VOX POPULI

This week for the second time within six months the country has been reduced to a near state of paralysis because of a further strike, this time official, by the petrol tanker drivers. That such a situation should again arise within so short a period is absolutely ridiculous and it is time for the public to shout out loud and clear that it is time to put an end once and for all to this step-dancing by strong minority groups and their employers.

If this strike is allowed to continue then it is the majority who will suffer as workers in other spheres will have their jobs placed at risk while small self-employed concerns, farmers and others will face the hazard of being pushed to the wall. At a time when the economy of the country is in deep recession, people have enough to contend with in order to survive without having to put up with this further harassment as a small group with power and muscle seek to press their demands irrespective of the consequences of their action.

After having been held up to ransom by a number of such small groups in recent years it is now time for the long suffering silent majority to shake themselves from their lethargy and to raise their voices in loud and strident protest. It is up to the Government to govern and to ensure that the day to day running of the country is not crippled by strikes like this. The public should not forget that they have the power to elect or reject and they should show that they have this muscle by making it quite clear to all political parties—government and opposition—that they have had enough and will tolerate this ridiculous position no longer.

THEY WILL DO IT ON FRIDAY THE 13th

Whatever else may be said about Waterford County Council it can now be said that they are not in anyway superstitious as they have lived Friday the 13th to do what they should have done on Monday the 23rd—strike the County rate.

The Council did purport to strike a rate on February 23 when by a 13-10 vote they decided to strike the same rate as last year. But in so doing they reduced the County Manager's estimate without showing where the reductions should be made and insofar as they failed to do this, their decision, as I pointed out last week, was not in accordance with the law.

A further special meeting of the Council was called for last Monday at which the County Manager was to submit a report on the procedures followed at the meeting of the 23rd. I did not realise until Monday, though, that this meeting was to be held in Committee and that the Press were to be excluded from the proceedings. It was, in fact, held behind closed doors and was attended by Mr M. M. Halley.

However I have been able to gather enough information about what went on to put the pieces together. At the outset objection to the holding of the meeting in camera was voiced by Councillor C. Curran who acted as spokesman for his Fianna Fail colleagues on the Council. He made it clear that the public would see the holding of the meeting behind closed doors as an exercise in "horse trading". When this was followed by a proposal that the meeting be adjourned it was agreed, as a compromise, that statements from Mr Halley and from the County Manager be read without any ensuing discussion and that the Estimates Committee be re-elected for Friday, March 13.

TRAGIC DEATH OF TALLOW AND WATERFORD HURLER

Raymond O'Brien (23), West Street, Tallow, an outstanding Waterford inter-county hurler, died tragically last Friday from head injuries sustained in a fall at the North Tipperary Hospital, Cork.

The accident happened only a few hours before he was due to be discharged. He had been heavily over Waterford Gael following the news of his death.

COMPLIMENTED BY DISTRICT JUSTICE

The first batch of prosecutions under the Dungarvan Traffic Bye-Laws were dealt with at Dungarvan District Court last week when the cases of 53 offenders who failed to pay on-the-spot fines were submitted to the Court.

For the town's new Traffic Warden, Mr. Jim Donovan, it was a first experience of Court procedures but having got the hang of it after a false start he went on to give the evidence of proofs in flying style so much so that when he had completed the list he was complimented by District Justice Humphrey Kelleher who told him, "you did that very well."

Having handled his initial Court appearance so well, Mr. Donovan will feel more at home at the Court on March 25 when a further batch of 94 offenders who have failed to pay their on-the-spot fines will be dealt with.

Incidentally it is of interest to note that in this matter, when on-the-spot fines are paid in at the Town Hall within the statutory period, the money goes to the Urban Council, but when the offenders persist in refusing to pay the Court, the fines then imposed go to the Department of Justice.

It is also of interest for such offenders to note that when cases have eventually to be dealt with by the Courts the fines then imposed are usually greater than those which are payable within the required period of time. This being so, offenders can only lose by not paying the fines to which they are liable on their vehicles.

