### ANIMALS DON'T DO IT, SO WHY SHOULD WE? The Keep-fit Syndrome

With the marathon so much in the news it seems like a good time to reflect on what some physiologists and physiologists have been saying in the journals recently.  
Some society hosted exchanges have been taking place in the South African Medical Journal. One of the subjects was "The Keep-fit Syndrome".  
Dr. T. D. Noakes again, however, support the idea that a high carbohydrate diet is essential for athletes involved in prolonged dynamic exercise of moderate to high intensity (South African Medical Journal, 11 July 1981, page 48).  
Some workers explain physical exhaustion as depletion of carbohydrate (glycogen) stores in the liver and skeletal muscles. However, do marathons develop abnormal glucose tolerance tests if they increase their sugar intake?  
According to Noakes, there is no evidence of this, in fact there is evidence that their glucose tolerance is enhanced. They have low triglyceride levels and higher HDLs, the chemicals the opposite pattern to patients with coronary heart disease.  
"We might hear more about this one, not least from the dentists among us, long after the marathons has died down."

### Jail Sentence Adjudged If Defendant Pays £100 Compensation

At Dungarvan Circuit Court before Judge D. P. Sheridan, Patrick Maguire, labourer, of 2 Castleview, Conna, Co. Cork, appeared against the charge of assaulting a Garda when he tried to arrest him for driving a car which had crashed into a parked vehicle.  
After expressing the view that the Garda was not to be blamed for the accident, Judge Sheridan said he had no doubt that the defendant was one of the worst he had ever come across.  
Garda E. Moran also stated that the defendant was "very drunk" and he disagreed with the doctor's evidence. "There was no question in his mind as to whether the defendant's condition and his fitness to drive," said witness.

### ESTACY OF PAIN

Apparently even Professor Cline must be reported as having described jogging as a form of sadomasochism which causes joggers into a sort of ecstasy.  
Dr. T. D. Noakes of the Sports Science Centre, University of Cape Town Medical School was the speaker at a meeting of the South African Medical Journal, 18 July, 84-5.  
"There is no scientific evidence that jogging or even marathon running is a factor in the development of heart disease in people of normal health. In fact, one study the evidence suggested that exercise reduced the severity of heart disease in people with heart disease, not exercise," says Noakes.

### Stress Testing: Good point

Stress testing is a good point because it is a simple and quick way of checking the heart's response to physical exertion. It is a good idea to have a stress test if you are over 40, have a family history of heart disease, or if you are a competitive athlete. The test involves recording the heart rate and blood pressure while you are exercising. It can help to identify any underlying heart problems before they become serious.

### CROSS-COUNTRY Form In Brussels

Waterford's John Treacy mastered the opposition, mud and rain to score a decisive victory in the national cross-country race on the outskirts of Brussels last Sunday. Treacy, 27, of the Villesaver club, was the most nine seconds ahead of Eric de Beek of Belgium with 40 minutes and 40 seconds. Alex Hagelstein, a further 40 yards back in third place.  
This was Treacy's first cross-country victory in two years, going back to the National Inter-Counties Championship in December, 1979. A back injury forced him to miss entirely last season's cross-country season but there was every indication when he finished second in the Gateshead International two weeks ago that he was coming back strongly to the form which saw him annex the World title in '78 and '79.  
Treacy won those titles in the mud of Glasgow and Limerick and yesterday he experienced similar conditions. After a steady start he worked his way up to the leaders and then took over at the front at the 4,000m point before going on to win in 39 mins. 40 secs., 6.5 secs. ahead of de Beek, the world title winner in '74.  
Scotland's Neil Muir and de Beek made much of the early running but at the end of the first of the six laps, Muir was specked and dropped back. Hagelstein then joined in the packmaking along with Welshman Steve Jones, third in Gateshead.  
But Muir had to give way when Treacy moved up to attack on halfway and soon he began to open daylight on his pursuers. Another Belgian international, de Vocht, was fourth with Jones back in seventh place and Muir a disappointed 17th.

