PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

LIVING IT UP AT EXPENSE OF RATEPAYERS AND TAXPAYERS

The enormous cost of the junketing trips of public representatives of local, national and European levels was once again high-lighted at the monthly meeting of Waterford County Council this week when Cllr. Dec Goode pointed out that additional expenditure which the Council would have to bear as a result of increases imposed in the recent budget and for which they had not provided for in their annual estimates could be met if these "fruitless journeys" to conferences "here, there and everywhere" were cut out.

A couple of weeks ago a member of Mayo County Council who was a delegate to the annual meeting of the General Council of County Councils in Dublin, accused County Councillors of "having a good time" at the expense of the State when they travelled to Dublin on official business. He claimed that several delegates abused their position on such occasions.

He said that the delegates were sent to Dublin to represent their county at the general council but many of them came in about noon and left again at lunchtime. He went on to say that they were letting down the people who sent them as delegates to Dublin by using the time to do their shopping.

The new chairman of the General Council, Senator Patsy Lawlor of Kildare, appealed to delegates at the meeting, who are allowed 32p per mile to travel to and from Dublin, to remain at the meetings until the agenda was completed. She complained also that several members "failed to last the pace," although they were sent to Dublin at the expense of ratepayers and taxpayers on important business on behalf of their own local authorities.

It is more than a coincidence also that the annual or quarterly meetings of such bodies as the General Council of County Councils, of County Committees of Agriculture, of Municipal Authorities or of Library Committees or of other similar associations are held in Dublin at such times as Spring Show or Horse Show week for at leading seaside resorts during the summer season. But while it may now be the accepted procedure for many delegates to such conferences to register minimal appearances, it is known that there are some delegates who do approach their obligations when appointed to attend such conferences in a most serious and responsible manner.

But the cost of funding the expenses of delegates to these conferences at national level pales to a mere shadow when it comes to the junkets undertaken by members of both houses of our Oireachtas and by the members of the European Parliament. When these go to junketing they really go "far away places" with strange sounding names which would send you to a map of the world to find where they were located.

Despite the fact that the Government are still pleading for restraint in public spending and local authorities find their coffers running dry because government grants and loans are being restricted and cut-back, eight members of the Oireachtas are at present junketing one of these junket trails half-way across the world to attend an international conference in Havana, Cuba. Cost to the taxpayers — an estimated £10,000.

Led by the Ceann Comhairle, Dr. John O'Connell, the party includes Deputies Austin Deasy and Brendan Griffin representing Fine Gael, John Ryan, Labour, Eileen Lemass, Pádraic Brennan and Sean French, Fianna Fáil and the Sinn Féin Community representa-

tive Senator Brendan Ryan. The delegation is strictly on proportional representation of the political parties in the Dail and the conference at which 80 countries will be represented will discuss such topics as the energy crisis, apartheid, colonisation and human rights. The conference was arranged by the Inter-parliamentary Union in the Dail and while the members of the delegation are stated to be travelling at economy rates, their nightly hotel bill will be £32 per head with meals costing from £20 to £30 per day!

While this kind of thing is going on at the top how can we expect the lesser fry at local level to do anything less than they are doing. They are only following the example set by "big brother."

But the whole thing boils down to the old question: if it is deemed important to attend such conferences is it always necessary to send a bus-load of delegates?

DUNGARVAN C.Y.M.S. ROOMS TO CLOSE

The CYMS Rooms in Dungarvan which is part of the parochial property in the town and which has proved a centre of much of the social and cultural activity in the town for many, many years is to be closed for public use as from October 1. The decision of the Trustees of the property to take this course of action follows a report of an engineer who inspected the building on the instructions of the parish authorities and found that extensive structural and fire safety improvements, at a prohibitive cost to the parish, would be necessary to meet the legal requirements for the future use of the premises as a recreational centre.

The decision to close the building to public use will prove a great loss to many clubs and organisations in the town which have used it for social functions but to none will it be a bigger loss than to the local Troop of Catholic Boy Scouts who have used the CYMS as a Den or headquarters for the past 12 years. As a result the boys will now find themselves without a meeting place and this could well jeopardise the scouting movement in the town which at present caters for a total membership of 135 boys and which is such a valuable agency in the development of the youth of the town and district.

