TIDY TOWNS REPORT

Litter Still Major Problem In Dungarvan

The report of the adjudicators on Dungarvan's efforts in the 1981 Tidy Towns Competition was considered by members of Dungarvan Urban Council at their monthly meeting last Monday night and noted. With a total of 102 marks out of a maximum of 150, 1 less than last year, the report showed that litter still remains a major problem in the town. The following is a copy of the report: Tidiness 9 (20)—last year 12: A lot of litter was observed in the centre especially in Granua Square. The litter bins were more than half full and should also be placed in the centre of the square where the shop vans are parked. The back of Murphy Bros. Builders and the east end of the bridge presented a very untidy appearance to the waterfront road and the river shore on the north east bank had a lot of uncovered rubbish. A similar area between the Gory approach and the quay looked rather unfortunate where rubbish had been insufficiently covered in places. The north east corner of Granua Square looks very untidy with open storage areas visible from the street. Perhaps solid fencing might solve this. The main off street car park presented a very untidy appearance. The surface was covered with all types of litter, weeds and grass. The waterfront car park close to Homerside Street was particularly clean with not an ounce of litter in sight. This example should be followed elsewhere. Presentation Of Buildings 16 (20)—last year 15: On the south east corner of Granua Square, Tom Curran's and McFlynn's looked very well together. Paddy Foley's was also well presented but the sign on the side of the building was far superior to that on the front. There are much too many colours used on the south side of the Square—some good colours are killed by others. If the blues, the reds and the greens came out those facades would look very well. The very small plot sizes produce a major problem for colour on both the north and south side of the square. Because many buildings are only a single window wide, the use of many colours gives an almost striped appearance to the street facade. Use of the same colour by a combined number of buildings is probably the only effective way to solve this problem. O'Connell Street has some fine traditional shopfronts but in many cases the buildings above these lack attention. The old Provincial

Both sides have improved considerably since and Ardmore's game will depend on how they play in the second half. The displays against Athlone and Tallow did not exactly win confidence, but we certainly saw the old Ardmore style and determination at its best when they played dazzling football against the strong championship contenders, Pa and Noel Walsh, who had last month. There was a champions look about Ardmore, they played with confidence and without any of their stars. Micky Cronin, who arrived late in the game, was the only player to conclude the game.

In making a choice here, one must remember players like John Curran, Denis Conway, John Michael and Richie Heiney. James O'Donnell, John O'Connell, Pat Fender, Corry O'Brien, Liam Linnon, Bertie Hahnan, who never plays a senior game, are as good as experienced as any side in the county. I reckon that there is an effective difference in standards, unless Killybeggs have shown fairly considerable improvement in the six weeks since their last game. Therefore I give the vote to Ardmore to reach the county final. To me, for now, it looks like being a Ardmore/Tramore county final. Sunday's results might prove the opposite. We'll just have to wait and see.

AT LISMORE The champions, Cappoquin are considered almost certain to beat Ballyduff/Glanrocks in their under 21 hurling tie, but the clash between Briceys and Tallow could be a close affair, with Briceys attempting to reverse the result of their last meeting in the grade.

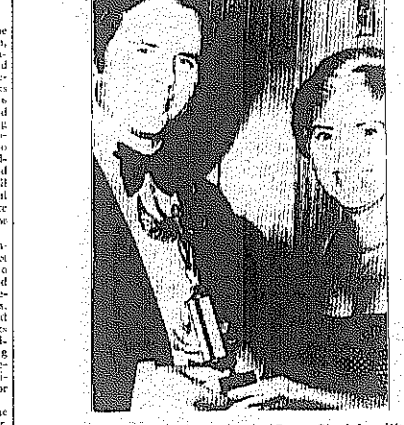
