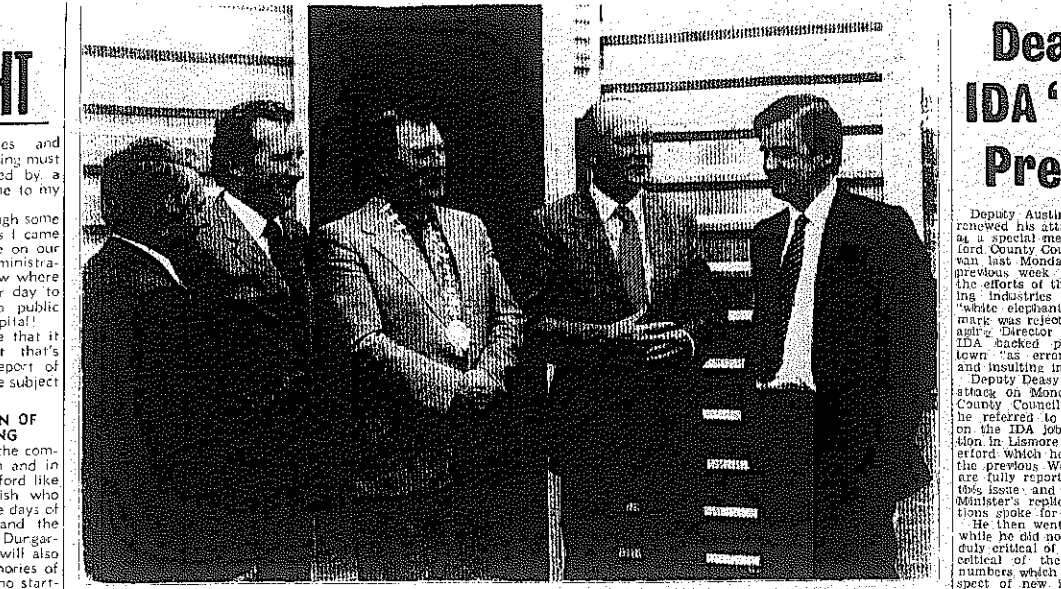

IDA Highlight Small Industries Week In Co. Waterford

At a Press briefing held in Dungarvan last Monday, Mr. Pat Loftus, Assistant Regional Manager, Industrial Development Authority, Waterford said that a chance to realise an ambition was being offered by the IDA to small industrialists in the county to set up their own small business. Commencing on Monday next, May 31, the IDA in conjunction with the County Development Team had arranged a Small Industries Week in Co. Waterford designed to single out people with ambition and the ability to become small industry entrepreneurs and to help them in achieving that goal. The programme will include four small industry clubs beginning with a two day session in Waterford City on May 31 and June 1 at the Tower Hotel, Dungarvan on June 2 at Lawless Hotel from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. in relation with the Waterford "Makes It" Industrial Exhibition being mounted by the County Development Team in Dungarvan on June 1, 2 and 3 and finally at the Keeneland Hotel, Lismore on June 2.

COUNTY'S POTENTIAL
Mr. Dan Hurley, County Manager and Chairman of the County Development Team said that he was a great believer in small industries and he was glad to hear the IDA say that the County had potential in this regard. Referring to the Urban Council's new industrial estate in Dungarvan he said that he hoped to have builders on site in about 4 weeks. There would be 13 sites available and if they could acquire even 10 jobs in each they would wind up by providing jobs for 130 people. Within the week every site would be approved by the IDA and the County Development Officer, Mr. Maurice McHugh, would work hard to get the message across and that the exercise would prove a successful and rewarding one.

BADLY NEEDED
Mr. P. Kennedy, Chairman Waterford County Council promised the undertaking his full support, job creation and jobs on the factory floor were never so badly needed as at present, he said, and he appealed to persons with ideas to come forward and start industrial projects which would provide much needed jobs. He also appealed to the general public to buy Waterford made goods and he congratulated Mr. O'Connor on the considerable industrial contribution he was making by providing so many jobs for people in West Waterford.