CONSTITUENCY MOVES BY LABOUR PARTY

In preparation for the anticipated general election the Labour Party in the Waterford Constituency will hold a Selection Convention in Dungarvan on Sunday, March 22 at which a decision will be taken to nominate either one or two candidates for the election.

Dungarvan Urban Councillor Billy Kyne, following a period of indecision, has finally made up his mind to allow his name to go forward to the Convention as a prospective candidate and during the past week he has, in fact, been officially nominated by the Abbotside Branch of the Party. His nomination will receive the full support of the Dungarvan Branch.

Tramore Town Commissioner, Brian O'Shea has also been nominated as candidate by the Tramore and Waterford Branches of the Party but the man whom many expected might be the Party's standard-bearer in the city, Aid Tom Brennan, Mayor of Waterford, has officially notified the Party that he will not be seeking nomination.

The final decision as to whether the Party will put forward one or two candidates and in the event of one only, who that will be, will rest with the Selection Convention on March 22.

There was a rather unexpected upheaval at a Constituency Council meeting of the Party in Dungarvan last Saturday night when during a discussion on election strategy, Cllr. Tommy Wade, Chairman of Dungarvan Urban Council, announced that he could not feel it in his heart to back either two candidates or a candidate in the election. Declaring that he had become disillusioned with the Party he left the meeting stating he would go his own way in future. The walk-out came as a complete surprise to the delegates present at the meeting as there had been no previous indications, as to Councillor Wade's attitude.

Celebrated Golden Jubilee Of Ordination

We wish to congratulate Monsignor Bernard P. Mangin on Teaching the Golden Jubilee of his Ordination on February 28, 1981. He is son of the late Patrick and Margaret Mangin, Carrinagour, Lismore, and brother of Dr. W. F. Mangin, Wales, John Joe Mangin, Ballymacarby, Connell, Patrick Mangin, Carrinagour and the late John Hickey of Lismore.

He received his early education at Glencara National School and from there went to the Christian Brothers School in Lismore. In 1929 he went to boarding school at St. Mcherry and from there to St. John's College, Waterford in 1932 accompanied by the very sincere and close friend Very Rev. Canon Daniel O'Byrne, P.P., Carrinagour and Newtown, both of whom are today the only surviving member of their class in St. John's.

In 1928 he went from St. John's to the American College in Rome where he remained until he was ordained on February 28, 1931. He then returned home and he took for Minnesota in June of that year. His assignment was teaching at St. Mary's College, Winona, Minnesota where he remained for 9 years, at the end of which he was made Chaplain of the Diocese.

During this period he was conferred with Monsignor by Pope Pius XII and was then appointed Pastor of the parish of Albert Lea, Minnesota which he took over from the late Monsignor Jack Kieley, a native of Dungarvan.

During his stay in Albert Lea he organised the broadcasting of Mass each Sunday over the radio, thus being the first priest in the USA to accomplish this.

After he was appointed pastor of Rochester, Minnesota, where he spent 17 years, he was then appointed to Rose Creek, Minnesota where he is at this day.

With the help of God he hopes to cross the Atlantic for the 4th time this summer to spend a holiday at home in Carrinagour as he has been down through the years, with Tom and the girls Mary, Clare and Anne.

