PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

POLITICAL SPECULATION

Politics are very much in the air at present and speculation is rife about the date of the general election with many political commentators planning for a date during the last fortnight in May. The political parties are all busy getting themselves for action confident of success.

Here in the Waterford constituency the position is beginning to show that there will be seven or perhaps eight candidates seeking election to the four seats at present held as to two each by Fianna Fail and Fine Gael.

Fianna Fail are expected to have three candidates in the field and the only conjecture here concerns the third man, as Minister of State Jack Fahey and Deputy Billy Kennelly are certain to be automatic choices. It would appear at present that the third man will come from the city and while two or three names are surfacing regularly in this regard, the final choice will rest with the Party's selection convention.

Fine Gael have already endorsed their two sitting deputies Austin Deasy and Eddie Collins, and decided some weeks ago at a meeting in Dungarvan that only two candidates would be put forward. The latter decision ended the bid of County Councillor Katherine Bulbulia to be named as a third candidate for the Party but there is a possibility that we have not as yet heard the last of this. There are those, within the Fine Gael Party, who believe that had this decision been let to a secret ballot at that meeting, it would have favoured a third candidate, who would then, undoubtedly, have been Cllr. Bulbulia. There are whispers about the possibility of a third candidate has not yet been fully ruled out and that a draft from the top might yet put Cllr. Bulbulia into the race.

The Labour Party at their recent Election Convention in

Dungarvan plumped for a single candidate and by a single vote in an 18-17 split of the 35 delegates who attended, the 33 year old Dungarvan Urban Councillor Billy Kyne was chosen over Fr. Tom Commissioneer Brian O'Shea. The fact that there was such a small number of delegates present at the Convention, representing no more than nine branches throughout the entire constituency, clearly shows that the Labour Party and Councillor Kyne have a great deal of work to do if they are to make any kind of a fair showing at the election.

Their problem will not be helped either by the fact that Mr. Paddy Gallagher, who made such a strong stand at the last election as the candidate of Sinn Fein the Workers Party, will again be making a bid for a seat as much of his support in the city is reputed to come from what otherwise would be a Labour Party vote.

And so things are beginning to take shape in the Constituency and all that remains now is for the actual date for the election to be named. That is something which no one but the Taoiseach, Mr. C. J. Haughey, will decide and as stated before, he will select a date which will prove the most opportune to ensure that his Party will be returned to power.

IN A DIFFERENT ROLE

In attendance at the Court-house in Dungarvan on Wednesday last week was Mr. Charlie O'Connor, former County Manager. During his close on fourteen years as chief executive of Waterford County Council he was to be seen regularly in the Court-house where the meetings of the Council are normally held. But on Wednesday of last week, it was a sitting of the local District Court, held fortnightly on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month, which caused Mr. O'Connor to be present in his new role as Solicitor.

in the week following his resignation as County Manager on December 31, Mr. O'Connor who had successfully completed a law course, was presented with his parchment as a solicitor and he has since been practising in that capacity in Waterford.

Last week was the first occasion on which he made an appearance at a Court in Dungarvan and he was there deputising for the Solicitors of Dungarvan Urban Council, Messrs. Farrell & Morrissey, in a number of cases under the Traffic Bye-Laws of the Council.

These concerned the non-payment of on-the-spot fines for illegal parking and untaxed vehicles on which dockets had been placed by the town Traffic Warden Jim Donoghue during the months of September and October. In all they totalled over 50 cases and while some of the charges were withdrawn for technical reasons, and a few were dealt with under the P.O.A., fines ranging from £5 to £15 were imposed on the others with an additional £3 costs in each of these.

These fines should once again make it plain to motorists caught under these circumstances that it is cheaper to pay the on-the-spot fines rather than to let the offences be dealt with by the Courts.

VISIT BY PROPOSED TWINNERS

Last year following correspondence the members of Dungarvan Urban Council agreed to probe the possibility of twinning with a town in North-West France. In reply to an invitation from the local authority of Tullins, the town concerned, the local Council intimated their willingness to examine the position but since then the situation appeared to lie dormant as nothing more was done about it.

Now under date March 3, Ms. Nicole Allibe of the Tullins Twinning Committee has written to the Council listing the clubs and associations in her town and the manner in which exchanges to the mutual benefit of similar clubs in Dungarvan might be brought about.

According to the list, Tullins has an Association Football Club, a mountaineering and skiing club, a swimming club and a karate club and all these have expressed a wish to arrange exchange visits with similar clubs in Dungarvan.

On the cultural side, Tullins has a music club, a youth club, a major sports group and a Festival Committee and six school associations catering for various grades.

As an earnest of their willingness to give practical effect to the proposed twinning project, Ms. Allibe has informed the Urban Council in her letter that she, as a member of her Twinning Committee, with a member of the Tullins Town Council, Monsieur Pappet, have arranged to visit Dungarvan to carry out further consultations on the project.

Towards this end they will arrive at Dublin Airport this Friday, April 3, and plan to spend four days in Ireland. They are anxious to ascertain what each Dungarvan Club can propose in both the sporting and cultural spheres and have asked for a meeting towards this end.

When Ms. Allibe's letter was discussed at the March monthly meeting of the Urban Council last week it was agreed that arrangements be made to meet the visitors on arrival in Dublin and to bring them to Dungarvan where a special formal meeting of the Council will be held on Saturday at which members will meet and welcome Ms. Allibe and Monsieur Pappet.

