PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

A HAZARDOUS JUNCTION
It seems to me that this complex junction is a hazard to motorists and the problem will occur again and again unless traffic lights are placed there. It was Circuit Court Judge Sheridan said this when he was adjudicating in an action for damages at Dungarvan Circuit Court last week in which two motorists brought claim and counter claim against each other arising from a collision in which the junction was involved at the Mary Street corner with the Square in Dungarvan.

Judge Sheridan went on to describe the junction as a jigsaw puzzle which made it almost impossible for motorists to see where their duty lay while negotiating it. As he knew the situation the only way to solve the problem at the junction was the introduction of traffic lights. But his Lordship added that it was not his function to do anything about such situations as this was a matter for the road authority and for the gardai.

I happened to be present in Court when the Judge made these remarks and I was at once reminded that it was only 24 hours earlier that County Engineer Jim Hally had told me that he had plans for the erection of pedestrian lights to control the traffic at the junction and that work on these would be carried out in September.

When I queried the County Engineer about his proposals for traffic control at Killy's Corner at Abbeyside he informed me that he also planned to erect pedestrian lights erected here and that this work will also be carried out during next month.

I am sure that these proposals of Mr. Hally will be warmly welcomed by the many people who have to negotiate either one or other or both of these very dangerous junctions as part of their daily routine.

THE DUNGARVAN RING ROAD
On the same occasion Mr. Hally also referred to the progress being made in laying the by-pass ring road which is designed to take the heavy through traffic from passing through the Dungarvan town centre and which at present causes regular traffic jams in practically all of the principal streets.

Work on this major development is now at a fairly advanced stage and its completion will depend ultimately on the speed with which the new bridge across the mouth of the river Colligan from the Shannon Road to Strandside North, Abbeyside, which is a vital link in the road, can be completed. I understand that the Department of the Environment will play a big part in deciding how quickly this bridge may be built by the manner in which they make the grant to finance its erection available to the County Council.

The bridge is estimated to cost £2.75 million and plans for it as prepared by Cork Consulting Engineers, Malachy Walsh & Partners, were approved at the July monthly meeting of the County Council and forwarded to the Department for sanction. The cost of the bridge will be met by a 100% State grant and it is vitally necessary that the money be made available without undue delay as in the absence of this link over the mouth of the Colligan the entire by-pass road will not be able to function.

The need for this by-pass road grows by the day as the volume and weight of the traffic passing through the town shows a steady increase and if this increasing overload cannot be dealt with soon through the by-pass development it will completely choke traffic in the town centre and create utter chaos.

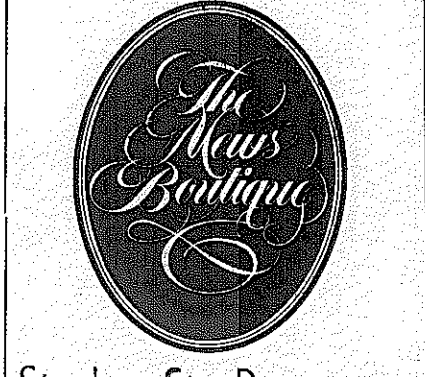
Judge Sheridan was told that the crowbar and exhaust pipe were found inside the car following the incident. Damage to the amount of £151 had been caused.