The closing of the CYMS still further high-lights the urgent need for a proper and adequate community centre in the town and focusses the need for the local authority to exert all the pressure at its disposal to have the development planned for the Urban Council site at Quann's commenced as quickly as possible. A meeting to discuss the problem of providing suitable premises for the Scouts will be held at the Scouts Den, Mary Street, on next Tuesday night and it is expected that the townspeople will widely support this meeting.

HOSTEL FOR HANDICAPPED

As part of the development of Carriglea Training Centre, Dungarvan, the Sisters of Bon Secours have agreed to provide a hostel for the handicapped attending the workshop. This development has been welcomed by the Management of the South Eastern Health Board as it will reduce the cost of transporting the handicapped and will also be advantageous for their social training.

The costs of the hostel may be able to be met from moneys which Carriglea expect from the European Social Fund towards the development of recreational facilities but if there are not sufficient funds the Board will probably make a contribution out of their allocation from the fund towards the cost.

Co. Council Co-options

Vacancies Filled Without Any Opposition

As exclusively predicted in last week's Leader, the co-option to fill the vacancies in the Dungarvan and Lismore electoral areas of Waterford County Council created by the recent deaths of Cllrs. T. A. Kyne (Labour) and George Armstrong (P.P.) were carried through without opposition at a meeting of the Council held at the ACOT Offices in Lismore last Monday.

A unanimous agreement which was honoured, Fine Gael did not contest the co-options which were left to the parties concerned with the filling of them.

Nominated by the Labour Party to fill the vacancy in the Dungarvan Area was Mr. Billy Ryan, son of the late Cllr. T. A. Kyne and himself a sitting member of Dungarvan Urban Council.

His co-option was proposed by Cllr. Dec Goode (P.P.) who said that this was a very historic occasion as it was the first time the Council had met in Lismore. He added that it

gave him great pleasure to propose the son of a particular life-long friend for co-option to Waterford County Council as a member of the Labour Party and he expressed the hope that the new Councillor would, in time, emulate the great work which his father had done for the town of Dungarvan and for the County.

Seconding the proposal, Cllr. Jim Henry (P.P.) said that the new Councillor would undoubtedly have a big reputation to live up to but he felt he was well qualified to do so.

Declaring Cllr. Kyne co-opted, the Chairman, Cllr. Paddy Kenneally, welcomed him to the Council and expressed the hope that he would uphold the tradition set up over the past 30 years by his late father.

Cllr. Kyne thanked the Council members for his co-option and said that he welcomed the opportunity to join such an important body as Waterford County Council. He said that as a county councillor his priorities would be concerned with the present divisions between trade unionists and farmers, housing and health and he looked forward to raising these issues at later dates.

LISMORE VACANCY

Cllr. Jimmy Quirk (P.P.) then proposed the co-option of Mrs. Nancy Armstrong to fill the vacancy in the Lismore Area which he said would enable her to continue her work so well done up to the time of his death by her late husband, George.

Cllr. C. Curran (P.P.), seconding said that he grew that Mrs. Armstrong would make an excellent public representative for the Lismore Area.

Cllr. Senator Katherine Bulbulin said that it gave her particular pleasure to welcome Mrs. Armstrong as the second lady ever to become a member of the Council.

When the Chairman declared Mrs. Armstrong co-opted and having welcomed her, Cllr. Mrs. Armstrong told the Council that she was deeply conscious of the honour bestowed on her by her co-option to the Council. Thanking all the members she said that she would try to follow faithfully in her husband's footsteps and to fulfil her role on the Council as a responsible local representative.

Both Councillors then took their places at the Council table.

REQUIEM MASS

When the business of the meeting had been concluded, the Chairman and members of the Council with the Co. Manager, Co. Secretary, Acting Co. Engineer and Officials attended a special Mass for the repose of the soul of the late Cllr. Armstrong, celebrated in St. Charles's Church at the request of the Council members.