### THERMAL FACTOR

It looks like it is a lot more than a "chemical process" to which the ATP school has its advocates, the picture of fatigue which emerges is diverse. As the "Lancet" writes, "There are two sets of phenomena which demand attention: the first is the diminution of muscular force and the second is the 'personal perception of muscular fatigue'.  
The ATP school reminds us of the isolation of earlier physiologists and their self-inflicted injury in the cause of science, one saying "his radical and external cutaneous nerves cut just below the elbow so that he could observe the effects!"  
Rugby Heroes: Less heroic perhaps, and certainly less invasive was a study to investigate the effect of water deficit on body temperature during rugby.  
Dr. I. Cohen and colleagues at Johns Hopkins (South African Medical Journal, 1981, 4 July, 60-61-4) undertook the study with the players of the University of the West Indies, West Indies XV. Sweat losses, water deficits and changes in rectal temperature were measured during a first-league rugby match. "Player 15 refused consent for most of the investigations," says the report. "Hyperthermia impairs mental function (which) is not for our marathon (fitness) the ability to carry out simple mental tasks is impaired at a rectal temperature of 38.5°C, a measurement succeeded in all but one player."  
Morale and team spirit deteriorate as a result of hyperthermia and dehydration at 40°C, and at even lower temperatures aggression and hysteria may be marked. These could precipitate aggressive responses and to injury claim the authors.  
The authors also claim that these highly fit players appear to be more sensitive to thermal ex-

### Motorist Convicted On Drunk Driving Charge Despite Doctor's Evidence

A motorist whom a Garda witness described as "one of the worst drunk driving cases I have ever come across," was deemed to be fit to drive by a doctor following medical examination less than half an hour later, it emerged in evidence before District Justice W. F. O'Connell at Lismore Court.  
At the end of the hearing the Justice ruled that the "emphatic" evidence of three Garda witnesses outweighed that of the doctor and he convicted the motorist on charges of drunk driving and dangerous driving.  
Before the court was Michael Lennane, a 25-year-old salesman of Drogheda, Cappoquin and he pleaded not guilty to dangerous driving and drunk driving at Park Road, Lismore, on the early hours of April 29 last.  
Dr. James A. Gallagher told the court that he was called to Lismore Garda station at 1.15 a.m. on that date but for medical reasons Lennane was unable to give a blood or urine sample. There was a smell of alcohol from the defendant, but the pupils of his eyes were normal as were his reflexes and he passed the opinion after a chemical examination that Lennane was fit to drive.  
Garda E. Hogan, however, said when he arrived at the scene of an accident at Park Road at 12.50 he spoke with Lennane who admitted to drinking the car which had crashed into a parked vehicle.  
After expressing the view that the Garda was not to be blamed for the accident, Judge Sheridan said he had no doubt that the defendant was one of the worst he had ever come across.

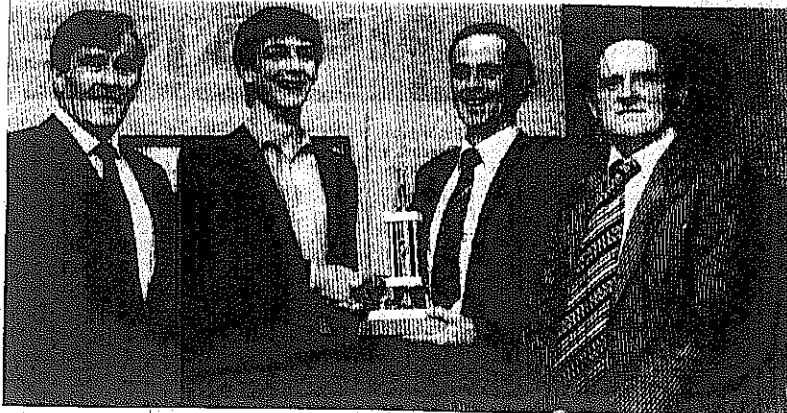

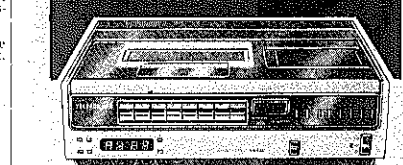

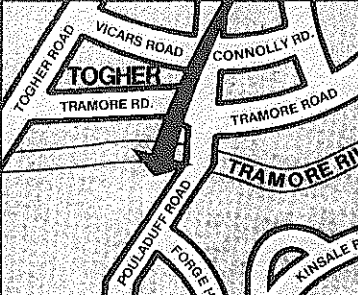
