# PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

## LOCAL AUTHORITY MEMBERS EXPENSES

In a letter under date December 9 each local authority in the country has been informed that the Minister for the Environment has had under review the rates of travelling expenses and subsistence allowances of members of local authorities and in the light of this review that he will raise no objection to the payment of increased amounts to take retrospective effect as from September 1 last.

Under the new allowances each member of a local authority whose official residence is five miles or more from the place of the meeting may provided the local authority concerned so decide be paid a rate of 32p (up from 26p) per mile for each mile travelled from and to his residence to and from the place of meeting.

This travelling allowance would mostly benefit members of the County Council who have to travel over five miles to a meeting. In the case of a member whose residence for example would be 20 miles from the place of meeting it would mean a travelling allowance of £12.80 per meeting under the new rate.

In addition where absences from home in excess of three hours are necessitated by attendances at meetings, members will be entitled to a subsistence allowance of £7.10p and if this absence extends to seven hours or longer this allowance goes up to £9.80.

The paragraph which covers members of Urban Councils, states that where any member of a local authority whose residence is less than five miles from the meeting place, the authority may by resolution decide to pay an inclusive travelling and subsistence allowance of £10 per meeting.

This in fact means that Urban Councillors who do have to travel more than five miles will now receive a basic £10 per meeting allowance for each meeting which they attend.

The necessary resolutions approving of the payment of the new rates have been passed by both the County and Urban Councils.

Apart from these travelling and subsistence allowances County Councillors are seeking further allowances to cover postage and telephone costs and towards this end have formed a new Association which is at present lobbying the Minister for the Environment to secure these.

Well there are only a few more shopping days left and in the knowledge that Christmas comes but once a year, the shoppers are out in force with the same traditional attitude that the sky is the limit.

At two meetings of separate public bodies within the last month reference has been made to the noticeable prevalence of rats.

The first reference was made by Cllr. Jerry O'Brien at the November monthly meeting of the County Committee of Agriculture in the course of a discussion during which the Fox Destruction Scheme operated by the Committee, was mentioned. Cllr. O'Brien stated that at present the countryside was infested with rats and he expressed the view that because so many foxes had been destroyed under the scheme the balance of nature had been interfered with to the benefit of the rat population. Cllr. O'Brien pointed out that on average each fox killed seven or eight rats each day. Perhaps he opened we have gone a little too far in having so many foxes killed off.

The second reference to rats although in a more jocose manner, came at the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night when Cllr. Dec Goode stated that the prevalence of rats at the Causeway Abbeyside had again been drawn to his attention. A rat problem did exist in this area some time back but it appeared to have been solved. However, Cllr. Goode told his Council colleagues last Monday night that rats were back there again stronger than ever. Perhaps he remarked they may have gathered there now to celebrate the retention of the Causeway Bridge.

One would be excused for wondering what relationship there could be between the bridge and rats.

But joking apart there has been a noticeable increase apparent in the rat population and there has hardly been an occasion day or night in recent months that I have not seen several rats as I have been driven on the roads. They present a serious problem and it could well be that Cllr. O'Brien was correct when he said that the killing off of so many foxes has allowed the rodent numbers to increase to the present extent.

Judge Diarmuid P Sheridan was told at Dungarvan Circuit Court when James Walsh Cooineanear, Dungarvan successfully brought a malicious injury claim against Waterford County Council. The plaintiff said in evidence that when he returned to his car after attending a match at Fraher Field the rear window of his car had been smashed in and all four cars parked side by side were damaged. This damage was clearly malicious injury, Judge Sheridan who awarded the applicant a decree for £86.95 and costs.

£153 Decree For Break In At Shop

Patrick J. Early Grattan Square Dungarvan was awarded a decree for £153.54 and costs at Dungarvan Circuit Court arising out of a break-in in his premises on the night of September 6th/7th last. The plaintiff who brought a malicious injury claim for the amount against Waterford Co. Council, told the court that riders broke into his shop through the roof that night and in doing so damaged a section of the roof as well as iron gutters. Miss M Fawcitt B.L. (instructed by J.F. Williams and Co. Solicitors) was for the applicant and Mr M.M. Halley Solr represented Waterford Co. Council.

