Mr. John Cooke, the Returning Officer, called for the recount as the election was being contested because, in the event of a total transfer of Mr. Fahey's surplus of 981 (the quota for election was 8,320) to Dr. Ormonde, there would only be a difference of 22 votes between Gallagher and Ormonde—an extremely narrow margin in the final number of ballot papers counted.

Mr. John Cooke, the Returning Officer, called for the recount as the election was being contested because, in the event of a total transfer of Mr. Fahey's surplus of 981 (the quota for election was 8,320) to Dr. Ormonde, there would only be a difference of 22 votes between Gallagher and Ormonde—an extremely narrow margin in the final number of ballot papers counted.

We are treated as the Cinderella county in a lot of respects where RTE is concerned and I feel we must again protest now in the strongest possible manner against the television coverage given to the Waterford constituency in last week's election by RTE. Mr. Billy Kennelly, who was elected Clr. P. Kennelly's Chairperson at a special meeting of the Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday.

Clr. Kennelly made his remarks in the course of a proposal made by him congratulating two members of the Council, Mr. Austin Deasy and Mr. Eddie Collins, on their re-election to Dalkey.

"We had a cliff-hanger of a result in this constituency," said Clr. Kennelly, "and all we got on RTE television was the first count and the final count and I propose that we protest in the strongest possible terms over the treatment to the Director General of RTE."

Clr. O. Coffey said that he couldn't agree more with what had been said by the Chairman, as he had also what was going on because of the very poor coverage given to the county in Waterford and other constituencies on the screen and Waterford just was not there. While things were happening in Waterford RTE had a man from Ametec on the screen several times. Expressing regret that another member of the Council, Mr. Billy Kennelly, had failed to win re-election to the Dalkey constituency, Clr. O'Riordan said that Clr. Kennelly was a man who served the Council and the County well down through the years.

Seconding the protest proposal Clr. D. Goode said that as far as RTE television was concerned Waterford should be entitled to as fair coverage as anywhere else in the country. He also joined in congratulating Deputies Deasy and Collins on their re-election to the Dalkey.

Clr. Billy Kennelly added his voice to the protest and said he wished to avail of the opportunity to thank the people of the County who had supported him over the last 17 years.

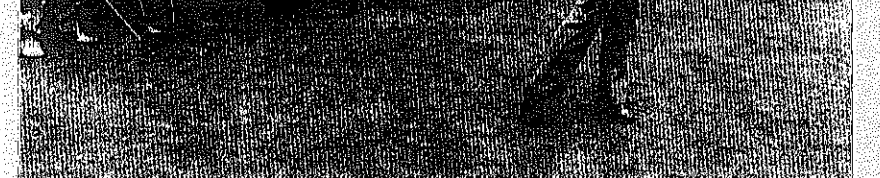
