15 Penalty For Selling Five Cigarettes

Master Barber, shopkeeper, O'Connell St., Dungarvan was charged at Dungarvan Court last week with selling five cigarettes to a customer. Mr. A. V. Maher, State Solicitor, who prosecuted for the Minister of Trade and Commerce, told the Court that on February 17, an Inspector of the Department entered the defendant's shop where he sold five and purchased five cigarettes. Williams & Co., on behalf of the defendant, admitted the offence.
