## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### A SEAT ON THE CO. COUNCIL

Following the regretted death last week of the late Tom Kyne, a vacancy now exists in the Waterford County Council of which Mr. Kyne was a member and the reality of the position is that steps must now be taken to fill the seat by co-optation.

After the local elections in 1979, Mr. Kyne, the sole Labour member of the Council, was left holding the balance of power on the 23-member assembly with Fine Gael and Fianna Fail sharing the remaining 22 seats equally and at that time following discussions between spokesmen for the two major parties, Mr. Kyne what has been described as a rather loose gentlemen's agreement in regard to the Chair and any co-optations during the life-time of the Council was reached verbally. In regard to co-optations it was agreed that in the event of a vacancy occurring the filling of it would be left to the party holding the seat at the time the vacancy occurred.

However, in recent weeks rumours have circulated that Fianna Fail, now holding the chair of the Council, were contemplating a change of attitude and that with the advantage of the Chairman's casting vote, they were considering putting forward a candidate of their own to enable them to win back the overall command of the Council for the remainder of its present life-time.

Aware that these rumours were going the rounds and following the publication of a newspaper report on the subject last week I made some inquiries to ascertain what the attitude of the Fianna Fail members of the Council really was on it. As far as I could find out from these inquiries the source was a fairly authoritative one, there is no truth in the rumours and Fianna Fail do not intend to contest the issue when it arises.

In this being the case it would seem fairly certain that the Party to nominate a man to fill the vacancy and it would be an odd-on bet to assume other than that Billy Kyne, son of the late former Deputy, and himself a sitting member of Dungarvan Urban Council, will be put forward to take the seat left vacant by the death of his father.

I understand that there is a meeting of the County Council scheduled for Dungarvan next Monday and in all probability the vacancy on the Council will be declared at that meeting and plans made to have it filled at a meeting to be held in September.

Before leaving, this matter I would like to say that during the enquiries I made about it last week I became aware of the fact that in the event of Deputy Eddie Collins resigning his seat because of his appointment as Minister of State at the Department of Energy it could be possible that Fianna Fail would contest the co-optation rather than let it go to the Fine Gael party to fill the vacancy. However this is another day's work as there are no signs, as yet, that Minister Collins is in any hurry to give up his seat on the Council.

As I stated earlier, the above I have just heard of the death of Mr. George Armstrong, of Lismore, which occurred at Ardscoil Hospital, Waterford, on Tuesday morning. Mr. Armstrong was aged 63 years, suffered a heart attack at his home last Saturday night and was removed by ambulance to the intensive care unit at the hospital. It was with very great regret that I learned of the death of this quiet, sincere and straight-forward man on Tuesday. This will probably alter the

procedure as it is now possible that next Monday's Council meeting will stand adjourned and of course his death has also created a further vacancy on the Council. My deepest sympathy is extended to his wife and family on the tragic bereavement they have suffered.

### FESTIVAL TIME IN TALLOW

It is always a sign that the year is passing on when the time comes for Tallow's great Annual Horse Fair Festival. And so it is again this year as the Festival commences in the Brideside town on Sunday next and will culminate with the now famous horse fair which has made September 3 a red-letter date in the calendar of horse breeders and owners and traders and buyers not only throughout Ireland but overseas as well.

The Committee of the Tallow Community Centre, the driving power behind it, have arranged what they describe as their most ambitious programme yet for this year's festival. It will provide free entertainment on the street each night under a variety of headings while there is a long list of other activities aimed at providing fun and enjoyment for all.

An extra special attraction at this year's festival will be a demonstration of an old-time threshing on an acre of grain grown specially for the purpose. This should really be great fun and all that is required to ensure its success is fine weather.

So from Sunday next until Thursday, September 3, all the action will be centred on the town of Tallow and the wonderful programme is bound to attract thousands. It is all for a great cause as the festival is one of the principal fund-raising campaigns to aid the development of the town's Community Centre.

### LITTER STREWN STREETS

Despite the renewed efforts of Dungarvan Urban Council to clean up the town, most of the streets continue to be strewn with litter. In an innovation introduced by C. Manager, Mr. Dan Hurley a half-dozen school-leavers were employed by the Council over the last month in an effort to make Dungarvan and Abbeyside a brighter and cleaner place. These have been sent out in pairs daily with hand-carts and brushes to clear up the streets but it would appear that as fast as they clean an area a fresh raft of litter breaks out almost immediately.

It is quite obvious that in the continued absence of co-operation by the shopkeepers and the general public this litter problem has a little chance of being solved. The greatest offenders would appear to be children and teenagers as the biggest content of the litter is made up of crisp bags and empty soft drink cans, tins and bottles and sweet wrappers.

Until the public become educated to the needs of placing litter in the litter bins provided and not throwing these wrappers and tins at random wherever they are being discarded, the litter problem, for which we have gained now an international reputation, will continue. All I can again say is shame on us for this.

## TALLOW YOUTH DROWNED IN RIVER BRIDE

Tragedy struck the Brideside town of Tallow last Monday evening when one of the most popular youths in the locality Billy Henley, son of Mr. and Mrs. Liam Henley, West Street was the victim of a drowning accident in the river Bride.

The tragedy occurred as a group of young boys were swimming in the river near Tallow Bridge and Billy Henley was seen to get into difficulties. His friend Donk Lyons of Woodview Park went to his assistance but his valiant rescue bid was unavailing. The alarm was raised at once and gardai with civilian help immediately organised a search. The body was recovered shortly after 8.30 p.m.

The drowned boy was one of a family of seven and was a pupil at Lismore C.B.S. He was a prominent juvenile hurler with the Tallow Club.

