Suspended Sentence For Assault With Broken Glass

A dancehall bouncer had his hand gashed with a broken glass during a disturbance in a Dungarvan hotel. District Justice P. O'Connell was told at the local court...

Mr. E. P. King, said the case wasn't as bad as it might appear to be. The glass fell from Mahony's hand and Ryan approached. The defendant had no intention whatever of assaulting Ryan with the glass but in the skirmish he was cut by it.

District Justice O'Connell said anyone who used broken glass for assault purposes merited a prison sentence and it was also the kind of assault that was becoming more prevalent.

However because Mahony had no previous convictions and having heard what Mr. King had stated, he would impose a three month prison sentence, suspended for twelve months. The defendant was also fined £30.

Road Deaths Dramatically Cut

"The National Road Safety Association congratulates the Irish public on its magnificent response to the Association's intensive Road Safety Campaign aimed at cutting the road death and injury figures during the Christmas period," said Mr. Peter Owens, Chairman, National Road Safety Association, in Dublin when the road death and injury figures were released.

The figures of 45 dead and 669 injured in December were the lowest recorded during the month of Christmas in over 15 years. "This is the kind of response which can be gained by intensive publicity and information campaigns backed up by the support of the media, local and national voluntary bodies," said Mr. Owens.

Mr. Owens continued: "There is no acceptable level of death and injury however, and even these relatively low figures are an ample demonstration of the size of the road safety problem."

It was particularly heartened by the fact that the enormous improvement shown in the figures for December reversed the November picture when road deaths showed the highest monthly total on record.
