## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### BLEAK PROSPECT FOR CAPPOQUIN

The announcement last week by the Board of the Cappoquin Bacon Factory Ltd that the slaughtering of pigs was to cease immediately and that other production would be transferred to their factory in Cork over the next two months has come as a major shock for the people of Cappoquin. Down through the years the Bacon factory has been the backbone of the town's prosperity and now with this announcement of the cessation of production at the factory with the consequent loss of over 160 jobs, the prospects for the town are indeed bleak.

Since the closure announcement on Wednesday of last week a number of meetings have been held in an effort to hear of what appears to be the inevitable and on Saturday night last the Chairman of the Company Mr John Murphy and the Minister of State at the Department of the Environment Mr Jackie Fahy, TD, together with the other deputies for the Constituency Mr Billy Kennelly, TD, Mr Austin Deasy, TD, and Mr Eddie Collins, TD and local members of the Co. Council attended a meeting at which various aspects of the closure and the consequences it would have for the whole economy of the town and indeed of most of West Waterford were discussed.

All the suggestions put forward, including one to revert to the old practise of slaughtering and quartering of pigs, hinged on the need for money as it was pointed out that the operators at the factory this year had run into substantial losses. Finally it was agreed that the Minister of State and the three other Constituency deputies should seek a meeting with the Minister for Agriculture Mr Ray McSharry in an effort to mount a rescue operation to at least keep the factory going until a suitable alternative industry to the town could be secured to absorb the workforce. It was hoped that such a meeting could be arranged for this week.

Commenting on the closure on Tuesday last the Chairman of Waterford County Council, Deputy Deasy stated that he had been shocked by the announcement particularly at its suddenness as the loss of such a high labour content industry in West Waterford where emigration and unemployment have been rampant over the years must give rise to grave public concern. He expressed the hope that as a result of the deputation to Mr McSharry the plant would be kept in operation until such time as an alternative industry could be provided. "What we need now," the deputy said, "is breathing space because the announcement has taken everyone, including the IDA and the Departments of Agriculture and Commerce and it's going to take some time before the IDA can erect an advance factory or before a suitable alternative industry big or otherwise can be got off the ground."

He added that the members of the deputation had hopes that the Government through the agency of For Teoranta, would provide the necessary cash to continue present operations at the factory until a suitable alternative industry is found. The meeting also appointed a special Town Committee representative of all interests in the district to deal with the serious situation.

MAHER'S BLUE PRINT TO FIGHT RECESSION
Mr T J Maher MEP in a statement said that if all sectors of the community in the national interest were prepared to work together to improve industrial relations eliminate unofficial strikes increase productivity and promote an awareness of the importance of purchasing Irish produced and Irish manufactured goods providing they were of equal value and quality in preference to imported ones he felt confident we could overcome the challenge facing the economy now and would emerge from the present recession with a healthy economy capable of creating full employment.

He added that he could not recall any alarm being expressed at our massive food import bill or any suggestions as to how we might reduce it.