Acquaintances in Dungarvan Mr. Power will be best known as Gusty ("Rocky") who lived at the Square where, in the old days, the family business was located. A regular visitor to the home-town down through the years, Gusty who is a personality well-known in courting and "luring circles" here and in the U.K. has never lost contact with his legion of friends in the Old Boro.

As a matter of fact he is at present on one of his frequent visits to the town and is staying at the home of Gabriel Draper, a family with which he has had life-long associations stretching back to boyhood days. We are glad to note that he still remains his old exuberant, spruce, humorous self and again congratulate him on his latest achievement.

### DISCO NOISE TO BE MONITORED

In regard to my recent comments on the noise levels in discos and the damage this can cause in relation to deafness I was interested to note last week that Dublin Corporation have been carrying out an investigation into the position in the capital as a result of which roller discos, especially, may have to tone down their sound levels.

"During the year the Corporation had a detailed survey done of roller discos by its Noise Control Unit and plans are now being prepared to have suitable "Disco Noise Level Limiters" installed in them.

The Corporation's Environmental report states that the object of this arrangement is to discipline owners if they don't keep within agreed sound limits.

As I have already said this is an area which all local Planning Authorities should interest themselves in as there can be little doubt but that the noise levels which appear to be the accepted norm at present in these areas of entertainment are dangerously high.

## UNEXPECTED DEATH OF MR. GEORGE ARMSTRONG, N.T., M.C.C.

The news of the unexpected death of Mr. George Armstrong, N.T., M.C.C., Ballymartin, Glencmain, which occurred at Ardscoil Hospital, Waterford on Tuesday morning, August 18, caused widespread and genuine regret. Taken suddenly ill Saturday night, he was removed by ambulance to the intensive care unit at the hospital where, despite hopes that he would recover, he died on Tuesday morning.

Aged 63 years he had been a member of the teaching staff at Lismore C.B.S. for many years and prior to that he had taught at Ballysgarratt National School.

A staunch supporter of Fianna Fail throughout his life time he was an active and most valued member of the Tallow Community Centre for decades but it was not until the Local Elections of 1974 that he entered public life when he successfully contested the Community Election in the Lismore Electoral area as a Fianna Fail candidate.

The manner in which he served the public in the Lismore area in the interim period was well reflected when he was re-elected with a very strong voice in the local election of 1979.

George Armstrong was a quiet man whose honesty, integrity and straight-forwardness were beyond question. He never sought the limelight and preferred to do his good deeds by stealth and his unexpected death at such a comparatively early age will be a great loss not only to his wife and family but to all the people of the Lis-

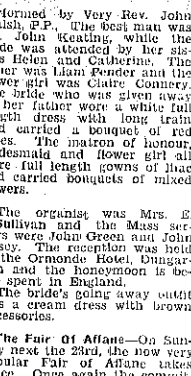

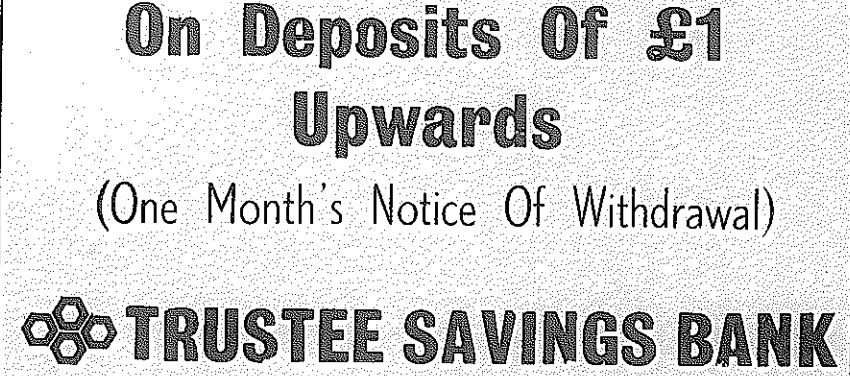

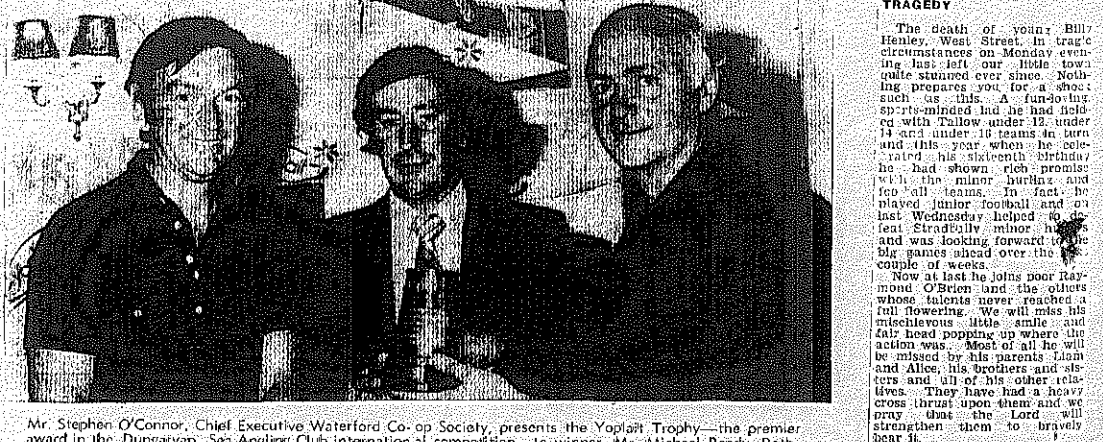
