## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### GREEN LIGHT FOR CASEY TV RENTALS

The appeal by An Taisce and others to the construction of a small unit on the top of Seefin Mountain by Casey TV Rentals, Dungarvan, in connection with their plans to provide multi-channel reception in Dungarvan has been rejected by An Bord Pleanála which has confirmed the planning permission previously granted by Waterford County Council to proceed with the project.

Notification of the Bord's decision was received by Mr Sean Casey principal of Casey TV Rentals, on Wednesday morning of this week and he passed the good news to us at once.

The only matter outstanding now to bring everything to a satisfactory conclusion is the licence from the Minister for Posts and Telegraphs for the hook-up and it is expected that there will be no further undue delay in this regard.

Much curiosity was aroused in various areas of West Waterford during the last couple of weeks by a helicopter which was observed flying around at low altitudes.

### NEW BILL TO CONTROL STREET TRADING

Details of the new Casual Trading Bill 1980, the purpose of which is to provide for the control and regulation of roadside and street trading were circulated to Dail Deputies last week and nowhere will the new Bill be more welcome than in Dungarvan where the problem of street trading has been a major issue of contention in recent years.

### DEVASTATING FLOOD

A 36-hour non-stop downpour of rain which fell in North-West Cork and Kerry last week-end created devastation along the entire valley of the Blackwater from its source way back in Ballydesmond Co Kerry to its final right angle turn to the sea at Cappoquin. The town of Malinbeg was worst hit with thousands of pounds worth of damage being caused when the town was hit by a flash flood on Saturday night/Sunday morning. Fermoy also felt the force of the flood waters but fortunately to a lesser extent.

The legislation once it passed will be enforced by inspectors appointed by the Minister for Industry, Commerce and Tourism and the local authorities. The Gardaí will have the same power as inspectors and in addition, powers similar to those they already have under the Street Trading Act, 1926 to arrest without warrant persons who contravene the Act and to seize and detain goods being sold by offending traders and any vehicles and containers being used in connection with the trading.

A person convicted on indictment for the offence of trading without a licence or permit will be liable to a fine not exceeding £5,000 together with, in the case of a continuing offence, a fine not exceeding £250 per day or 6 months imprisonment or both the fine or fines and the imprisonment.

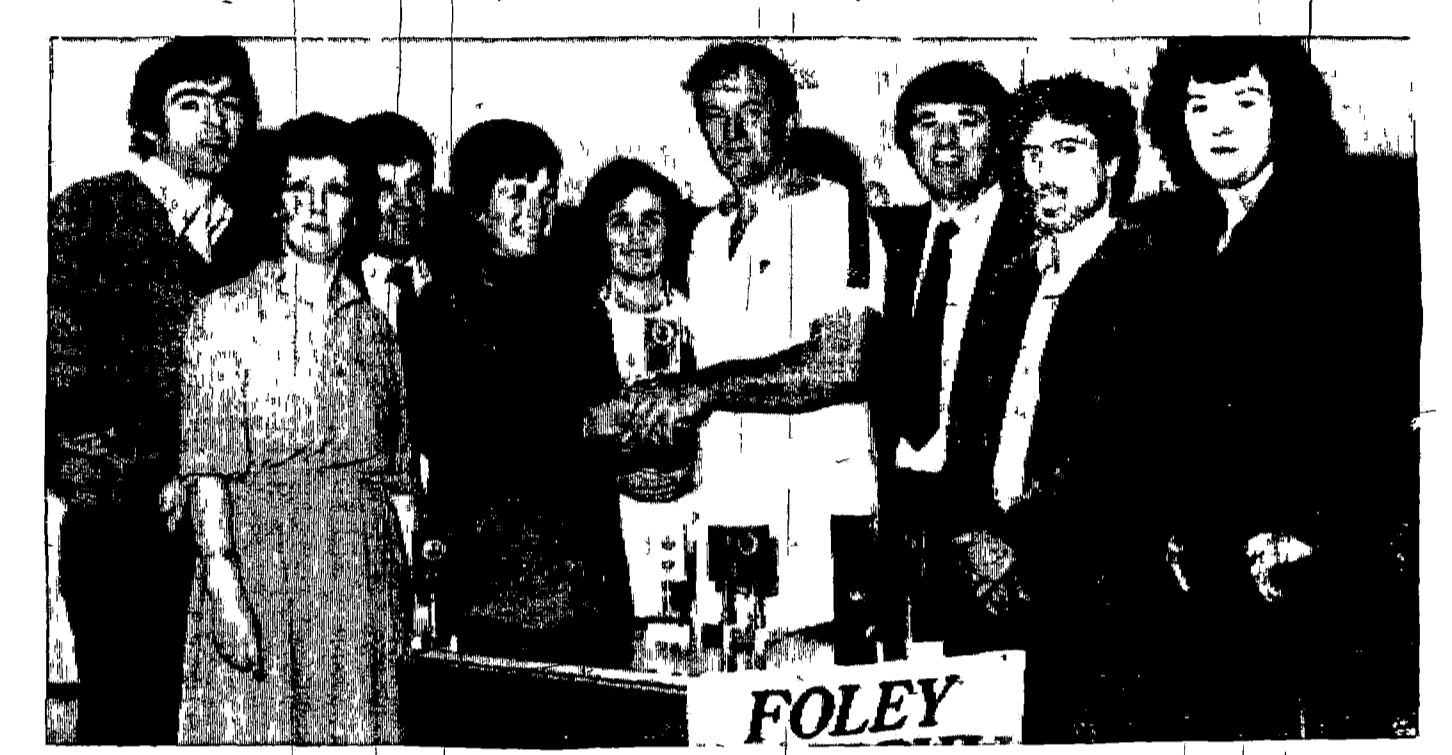

Late-comers forsook the coffee and paid for the many cakes which well-wishers had donated - even the flower arrangements went in the same manner.

