

Momentous Occasion For Dungarvan R.F.C.

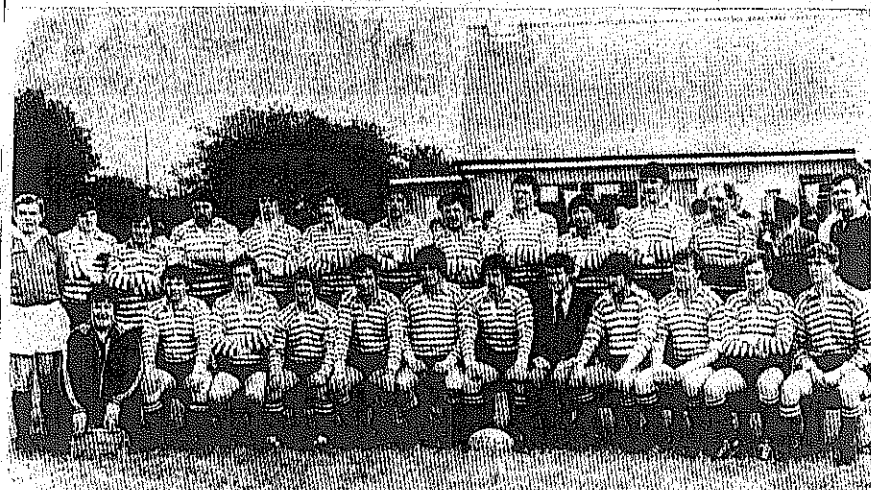

Death Of Mr. James Ahearn In The U.S.

We take the following obituary from the "Boston Herald American" dated Friday, August 7, which relates to the death of Mr. James Ahearn, a native of Dungarvan.

James Ahearn, 87, of Winthrop, a licensed engineer with the Winthrop Community Hospital's maintenance department for the past 53 years, died yesterday at work.

Born in County Waterford, Ireland, he traveled to New Zealand at the age of 16 and spent five years in the wool industry. He returned to Ireland, married the former Grace Butler of Chicago and then came to the U.S. and settled in Winthrop.

Ahearn joined the Winthrop Community Hospital staff in 1928 when it was located in Federal Square. In the early years of the hospital, when it was often working 12-hour days, he was in charge of the laundry and vegetables and fruit in the hospital's kitchen. He was also in charge of the back of the hospital and one year, earned more than 2,000 quarts of milk for the hospital.

Informed by his doctor to "slow down" in recent years, he reduced his activities to part time, grooming the hospital grounds, tending to the raising and lowering of the flag and growing beautiful roses. Last December, hospital employees and friends, as well as radio and TV celebrities, honored him on his 87th birthday.

He was the recipient of the Winthrop Elks Lodge No. 1087 Americanism Award and was elected to the hospital's director's office in 1970. A man of great dedication and commitment that few could equal.

He leaves a daughter, Katherine, a publicist with the Irish Cultural House, a son, Thomas, an employee of the American Airlines and two sisters, Mrs. Mary McCarty of Dublin and Mrs. Eileen Tobin of Waterford, both in Ireland.