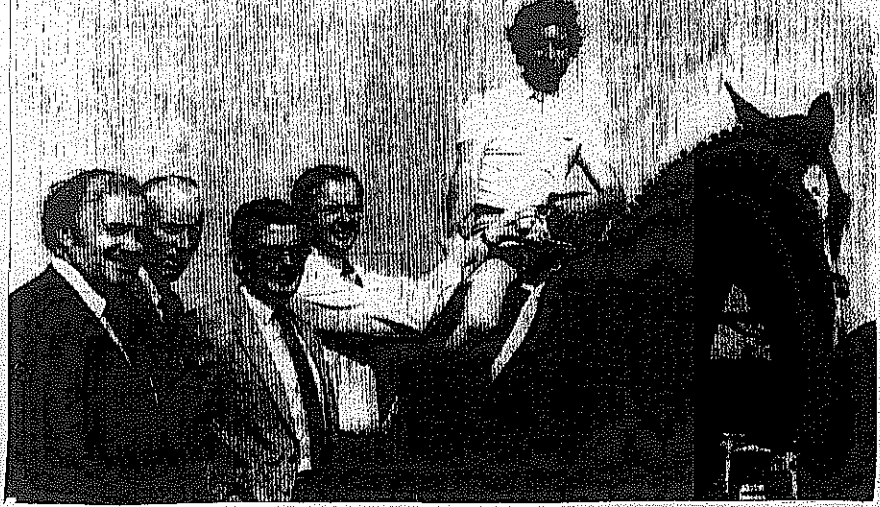

Hunger Strikers Kevin Lynch And Kieran Doherty Die

Two more of the IRA hunger strikers at the Maze Prison in Long Kesh died last week-end. Kevin Lynch (25) a native of Dungiven, Co. Derry died at 4.1 a.m. on Saturday morning, August 1 after going without food for 71 days. Kieran Doherty, also 25 and T.D. for O'Connell died on Sunday evening August 2 at 7.16 p.m. after a fast lasting 70 days.

These latest deaths bring to eight the total number of hunger-strikers who have died in Long Kesh since the protest for the free demands of the prisoners commenced and which resulted in the first death of Bobby Sands, M.P. for Fermanagh-South Tyrone nearly three months ago.

Kevin Lynch was the 11-Block candidate in the Waterford Constituency in the June General Election and he polled 3,377 first preference votes.

Black flags were flown in many centres in the county and a number of 11-Block supporters holding black flags maintained a silent vigil beside a mock coffin in Dungarvan Square on Monday last.

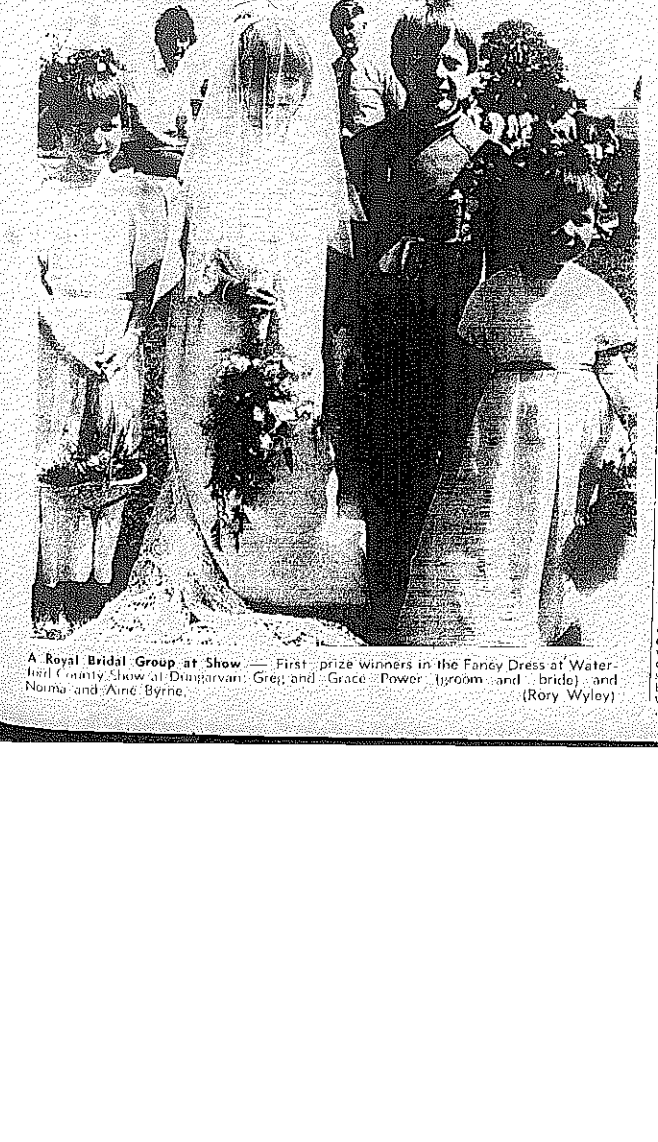