A feature of this collection has been that the individuals concerned have shunned all publicity for their committee in the true sense of doing good - their left hand does not know what their right hand is doing.

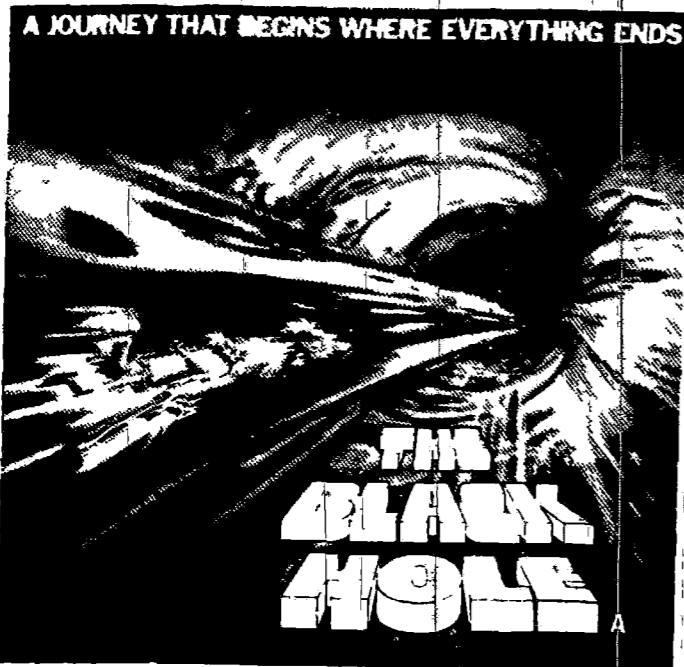

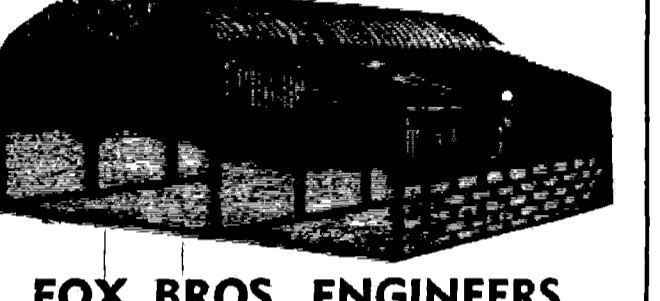

I.F.A. WEEKLY BULLETIN

SPECIAL MEASURES NEEDED ON FARM PRICES. An IFA and ICMSA delegation led by Mr Donald Cashman IFA President and Mr R. McKea IFA Deputy President met the Minister for Agriculture, Mr Ray McSharry last week to discuss the need for special measures over and above the EEC Common Farm Price increases to compensate for the additional inflation level in this country.

The delegation informed the Minister that based on cost increases already borne by Irish farmers an immediate price increase of seventeen percent over and above the EEC Common Price increase for next year is necessary.

The delegation made it clear to the Minister that the flat rate Brussels price increase would be more than adequate for farmers in countries with low inflation such as Germany, the Netherlands and Belgium.

It was agreed to set up a small committee representative of the Department of Agriculture and the Farm Organisations to evaluate proposals for an alternative to the Irish Green & Yellow.

This committee had its first meeting on Wednesday morning and will continue to work so that its evaluation and recommendations are available to the Government and to the farm organisations within two weeks.

THE CONCEPT OF STATE FARMING MUST BE CONTESTED. The concept of State farming must be contested, said Mr. Con Ryan, Chairman of the National Rural Development Committee in a statement issued last week.

Mr Ryan's remarks arose from reported statements made at the recent Labour Party Conference where Labour's agricultural spokesman is said to have demanded that 'bogs - from which Bord na Mona had extracted the turf - should be put into the public sector for the benefit of Bord na Mona workers.'

State farming doesn't work even in the most totalitarian countries, said Mr Ryan, and there is no reason to believe that it will work here. Neither does working on the bogs in a professional or industrial capacity automatically qualify anyone to manage the land remaining after Bord na Mona operations have ceased.

WINTER SAFETY CAMPAIGN FROM N R S A:

Details of a nationwide winter safety campaign were announced by the National Road Safety Association at a reception in the Hibernian Hotel on the eve of the introduction of Winter time.

Speaking at the launching of the campaign, the Minister for State at the Department of the Environment Mr Jackie Fahey TD stated that, of all road users pedestrians are the most vulnerable category during the winter months. Of 277 pedestrians killed last year, 138 were killed during the hours of darkness. In all 1537 pedestrians were injured on Irish roads in 1979. There is little doubt that the non-visibility of pedestrians to other road users especially drivers of cars is a major factor in these unfortunate accidents.

The Minister for State stressed the value of reflective materials in improving visibility at night. He drew attention to the fact that there is now a wide range of reflective products available in addition to the reflective fluorescent armband. These include retro-reflective schoolbags anoraks incorporating reflective material and specially designed jerseys for motorcyclists and cyclists.
