## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

**HOW THE MONEY WILL BE SPENT**

A couple of weeks back Waterford County Council approved the budget for 1982 which was presented by County Manager Dan Hurley and which provides for a gross expenditure of £13,168,000.

It may be of interest to readers to know the main heads under which the money is to be spent. The estimates are prepared under 8 main programme groups covering all the services with which the Council is concerned. These are summarised in the special report of the County Manager which accompanied the 'Book of Estimates' as follows: Programme Group 1—Housing and Building, £2,129,500; Group 2—Road Transportation and Safety, £4,285,000; Group 3—Water Supply and Sewerage, £1,142,000; Group 4—Development, Incentives and Controls, £185,000; Group 5—Environmental Protection, £763,900; Group 6—Recreation and Amenity, £303,400; Group 7—Agriculture, Education, Health and Welfare, £551,000; Group 8—Miscellaneous, £265,500. Added together these total the £10 million odd which will be required to meet the Council's commitments for the year.

Programme Group 1 is more or less self-explanatory as it deals with the money necessary to meet the Council's duties in regard to house repairs, maintenance and improvement, the provision of loans and the building of more houses.

Programme Group 2 deals with public lighting, road repairs, maintenance and improvement and in this regard the County Manager comments that the deterioration of our roads is the disappointing level of Government grant for the year the position will get worse. "We have," Mr. Hurley states, "been operating for the last 20 years or more on the basis of a 7 and 9 year cycle for the surface dressing of our main county roads respectively. While we have been able to adhere reasonably to the provision on the main roads, both national and regional, the same regrettably cannot be done on the county roads. If we were to do the mileage of county road surface dressing that we should be doing we would be doing approximately 135/140 miles of county road surface dressing each year. Instead of that the mileage we have been able to do has been dropping steadily and this year will be no more than 85 miles or little more than 60% of what we ought to be doing. The result is inevitable and becoming increasingly obvious on our roads."

Programme Group 3 includes the cost of maintaining the Council's water supply schemes, sewerage schemes, treatment works and public conveniences. This programme also covers the cost of loan charges on the Council's capital schemes for the provision of new water supply and sewerage schemes.

Programme Group 4 deals with the administration of the Planning Acts, including planning control and the work of the County Development Team and the County Development Officer. Under this heading a sum of £6,700 is provided to meet the Council's contribution to the South Eastern Regional Development Organisation (SERDO) and also a sum of £4,500 to be contributed to the South Eastern Tourism Organisation (SERTO). The Manager also states in this programme that, as previously indicated, the need for a quality brochure to project the county with a view to attracting industry has been actively followed up. The proposal was at an advanced stage and he expected that the brochure would be

**NOTICE TO GROWERS OF SEED POTATOES**

Growers who wish to have seed potato crops inspected for certification are reminded that application for inspection must be made on the appropriate form and that the completed form should reach the local Potato Inspector not later than 15th May.

Prospective growers should note that crops will not be inspected unless they are grown from V.P.S. Seed or Foundation Seed or from the produce of such seed obtained from an approved source. A seed crop will not be certified unless all the grower's land on which potatoes are grown is shown to be free from Potato Root Eelworm as a result of laboratory examination of the soil.

Forms of application and information about the conditions of certification may be obtained from the local Potato Inspector or from the DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (Agricultural Production Division 11), AGRICULTURE HOUSE, DUBLIN 2.

It should be noted that under the European Communities (Seed Potatoes) Regulations 1963 it is an offence to sell seed other than certified seed.

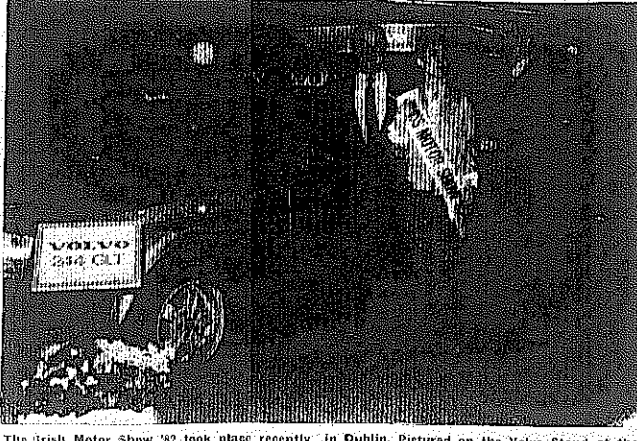