Circuit Court Decrees For Dungarvan Publicans

Two Dungarvan publicans successfully brought malicious injury claims against Waterford County Council at Dungarvan Circuit Court. The court was told that one claim arose out of the smashing of the public house window with a concrete block and the other out of the hurling of an empty beer barrel through the front window of the licensed premises. James Ducey Main Street awarded the full amount of £579.41 claimed in his action together with costs and expenses.

He told the court that he had a quantity of hay under tarpaulin in his back garden and it was completely destroyed by fire on the night of August 25th. Edmond Daly in evidence said he was in bed that same night when his snore awakened him to tell him that a large partitioned shed at the back of his house was on fire. The shed was destroyed as were the contents in hay and harnesses. His home was not more than sixty yards from where the other fire had taken place that night.

Commenting that both fires were clearly malicious Judge Sheridan awarded decrees for the full amounts claimed by both plaintiffs together with costs and expenses.

WATERFORD GETS LION'S SHARE OF I.D.A.'s JOB APPROVALS

The IDA's Small Firms Annual Report shows that job approvals from small firms in the South East Region for 1979 amounted to 1,057 or 26% of all jobs approved by the IDA in the South East Region. This compared with 601 jobs which were approved for small firms in 1978 or 16% of total job approvals in that year. These projects involve fixed asset investment of £8.55m and an IDA grant commitment of £2.97m.

Mr Frank Burke Regional Manager South East Region highlighting the significance of the results explained that the South East Region's performance was second only to the East Region which includes Dublin City. The number of projects and job approvals had been more than doubled and the IDA grant commitment almost tripled and he paid tribute to the County Development Teams for their valuable assistance.

He added that the indications for the coming year showed that the target for 1980 would be achieved. This favourable out-turn is expected despite the effects of the recession and higher credit policies showing the flexibility of small firms in difficult economic conditions.

Mr Burke said that the IDA had placed an increased emphasis on Small Firms as a result of the Small Firms Programme. The number of new ideas had been introduced during the year to strengthen the operation of the programmes dealing with Small Firms.

The staff of the IDA's Small Industries Division was increased and Mr Len Bell was appointed to the County Development Teams for their valuable assistance. A new project library is now located in the IDA's Regional Office in Waterford to enable promoters to investigate product manufacturing possibilities.

GO WATERFORD. In 1979 the IDA approved a total of 22 small firms with a job potential of 379 a fixed asset investment of £2,582,300 and a grant commitment of £1,234,949. In 1979 Waterford the lion's share of total job approvals and greatly exceeded the 1979 target for the County. Indications are that the 1980 job approval target for small firms will also be achieved.

Construction work was completed in 1979 on the new IDA Cluster Units in Waterford City and this has also been almost totally let to small firms. The 1980 target of 300 for Co. Waterford will be exceeded judging by results to date.

Foley & Murphy Motors Ltd, Youghal Road, Dungarvan were awarded £200 arising out of the damage caused to three cars parked in the forecourt of their premises on the night of October 5th/6th and no filing cabinet in the offices into which the raiders broke.

David Flynn Springmount Dungarvan was awarded £95 for damage caused to a window in his home on the night of July 19th. The applicant's wife Mrs E. Flynn told the court that she had just retired to bed when she heard a loud bang and on investigating found that a rock had been hurled through the front window.

Adam F. Torrie Ltd trading as the L & N Superstores was awarded a decree for £194.97 arising from the smashing of the glass window at their supermarket at Main Street, Dungarvan on Sept 12th. The court was told that the culprits helped themselves to six bottles of gin.

A break-in at "partners" boutique at Main Street, Dungarvan on the night of May 23rd/24th last resulted in a decree for £153.99 being awarded to the proprietor Mr. Colin Carthy. The plaintiff said the large front glass window was smashed and damage amounted to £2181.99. However compensation was paid leaving a sum of £153.99 still outstanding. He did not think there was any hope of further compensation being paid.
