



# Augustinian Priest

The death has taken place after a long illness of Fr Jerome Madden aged 69, one of the most prominent Augustinian priests in Cork in recent





As requested at a previous meeting the County Engineer Mr. J D Hally submitted a re-port on the transport of hazardous substances through the county at the July monthly meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan last

In his report Mr Hally stated that the relevant Act was the Dangerous Substances Act of 1972 and the only substance under that Act for which any regulations were made to dake was petroleum

The report then went on to state "I am not very clear as to the Council's exact legal position in this matter It seems that we have the authority to appoint Inspectors and to issue licences but in the absence of precise regulations and guide-kines the position is at best vague and in the absence of staff-for which we have no funds available anyway the implementation of any scheme would be impracticable