It was also agreed that the County Manager, Mr. Dan Hurley and the Town Clerk, Mr. Bertie White, would arrange some social activities to enable the French visitors to meet people in the town who might wish to be associated with the twinning project. It is believed that nothing but good can come out of a twinning project of this type for many of the clubs and associations of the town and for that reason it is something which should be given every support. I deem it a privilege then, on behalf of the people of Dungarvan, to extend a hearty cordial welcome to Ms. Allibe and Monsieur Pappet on the occasion of their visit which I trust will turn out to be of much benefit to all concerned.

FIREBALL IN THE SKY

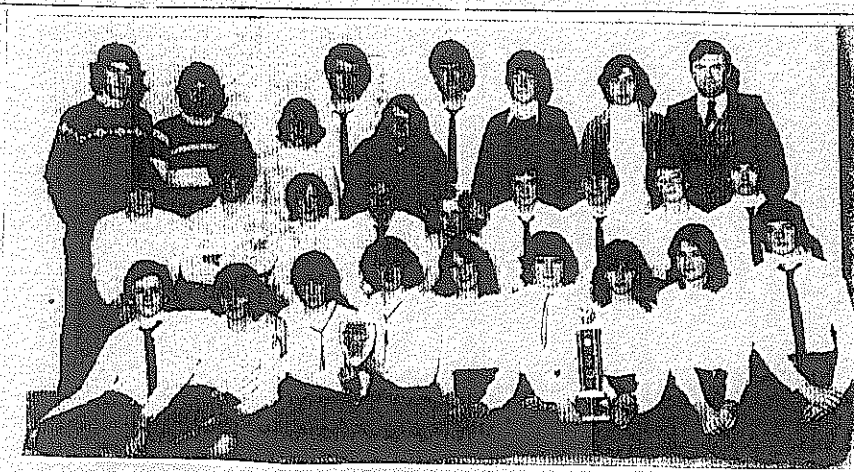

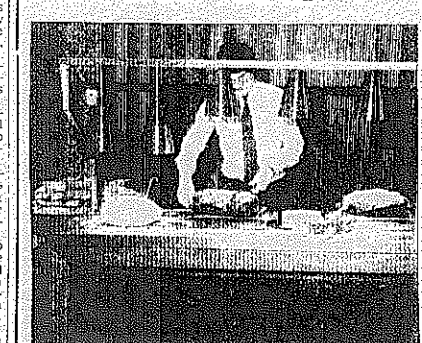

And at this time when all other forms of energy fetch such a phenomenal price, the national distribution of Kinalee gas would appear to be the only answer to rising costs as well as saving jobs.

The potential of such a grid to the Waterford region, with unemployment currently way above 8% would be enormous. Unfortunately the two local delegates to address the motion were caught in traffic in South Dublin on way to the E.D.S. on Friday evening and arrived too late to speak to the motion, which was tabled within minutes of the official opening of the Ard Fheis.

It was a pity. Such a excellent motion deserved a hearing and for future reference speaking delegates should be fully briefed on the approximate times of their debate. This information is known well in advance of the Ard Fheis.

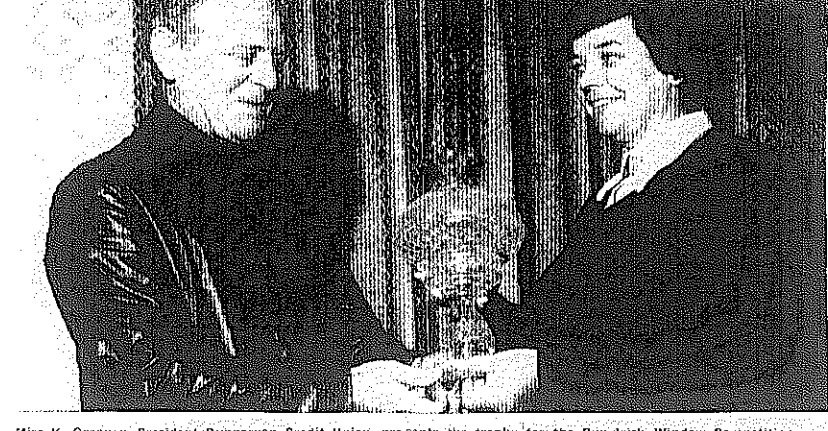

BRUCELLOSIS IN CATTLE

The infectious disease which the Pre-emptive Brucellosis Eradication Scheme was utilised by herd owners with encouragement and assistance from Co-operatives and Veterinary practitioners as reflected in the satisfactory progress being made at present with eradication of disease.

In the general round of testing for this disease, 1,330 animals have been removed from herds.

Unlike Bovine Tuberculosis, Brucellosis is a disease that can be controlled — indeed cleared from a herd, by good management, pasteurisation, immediate isolation and disposal of known reactors, culling of cows in isolation from the herd — keeping infected animals in isolation until they are proved to be clear are all vital to control of the disease. Liberal use of disinfectants is also important.

The whole area of controlling factors that increase the risk of contamination, are very important. For example, it is most important in fact it is illegal if you do not wash out a truck or trailer that is used to take infected animals to a factory. At the factory is the place to wash the vehicle, not on the farm.

We still hear of dead calves — factus better left lying about — still worse, dumped on a quarry hole, on roadsides, etc. This is highly objectionable behaviour and most certainly putting our herds very much at risk.