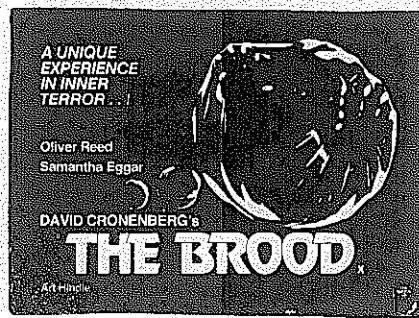

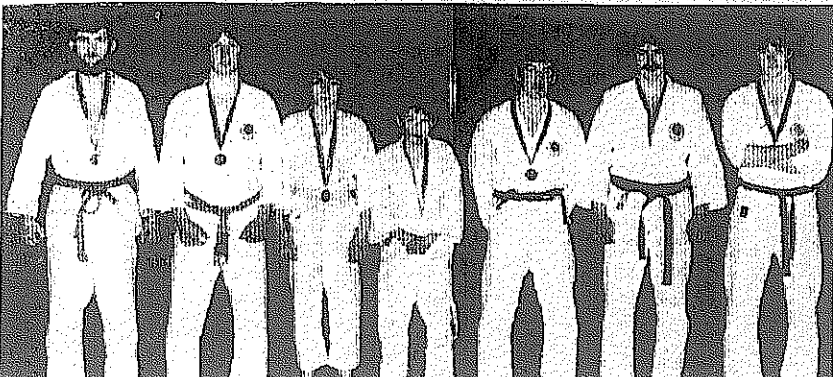

AGLISH AND CLASHMORE

Death of Mrs. C. O'Brien, Aglish — It is with deep regret that we record the death of Mrs. Catherine O'Brien (nee Milne), Ballinacorney, Clashmore — a member of a well-known family and a popular and respected figure, noted for her many amiable characteristics. Her demise is much regretted and we join in extending the sincere sympathy to her bereaved husband, sons, daughter, brothers, sister and other relatives.

The remains were removed to Aglish Parish Church and following Requiem Mass for the repose of her soul interment took place in the adjoining cemetery in the presence of a large and representative concourse of mourners, including public representatives, the Very Rev. Fr. P. Morrissey, P.P. and Rev. Fr. P. Fitzgerald, C.C. officiated.

There were many Mass cards and floral tributes. Confirmation — In Piltown Church, Most Rev. Dr. M. Russell, D.D., Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to the children of Ballycarra, Clashmore and Piltown schools.

The Late Paddy Parker — Writing in "Troop", Tony (a native of Aglish) paid a striking tribute to the memory of the late Paddy Parker, who died a few months ago.

Memories Of Ardmore — In the current issue of "Troop", a very interesting feature appeared entitled "Memories of Storied Ardmore" and contributed by Sighan Lincoln, O.S.

The article traced the history of the storied centre and referred a length to the Irish College, which existed there for about 50 years and attracted students from all parts of Ireland. Bord Fáilte bought the imposing building, later sold it and it was demolished in the mid-50s.

Reference was made to the fact that the first Rural Week of Mullinahone was held in the College in 1927 and the second one the following year as a result of those who attended the sessions were very few.

Early Mr. J. Fitzgerald — The death, at an advanced age, of Mr. Jeremiah Fitzgerald has caused deep and widespread regret. A native of Clonliffe, Co. Wick, he was a veteran of the War of Independence. 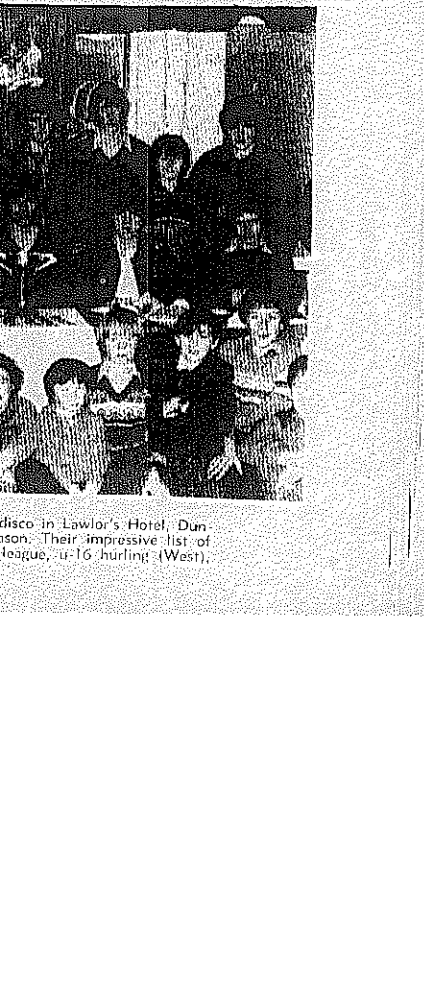
