## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

THE PRINCE AND LADY DI FRAMED IN TALLOW

As thanks to Mr. Jerome Casey who was the 'guide' for the group with which I went on a tour of the Jyden International Factory in Tallow last Monday prior to the official opening ceremonies, Mr. Casey was most helpful and courteous and showed us through the various operations in the manufacture of the high-class metal and wooden picture frames for which the Jyden Group of Companies has a world-wide reputation.

During the tour my attention was attracted to a framed colour photograph of the Prince of Wales and his fiancée, Lady Diana (DI) Spencer which was being enquired we were told that this was part of an initial order of 1,000 dozen of the framed engagement picture of the couple which was being shipped this week to the Woolworth chain of stores in the U.K. in preparation for the forthcoming wedding of the royal pair. An order for a further 200 dozen of the framed picture has also been received. Who would have believed that a British royal wedding could prove such a boon to this new industry in the Brideside town. It might indeed be said that it is an ill wind that does not blow somebody good. The Danish Ambassador, Mr. G. F. K. Harhoff who was in Tallow to perform the official opening of the huge factory which is located on a fine open landscaped 3-acre site on the outskirts of the town showed that he was quite adept in using a spade when he planted a tree on the entrance lawn marked by a plaque to commemorate the occasion. The Ambassador told those who watched him perform the task that the young tree was as fast as the Irish Beech, he said, by one day it will provide a shadow for the workers in the factory during their lunch break. Mr. Harhoff's remark

During the ensuing 25 or 30 minutes we can, in addition to the 2 or 3 readers, find ourselves 'going over' to 5 or 6 other 'special correspondents' attached to the station, as the main news headings move on.

If we could have more film shots of the news and less comment and certainly fewer of the 'special correspondents' I think it would make for a vast improvement.

Have seen some BBC and ITV News programmes and with this mix of no more than two news readers and plenty of film they are vastly superior to the 'show' which the big group from the RTE 1 Newsroom puts on.

Another thing which irritates me is the many mistakes which are allowed to be made. It is quite a regular thing now to find a report from, say, 'our Northern correspondent' to be interpolated in the bulletin at a certain time, missing, followed by the bland statement: 'Sorry, but we don't seem to have that report.' We can also often find the readers staring blankly into the cameras displaying little or no initiative in situations such as this and certainly behaving more like amateurs than the professionals which they claim to be.

**HOTEL DEVELOPMENT AT NIRE**

Further to my comments in last week's column concerning the refusal of the County Planning Authority to grant planning permission for the erection of a hotel, chalets, etc., at Knockraun, Dungarvan, I have been informed that the proposal had not been totally rejected in that it was suggested to the principals that they might proceed with the development on an incremental scale. This would ensure the gradual development of the proposed plan and enable it to be blended in with the surroundings. Perhaps we may hear more about this later.

## Danish Ambassador Opens Tallow Factory

Last Monday was a glorious day for the Brideside town of Tallow as it marked the official opening of the new factory of Jyden International. The Danish Ambassador, Mr. G. F. K. Harhoff, the sun shone warmly from clear sky as the crowd gathered in the grounds of the 6,000 square foot factory for the opening ceremony. There to greet them with Irish music was the Gadelevens Pipe Band and the scene was set for a truly memorable day.

The Jyden factory is located on a lovely open site, beautifully landscaped, on the Youghal road side of Tallow. In production since June 1980 it now employs 55, a number which is expected to grow to 75 by the end of the current year. The high quality metal and wooden picture frames manufactured at the factory are exported to several countries including Australia, Switzerland, Norway and England. This is the first venture in Ireland by the Jyden Group which has factories in seven other countries.

The official ceremonies on Monday commenced when the ambassador planted a tree in the grounds of the factory to mark the occasion and then the assembled guests entered the spacious building where the opening was performed by Very Rev. M. Walsh, P.P., and Rt. Rev. Dean Gilbert Mayes, Lismore.

Performing the official opening of the Ambassador, Mr. Harhoff, accompanied by his wife, said that the bringing to fruition of this new factory in Ireland of the Jyden Group was for him, like the late Hans Christian Andersen, Ireland was a young colt; and was certain that Jyden had made a good and wise choice in choosing Ireland for this latest expansion of their activities.

Commenting on the beautiful surroundings in which the factory was situated, Mr. Harhoff referred to the friendly atmosphere of the factory and said that it was evident that it was a good and wise choice which to work. He concluded by stating: 'In declaring the factory now officially open, I wish it a "framing" success for the future.'

