THE LAST ROUND UP

The various political parties have been strenuously engaged in the last round up for Election '81 and candidates in the constituency have been playing the last cards in the game over the past week (see Election '81 report on page three of this issue). To-day, Thursday June 11, is "make your mind up" time for voters who have been going to the polling booths around the county since 9 o'clock this morning. When the booths close to-night at 9 p.m. and the ballot boxes have been sealed the decisions will have been made and the story of the outcome will unfold when these boxes are opened to-morrow (Friday) and the counting of the votes commences.

Early indications as to how the electorate reacted to the campaign of the political parties and their leaders and to the policies articulated by them should emerge from about mid-day onwards to-morrow and the trends will be eagerly followed until a clear pattern as to the overall result will begin to emerge.

Here in Waterford the tensions and in-fighting between the candidates of the parties have been the main features of an otherwise rather humdrum campaign. With the re-drawing of the Constituency a block of approximately 1,500 voters on the north side of the county extending from Cloonmel down to the Nire has been transferred to Tipperary South but the total electorate at 57,778 shows an increase of 3,967 since the 1977 election.

Opinion generally in the county seems to indicate no change in representation with Fianna Fail and Fine Gael maintaining a 2-2 division of the four seats but it is more than likely that there will be a change in the names at the top when the first count is announced. Poll-topper four years ago was Fianna Fail's Billy Kenneally but on this election, unlike the previous election when he had the party vote in the city more or less to himself, he will have a city candidate in the person of Brian Swift running with him. On the other hand, Jackie Fahey who had two other Fianna Fail candidates from West Waterford running with him in 1977 now has no opposition from a party candidate in this area and consequently is expected to do better than in 1977.

In the Fine Gael party, the inclusion of Katherine, Bultia, a County Councilor residing in Waterford city, is expected to affect the first count vote for outgoing Deputy Eddie Collins while the appearance on the scene of Dungarvan man Billy Kyne for the Labour party is expected to affect somewhat the vote of the other outgoing Fine Gael Deputy Austin Dease. However, the candidate who may well create the biggest problems for the two major parties is Sinn Fein the Workers Party man Paddy Gallagher who came within sight of a Dail seat in 1977 when he was eventually defeated for the fourth seat by Eddie Collins in the eighth count. SWEP claim the eighth count man can improve on his 4,500 first count vote of 1977 this time and if he does so then he could well cause an upset.

The 11-block campaigners state they expect a good response for their candidate, Moez Prison burger-striker Kevin Lynch, and in support of his stand Bernadette McAisley made a flying visit to Dungarvan on Monday evening en route to Cork where she proclaimed that by voting for Kevin Lynch the people of the South had a chance to show that they cared about the North and about the men and women dying in the prisons there.

So that is how the story rests at the time of writing!



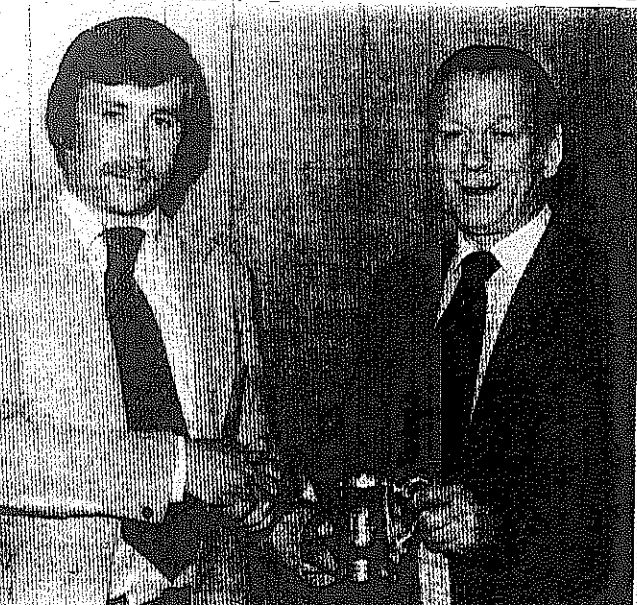
