Causeway Bridge Controversy Continues

Dungarvan's Causeway bridge built 165 years ago by the then Duke of Devonshire and regarded as one of the tinest archi tectural bridges of its kind in the country continues to be the cen tre of controversy and now Waterford County Council is to pets of the bridge

Although the Council members voted only two weeks ago against a move to upset the pro posals of the county engineer 101 the bridge-proposals which in addition to the removal of the parapets also provide for two cantilever pedestrian foot-- there was a further resolution before this week's meeting from the National Monument Advisory Committee

That resolution urged the Council and the Minister for the Environment to fund only such alterations to the bridge as will preserve its 'architectural unity and integrity 'The resolution also urged that pending further of traffic on both approaches to the bridge and on securing a LEGAL OPINION

County Manager Mr C A O Connor however recommend ed that before the resolution was even discussed they should first get legal opinion on it The Council had already taken a categoric decision approving the proposals of the County Engin eer for the bridge and an attempt to upset those proposals by way of resolution had also failed only two weeks ago 'Any proposal now in my view from a body other than the County Coarcil is not a proper one and I belie we should seek legal advice as to its standing in this


