



The severe price/cost squeeze m agriculture is currently hitting livestock farmers very hard as they face a continuous escalation in their costs of production and a fall in the prices of their cattle and beef The delay in implementing the 1980, 81 Beef marketing has further aggravated unsatisfactory situation, stated Mr Seymour Crawford Chairman of the IFA National Livestock Committee in a state-

ment last week He said 'It is important that farmers continue to strive to reduce their costs of production and get better prices for their products By breeding the latter half of all dairy cow herds to Continental and/or large British beef bulls and all the beef cow herds to Continental bulls the quality of beef cattle in the years ahead will improve farm incomes will rise and the State and beef exports





These results were obtained from an analysis of approximately 8 000 accidents From this total, accidents were selected in which there were rear seat passengers — irrespective of whether they were injured or not The accident surveys covers 2,265 rear seat occu-

Most people are of the opinion that the rear seat of a car is a relatively safe place to travel and therefore seat beli use by rear seat occupants is not particularly motivated The results from these tests show that this is a misconception It is just as important for rear seat occupants to use a belt as it is for front seat occupants

JUST AS LARGE

"An analysis of this accident study material indicates that the risk of being injured in a rear seat occupants as it is for front seat occupants if they are not wearing seat belts' says Mr Hans Norin of the Volvo traffic accident research de

The report also shows that the injury-reducing effect of seat belt use by rear seat occu pants is just as large as it is in the front seat. For grown ups the extent of injury is re duced by 28 per cent if a seat belt is worn says Mr Claes Tingvall of TSV—Swedish Road Safety Office The equivalent figure for children at various ages under 114 is not less than 52 per cent

A large proportion of the approximately 5 000 rear seat occupants killed or injured each year in Sweden would have sustained lighter injuries or would not have been miured at all if they had been wearing a seat belt

It is primarily the injuries to the head that are reduced by use of a seat belt Where children were not wearing seat belts mouries to the head were the most common type of injury sustained

In Sweden about 25 000 car occupants are killed or injured each year Approximately 5 per cent of these occupants are travelling in the rear seat Although about 75 per cent of the Swedish car population is equipped with rear seat belts less than 5 per cent of rear seat occupants use them The fre-quency of use is approximate twice as high m cars which have static three-point seat

The frequency of use varies in relation to the type of traffic environment A greater number their seat belts when travelling on a motorway than when






