruelty took place at any time nor was there ever any risk that such cruelty could have taken place. On the contrary he stated the animals were extremely well cared for they were fed good quality hay daily with a good supply of clean water and were bedded on barley straw.

The letter went on to say the entire operation was supervised constantly by Mr. Condon of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals together with the resident Veterinary Surgeons of the Dept. of Agriculture and both of those independent bodies expressed their unqualified approval for the manner in which the livestock was handled.

Mr. McDermott concluded his letter by stating "I feel bound to say that the type of criticism voiced at your meeting however unfounded - when given sufficient currency and in the present climate can do nothing but damage to the reputation and interests of the Society. For that reason therefore I sincerely hope you will take the opportunity to acquaint your members with the true position at your next meeting."

Mr. McDermott concluded his letter by stating "I feel bound to say that the type of criticism voiced at your meeting however unfounded - when given sufficient currency and in the present climate can do nothing but damage to the reputation and interests of the Society.