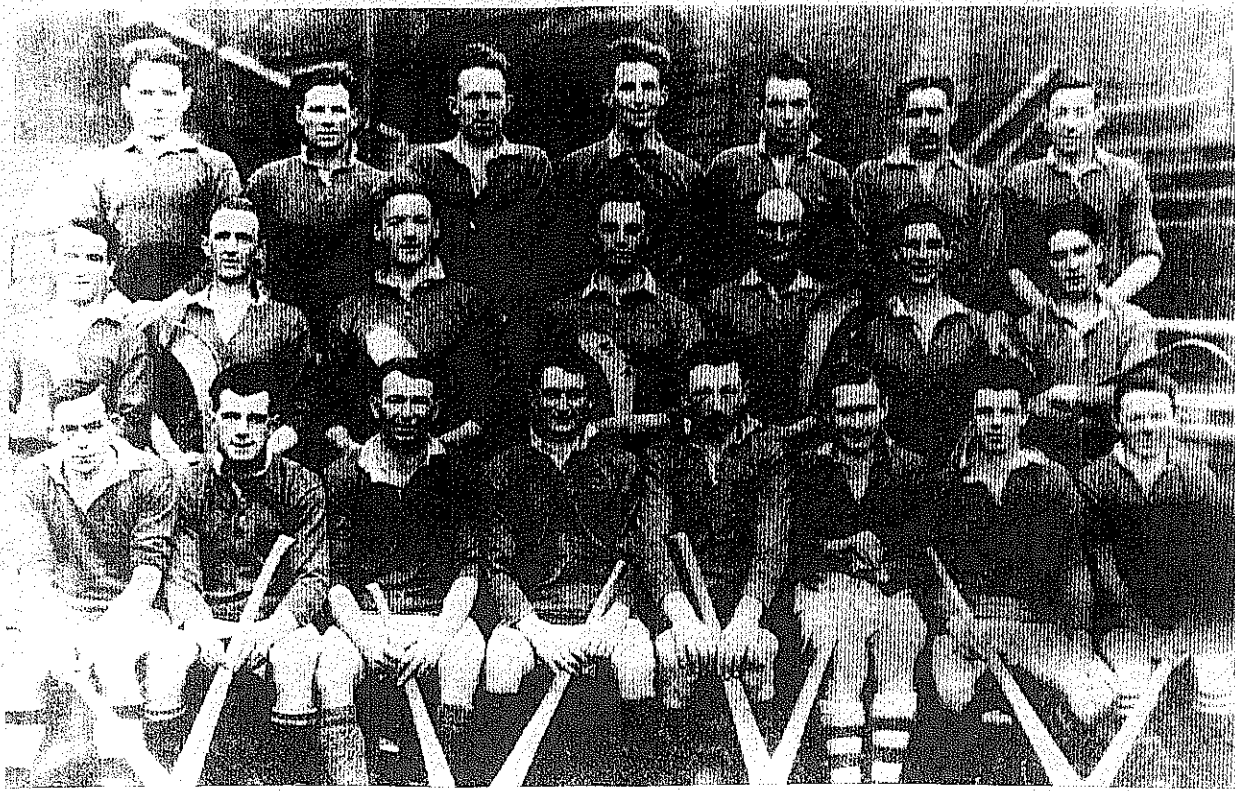

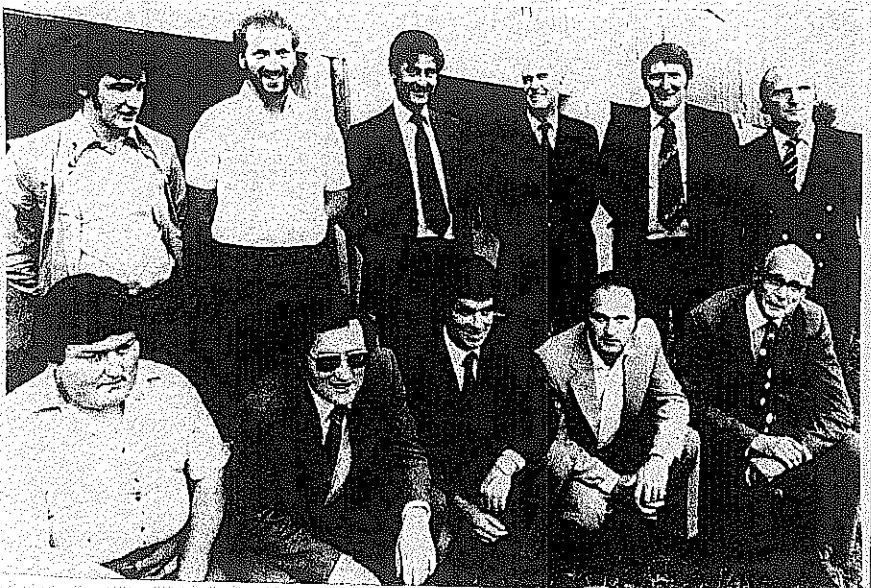
