Death of former Deputy Kyne



The widespread regret expressed following the announcement of the death of Mr. Thomas A. (Tom) Kyne, which occurred after a rather protracted illness at his home in Murphy Place, Abbeyside, on last Saturday evening, August 8 came from every section of the continuity, rich and non hich and low as he was a man who and poor, high and low as he was a man who was loved and respected by everybody.

Aged 76 years Tom Kyne had a long, varied and highly successful career. As a young man he followed for a period the call of the sea which was part of the family tradition and a tradition very much part of his native Dungarvan in those days. He then settled down in Dungarvan and worked as National Health Insurance Agent and later as Secretary and Organiser of the A. T. & G. W. Union.

Always interested in politics, he actively entered the political field on his election as Labour member to Dungaryan Urban Council and continued as member of that Council for almost 4t years until he decided not to seek re-election in 1979. He was the very wise and strewd Chairman of the Council for almost half of that period being re-elected successively at each annual meeting of the Council from 1955 when he succeeded the late Tom Lamen until 1974. He had an almost equally long term as a member of Waterford County Council, for most of which he was the lone Labour solee on the Council, but he had the honour of being elected Chairman of the Parent Body in the Council for the year 1979-50.

He made his first attempt to win a Dall seat in 1947 in oy-election caused by the death of another well-loved and long serving Dungarvan public representative, the late Mickey Morrissey T.D., but was unsuccessful when the late Jackie Ormonde, who died only a few weeks ago, retained the seat for Flanna Fall.

However in the general election called the following year, 1948. Tom Kyne scored a signal victory for the Ladiour Party when he captured a seat and held it at every subsequent election until 1969 when he was narrowly

He regained the seat in the meneral election of 1973 but at the dissolution of the Dail in 1977 he decided to restre from National politics and following this, Labour lost the representation in the Constituency which Tom Kyne himself had made originally, and had consolidated and maintained over a period of simost 30 years. During this entire period he was a most influential figure in the hierarchy of the Labour Party and was for a long time Chairman of the Party's Parliamentary Group.

Throughout his political career Tom Myne was a shrewd campaigner and was often the stormy petrel in hard-fought battles with his political opponents. One of the toughest of these followed the re-drafting of the Constituencies in the 1961 general election when Waterford was reduced to a 3-seater and Tom Myne fought the Issue under the slogan "put in the man they want to put out" and got so much support that he wound up at the top of the poll.

During his political life he also served as a member of the County Vocational Education Committee, the County Libraries Committee and the Local Health Committee and he also served for one term as a member of Waterford

In his younger days he was an enthusiastic and most active G.A.A man and was for a number of years, Secretary of the Dungarvan G.A.A. Cith and also Secretary of the Western Board G.A.A. It was during the latter period that he compiled the weekly G.A.A. Notes published in this paper under the nom-de-plume "An Runaldhe."

TRADE UNION ORGANISER

A pioneer of the trade union movement it can be said without contradiction that it was Tom Kyne who succeeded in introducing trade untonism to the town and indeed to West Waterford and in organising the workers to obtain the wages and conditions of employment which they now enjoy.

A true socialist he worked throughout his entire life to improve the lot of the underprivileged, the less well off, the poor and the handleapped and was known to help everyone who sought his assistance irrespective of politics, class or cread. He was always straight as a die and believed in calling a spade, a spade. For this he won the esteem, respect and admiration of all who knew him and he retained this esteem and admiration to the very end.

To his devoted wife Abbie, sons, Anthony, Garvan and Billy and daughters Anne tMrs. Lynch) and Mary and sis-ter Queenle, we tender our deepest sympathy in the great loss they have now sustained.

As the removal of his remains from the Kilely Funeral Rome on Sunday evening and at the burial following Requiem Mass in St. Mary's Parish Church on Monday morning the general public joined with Church and State in paying well deserved tributes to a man who throughout his long life had served his town, his country and his country so well.
