## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### NEW FACTORY WAS MAJOR COUP FOR I.D.A.

The fact that they had been successful in getting the principles of the American Style Drug Company to locate their new Runson Chemicals plant in Dungarvan was a major coup for them, Mr. Frank Burke, Regional Manager, Industrial Development Authority, told a Press Conference in Dungarvan last Friday. He pointed out that there had been competition from other areas but Dungarvan had finally won out. Work on the 40-acre site at the Youghal Road outside Dungarvan would commence before the end of 1982.

Accompanying Mr. Burke at the Press Conference were Mr. Pat Lohrey, Assistant Regional Manager I.D.A. and Mr. Tom Butler the I.D.A.'s Regional Industrial Officer.

Mr. Burke stated that the Runson development would represent an investment by the Sterling Drug Corporation in the region of £150 million or roughly £70 million. The company had appointed E. G. Pettit & Co., Consulting Engineers, Cork to design the new plant and he said that it was hoped "that the ground on the site will be broken this year."

I.D.A. executives stated that it was expected that the plant would be completed and operational by 1984 and when full production point was reached a total workforce of 300 would be employed.

The I.D.A. executive stated that the industrial development on their site at Lisfert, Dungarvan where projects Mulmeh and Electrical Engineering Services, two local companies, would commence shortly and which between them would provide an additional 40 jobs.

The full text of the Press Release made available at the Conference is published elsewhere in this issue of the "Leader" and in regard to the situation in Cappoquin where a 10,000 square feet advance factory is being completed it was stated that there was a company interested in locating there and if negotiations could be completed successfully this could provide up to 50 jobs there.

Frank Burke said that as far as West Waterford was concerned they were very optimistic for the future. "We have concentrated heavily in the area in the past and the results of our efforts are now becoming apparent," he said.

### Council's Suggestion For Grotto Site An Innuity

A three person deputation led by Mrs. K. O'Regan, Connolly Row and including local residents Mrs. E. Borsoff and Mrs. Hunsberry attended the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night to object to the Council's decision made at the previous meeting, approving of the Town Engineer's recommendation that a Grotto which the ladies proposed to have erected on a site at the corner of Western Esplanade, instead be located at "Two-wee's Well."

"I am not satisfied that the Grotto should be placed at 'Two-wee's Well', Mrs. O'Regan told the Council, "and I think it is an insult to the Blessed Virgin that it should be hidden away there."

Mrs. O'Regan went on to say that the site she first sought at the corner of Youghal Road and Western Esplanade was ideal as it could be seen by everyone passing there. "Most of the local residents who saw the site and agreed with having the Grotto there had been one of the reasons why they had attended the meeting and she thought that the Council should reconsider their decision and give the site which she first looked for."

Mrs. Hunsberry said that she was also aware of objections but understood that those were put against the idea of a grotto but that the site was too near the houses and would interfere with people's privacy.

Mrs. O'Regan thought that the members of the Council might not be aware of the fact that the public sewer was running under this site while there was an underground electric cable there as well. This meant that the area would have to be accessible at all times in case of any blockage or repair work and consequently nothing could be built on it.

The members of the Council then agreed that these facts would rule out the site at the corner of Western Esplanade but it was suggested, rather than have the grotto at a site which was hidden away, to enquire from the County Council as to the availability of a site at the entrance to the new "Ring Road" which they owned at Youghal Road.

The Town Clerk, Mr. B. White was requested to direct enquiries to the County Council on this proposal.

There was a time — and it isn't quite so long ago — when very few clubs owned their own playing grounds. The local club used a field "kindly lent" by a local farmer whose love of the games and involvement with the G.A.A. persuaded him to allow hurriers and footballers to share with cattle and sheep. He accepted a sum of money far below the grazing value of the land in question with indisputable rights to decide when and how the field should be used.  
Many a fine club prospered under the constraints of such a system but nobody denies that the set-up was far short of ideal. The solution was to purchase your own pitch which is what Tallow, in common with many other units of the Association, did.

The next step was to rail the pitch and after that gave thought to the construction of dressing rooms. This latter, once regarded as a luxury, is now essential. Clubs are no longer prepared to tolerate primitive conditions and so water, light, etc. must be provided. Tallow dressing rooms now have running water, toilet facilities and there are showers also. Lately a spotlight has made training during the hours of darkness more tolerable. There are plans to re-rail the playing pitch after it has been extended and widened and concrete posts are at hand for this job. So the club isn't solely concerned with winning titles.

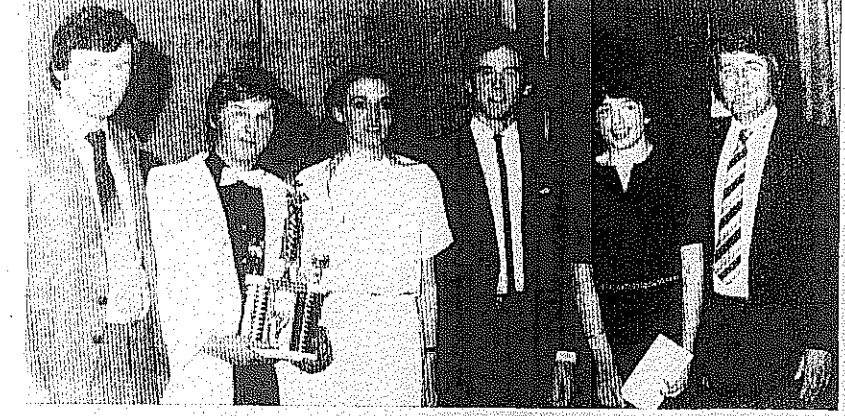
**SYMPATHY**