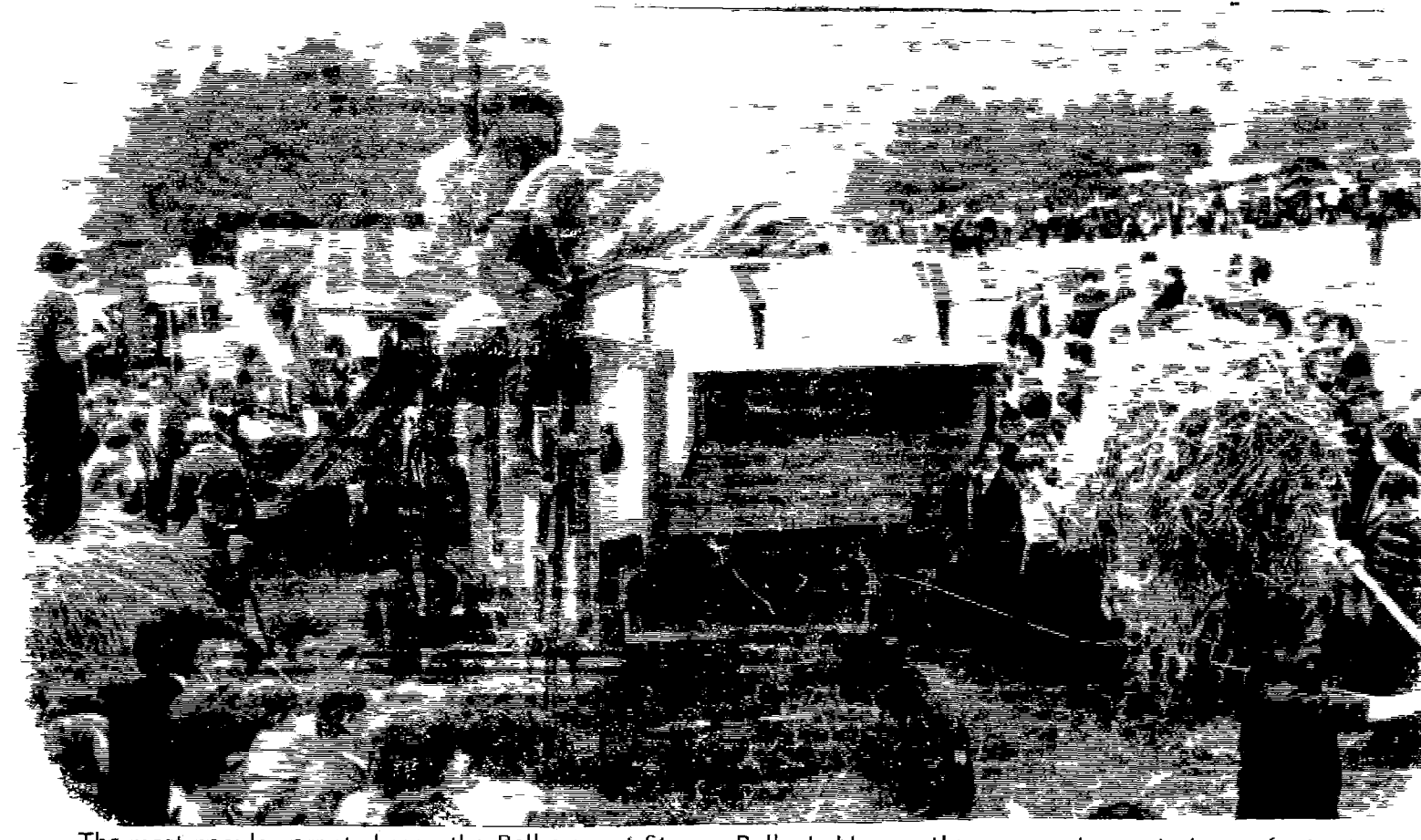

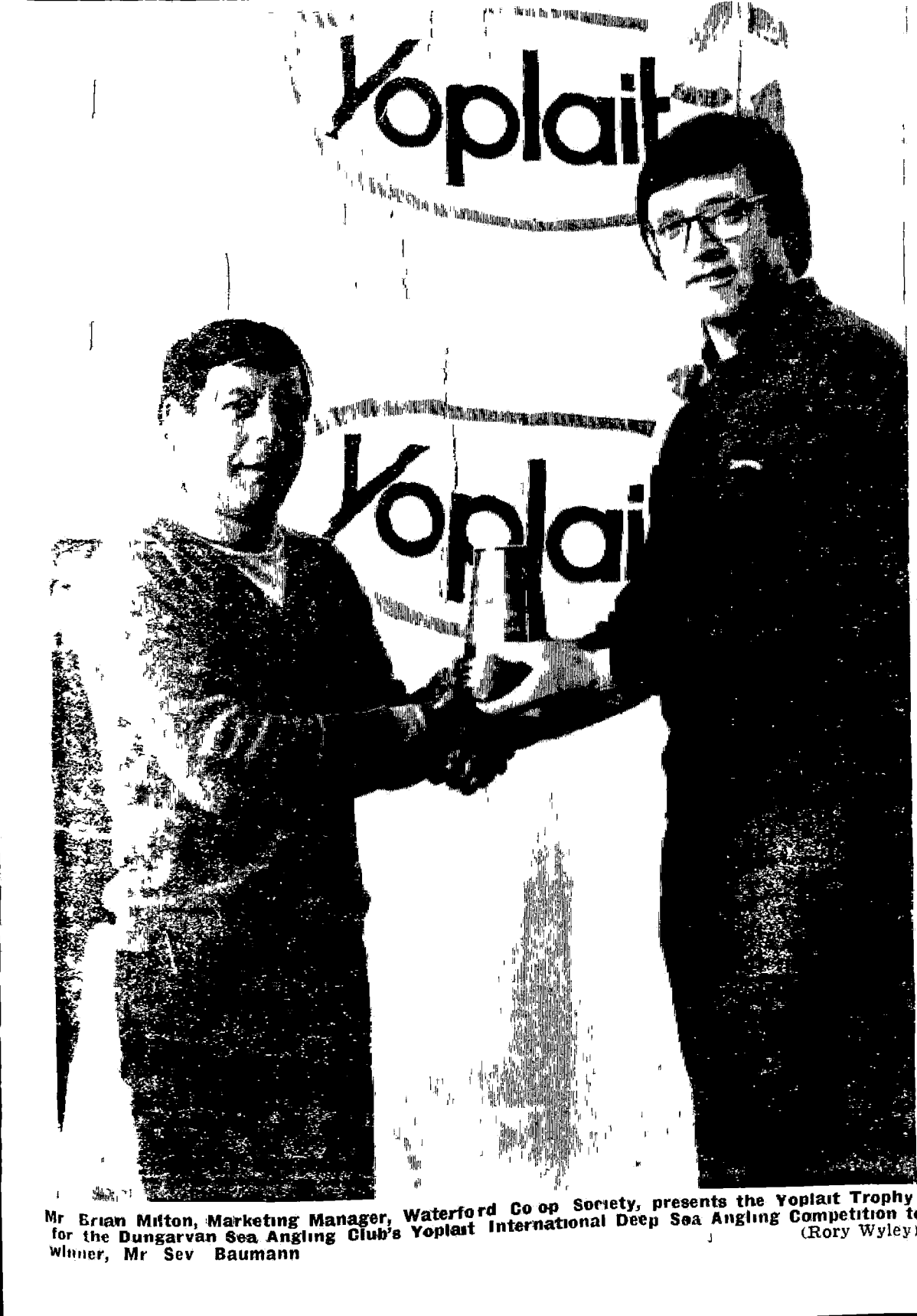

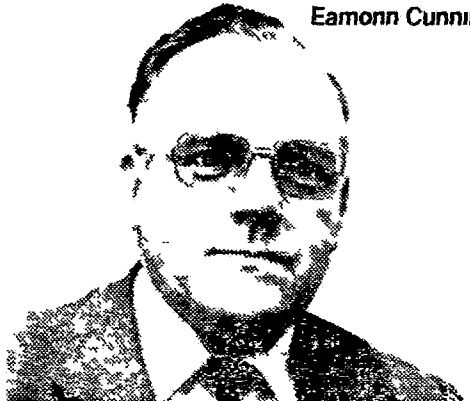
