# Waterford Should Beat Limerick

**NEXT SUNDAY**

We have still got to break that frightful losing sequence of first round Munster championship matches and with four of our chances gone, we now look to the footballers to break the "ice" by beating Limerick in a first round championship tie at Limerick on Sunday next.

For the past couple of months the footballers have been completely overshadowed by the hurlers, so much so that recently some one asked me if they had gone out of business altogether. I know that coach, trainer and supporter Joe Conway has been out of action through illness and this has reduced the amount of activity which has normally been associated with their preparation for the championships. Joe is making good progress back to health and hopefully will be with the team on Sunday.

Training hasn't been at a standard and the overall picture is not a very satisfactory one (without ever having been at full strength) they have played a few trial matches as part of the build up. Unfortunately a challenge game arranged for last Saturday evening did not materialise as Wexford were unable to muster a team at the last moment and a game due to be played against Laois on last Monday was also called off, because Laois could not travel.

These disappointments did not help Waterford, but their league record last year was good enough to suggest that if they can rise to the same heights, they should beat Limerick. Waterford's best all display was against the eventual section winners, Wicklow at Walsh Park when we lost by a single point.

Last year we played and lost to Tipperary (1-15 to 2-10) after a thrilling game at the Eagle Field and the team selected to do duty on Sunday next shows no less than eight changes from that team.

Missing from the published side are team captain, Sean Ahern, John Bennett, Eddie Rockett, Tom Hayes, Donal O'Murchu, etc. The team shows five changes from the team which played so well at Wicklow. No doubt there must be injury problems.

Limerick had their best football season for many years when reaching the Munster semi-final against the Eagles last year, having defeated Clare and Tipperary in a memorable replay at Thurles. Some ground advantage will help them too, but as I have already said, if our side can reach the heights displayed against Wicklow and against other counties in the league we can win.

Incidentally the senior football team were the last Waterford team to win a first round of the Munster championship, when beating the three-man team at Dungarvan three years ago.

Silbhá gCua and Geraldines met at the same stage of the championship last year following a tough encounter. Silbhá gCua won rather decisively. They eventually got to the county final. They should win again on Sunday.

Stradbally will be hotly fancied to beat the Nire in the evening junior football tie at the Eagle Field.

**AT CAPPOQUIN**

In the double-header at Cappoquin, Kilmobnet will be the feature match on the programme, but they won't do so if they fail to show improved form from what they have been doing in the league.

The first match here could be one of the outstanding matches of the junior championship, as on form Modellogo and Lismore would appear to be evenly matched. Lismore, maybe have the better record and may field the fitter side, since they have been in training for a while longer, but it is an open game.

### Co. Council To Continue "No Action" Policy On Rates Collection

Although Waterford County Manager, Mr. Dan Hurley, told members of Waterford County Council at a special meeting in Dungarvan last Monday that a sum of £274,000 was owed to the Council as a result of the non-payment of rates for 1980 they agreed to his suggestion that the Council's "no action" policy be continued to the end of the year.

In the course of a report submitted to the meeting detailing the present position, Mr. B. McNally, County Secretary stated that 71.9% of the net rating for 1980, a total of £1,787,802 had been collected as at December 31, 1980. Since January 1 to April 30 an additional £236,649 or a further 9% had been collected.

The report then went on to state —

"Arising from the request from the Government in 1980 that ratepayers in financial difficulties should not be pressed for payment, ratepayers who had not paid at the time were circularised and asked to substantiate their financial position. No further action was taken against ratepayers who responded except a reminder as to their current ability to pay and follow up of 'promises' to pay."

In the case of ratepayers who had made no response or representations in 1980, summonses were issued in March/April 1981 on the basis that they had the capability to pay.

As a result of the follow-up of promises and summonses issued in March/April 1981, a total of £1,787,802 had been collected by the end of April, 1981 leaving a balance of £274,000 outstanding.

Mr. McNally went on to say that as at December 31 the number of defaulters totalled 330 of whom 151 had submitted evidence of being in financial difficulty. The Council had issued summonses in 87 cases as a result of which 49 had since paid. Only 2 cases had been taken to court while the number of summonses pending was 130.

"A point of significance to the Council," the report stated in conclusion, "is that the cost of funding services without this income for the quarter ended March 31 amounted to approximately £15,000."

### SHOULD COME FORWARD AND PAY

Members generally agreed that the report indicated fairly the present financial difficulties in which the farming community found itself, in view of the fact that the Council had to meet the additional cost of funding services by overrating they agreed that there was a position to do so should come forward and pay their rates.

The Co. Manager said that the fact was that £274,000 was owed to the County Council as a result of the non-payment of rates. "But," he added, "we must be realistic and if the services are to be maintained someone must pay, otherwise we will have to meet the overdraft necessary for these services."

After a brief discussion the Council agreed to the Manager's suggestion that they continue their "no action" policy in regard to continuing defaulters for the next few weeks.

NEW AIDS TO FARMING

The following new grant schemes are now in operation:

1 LIME SUBSIDY SCHEME

This EC-assisted subsidy will apply to ground limestone of suitable quality delivered from a manufacturing plant on or after 15 May, 1981 for application to pastures. The rate of subsidy will be at the rate of 1 ECU (€2.5) at current exchange rates per tonne and will be shown separately on the sales documents as a deduction from the normal sale price. Payment will be made to the manufacturing plant by the Department.

2 SILAGE SCHEMES, 1981

Scheme A for farmers who will be making silage for the first time in 1981. This is an EC-assisted scheme under which a subsidy at the rate of 4.5 ECU per tonne of eligible silage (equal to approximately 43 of current exchange rates) is payable to first-time silage makers up to a maximum of 150 per farm unit.

Scheme B for farmers who made silage for the first time in 1980 and who qualified for subsidy under the 1980 Winter Fodder Scheme. This scheme is nationally financed and will provide a subsidy at the rate of 4.3 per tonne of eligible silage up to a maximum of 150 per farm unit.

3 FERTILISER SUBSIDY SCHEME

This EC-assisted subsidy at the rate of 5.5 ECU (€4.9) at current exchange rates) will be payable to A.I. operating holders by the Department for each first insemination from 15 May, 1981. This subsidy will reduce A.I. charges by a corresponding amount and will be shown as a deduction on the Certificate of Insemination given to the herdowner.

4 A.I. SUBSIDY

This EC-assisted subsidy at the rate of 7.5 ECU (€4.9) at current exchange rates) will be payable to A.I. operating holders by the Department for each first insemination from 15 May, 1981. This subsidy will reduce A.I. charges by a corresponding amount and will be shown as a deduction on the Certificate of Insemination given to the herdowner.
