## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

**SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET HITS MAN IN THE STREET**

No matter what way you look at it, the first budget introduced in the new Coalition Government last Tuesday was a tough one. It may even say a harsh one.

While road tax on cars returns to the old system, beer and spirits and petrol getting a two-pence hike (one now and the other in September) and C.I.E. and E.S.B. charges to rise shortly and a further vicious increase of 20 per cent in postal charges, the most significant feature about Minister for Finance Bruton's budget was the decision to raise VAT by 5% from 10% to 15%. This increase will hit most consumer goods and will hit the man in the street hardest.

It may well be asked why this steep increase in the lower VAT rate was introduced while the higher rate was left untouched, or why a levy of only 25 million on Bank profits was taken, or yet again why the government did not take a harder line with the public sector.

Hit hardest of all was the motor industry which received three separate and severe blows. The newspaper industry, already the most heavily taxed of its kind in Europe was also delivered a double blow by the increase in VAT and the big hike in postal charges and this action must be deplored.

Over all the budget is one which will increase unemployment and inflation and whether it will achieve the results aimed at remains to be seen.

### THIS MUST BE CONDEMNED

On Tuesday morning a lady interested in keeping Dungarvan and its environs clean, tidy and healthy, called to the "Leader" Office to make a complaint about the dumping of a large quantity of fish heads and entrails at the sea-front in the vicinity of the Swimming Pool. She described the action as an absolute scandal.

A couple of hours later I went to inspect the situation myself and sure enough I saw the offensive material complained of just off the Quann's difficulty in finding the location from the description I had been given and as soon as I reached the vicinity my sense of smell led me to the actual spot.

This is a high amenity area with the town park and swimming pool in close proximity and the promenade walk from the Look-Out to Quann's just running by it.

When I spoke to the Swimming Pool attendant he told me that the fish offal had been dumped there during the previous week and it had been apparently done at a time when no one was about — probably late at night or early in the morning. The pool is a place which attracts a big number of children while the Park and the promenade walk are areas frequented by the more adult members of the community.

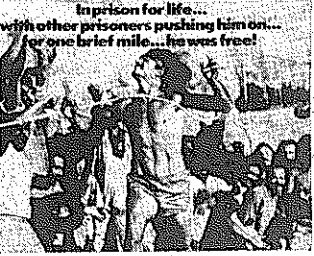