Mr. Leif Ranghoj, President, Jyden International Group, said that this was a big day for the Group and having traced briefly the history of the company since its establishment in Denmark 60 years ago and the negotiations with the IDA which

eventually ended with the decision to come to Tallow, he said that Jyden were known all over the world for the production of high quality picture frames and he felt that there was a long and good future in prospect for their new factory in Tallow.

Deputy Austin Deasy, Chairman Waterford County Council on behalf of the people of County Waterford welcomed the Ambassador and the principals of

the Jyden Group who had travelled to be present at the ceremonies.

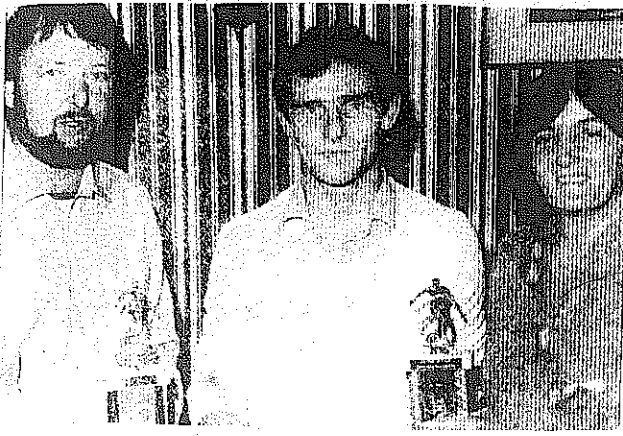

Lough Corrib - Good fishing for the past week, early hatch of olives and a lot of May Fly hatching and good numbers should appear on the lakes in the coming week. Mr. and Mrs. Keenan had 7 trout of 04 lbs for a half day's fishing on last Saturday. J. Faulkner landed 6 trout of 3 lbs. on Wednesday to wet flies.

Lough O'Flynn - Very broken weather and strong winds and hail showers, 24 trout of 20 lbs (best fish 11 lbs.) reported taken by 6 rods.

Lough Mash - Showery with some sunny periods, cold at times. J. Jennings and J. Maye, Ballinrobe, 6 trout (10 lbs.) in one day, wet flies. J. Corman and P. Egan shared 30 trout of 37 lbs. in 4 days wet fly fishing. 73 trout of 92 lbs. (best fish 71 and 4 lbs.) reported taken in 33 rod days.

Lough Derravaragh - Strong to gale force, north westerly winds, heavy showers of rain and sleet. Very good hatches of Olives and Duckly. First catches of Mayfly appeared on Saturday, 2nd May. Leinster Competition held on the lake on the 3rd May, fished in very bad conditions, strong gale force winds with hail showers. 18 fish of 34 lbs. 3 ozs. were weighed in. Results: 1st, S. McMathon, Dublin; 2nd, Tullamore team, 2 fish of 5 lbs. 5 ozs. (Best fish 4 lbs. 13 ozs.); 2nd, M. O'Toole, 1 fish of 5 lbs. 1 oz. and 3rd, A. Hallister, Lough Ennel, 1 fish, 4 lbs. 9 ozs.

## CO. MANAGER'S REPLY

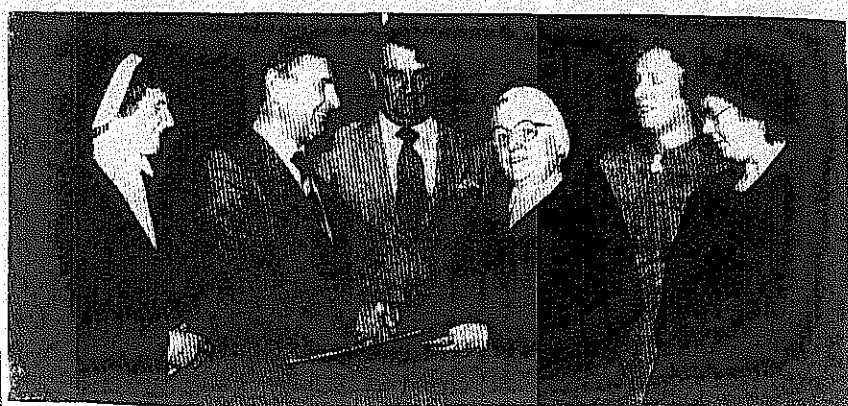
