

COMMON ORGANISATION OF THE MARKET FOR SHEEPMEAT

(Council EEC Regulation 1837/80)

Under the above Regulation which comes into force on 20 October, 1980 a system of compensatory premiums will be payable on good quality ewes suitable for breeding. The amount of the premium will depend on developments in market prices under the common market system It is estimated that it will be in the region of £7 per ewe in a full marketing year but this amount could vary up or down depending on actual levels of market prices The first complete marketing year will commence on 6 April, 1981

Special transition arrangements for the premium will apply in the period 20 October 1980 to 5 April 1981 The premium for that period should be about £3 50 per ewe