The attendance at the Press briefing which was followed by lunch, in addition to the speakers, included Mr. Tom Butler, Industrial Officer, IDA, Mr. Maurice McHugh, Co. Development Officer, Mr. B. J. McHugh, County Secretary, Mr. R. Mulcahy, Managing Director, Mulmech Ltd., Dungarvan, and Mr. M. O'Connor, Managing Director, M. O'Connor & Sons Ltd., Cappoquin.

Mr. Noel Kieran, Assistant Manager, Small Industries Division IDA outlined the Small Industries Programme introduced by the IDA in 1967 and which he said, in the past fifteen years had made a significant contribution in terms of job creation; encouraging enterprises, innovation and development. Mr. Kieran said that over 3,000 small firms had, he said, been assisted under the programme and they were providing more than 27,000 jobs in about 500 different locations throughout the country.

Referring to Waterford, Mr. Kieran said that since the Programme commenced in Waterford in 1969, 121 small industry projects had been approved by the IDA with a job potential of 1,670. "It is," said Mr. Kieran, "because of these successes that IDA is having a Small Industries Week in Waterford designed to encourage new and existing promoters from the county to think again about a desire or idea which they may have about setting up or expanding a small industry and to talk to us about their ideas and ambitions during that week."

Deasy hits out at IDA "Ballyhoo" and Press Receptions

Deputy Austin Deasy (F.G.) criticised his attack on the IDA as a special meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday. During the previous week he referred to the efforts of the IDA in starting industries in Lismore as "ballyhoo" but his remark was rebuffed by the Mayor's Director of one of the IDA backed projects in the town "as erroneous, offensive and insulting in the extreme."

Deputy Deasy returned to the attack on Monday last at the County Council meeting when he referred to Dail Questions on the IDA job creation situation in Lismore and West Waterford which he had put down the previous Wednesday (these are fully reported elsewhere in this issue) and said that the Minister's replies to his questions were "as erroneous, offensive and insulting in the extreme."

Deputy Deasy then said that he wanted to see how what he described as "ballyhoo" with less press conferences and lavish receptions being held by the IDA to get across the story that they were doing a great job. "The job should not really be so great and is, in fact, mediocre," he said.

Mr. Jimmy Quirk's remarking that the one thing needed to solve the problem in Lismore was a good factory that would employ a couple of hundred and not a few small bits and pieces. "The IDA should be providing jobs and not buying land at high prices which was then speculatively landscaped for small factories which at times had very little activity going with them."

The Lonely Grave of An Irish Hero in South Georgia

(Where the myriads of penguins enjoyed the novel experience of hearing "Waltz Me Around Again Willie" on his gramophone.) The plate on the headstone by that lonely grave in Grytviken, South Georgia bears the inscription: "Sir Ernest Shackleton - Explorer - died here January 5th, 1922. Erected by his comrades..."

Ernest Henry Shackleton was possibly the most attractive and certainly the most controversial of polar explorers. He was quiet, a lonely nature, often at odds with officialdom and always short of funds...

Ernest emerges as a typical prep-school boy. He is said to have had the reputation of a fighter, charming, with lots of "barney". He acquired the nickname of "Bully" because he lived down various comments on his Irish brogue.

Ernest had by this time developed a hacking cough and was suffering from a severe cold. When the ship "Morning" reached to within six miles of Scott's base at McMurdo Sound, Shackleton was ordered home something he accepted very reluctantly.

Now back in London he resigned his commission in the Royal Naval Reserve for the reason that he had taken a position on shore. In the autumn of 1903 he became sub-editor of the Royal Geographical Magazine.

At 1st good fortune was on the side and in the autumn of 1907 Shackleton left England to board the "Nimrod", a diminutive forty-year-old steamer.
